PROCEDURES FOR ST. JAMES LECTORS

PREPARATION:

Pray, prepare, and practice so you can proclaim the Word of God in a way that is meaningful for all who hear you. Your voice will be strong and clear if you get a good night's rest, avoid milk products, and drink plenty of water before your Mass. Help others understand you better by practicing enunciation and relaxation exercises.

You are the instrument God is using to bring His message to the congregation. Make sure all can hear and understand you.

ATTIRE:

Lectors are proclaiming the word of God, so dress appropriately. You might even try to coordinate the color you wear with the liturgical color of the season (check the Parish Calendar for this information).

WHEN TO ARRIVE?

Please arrive at least fifteen minutes before Mass. Check in so the sacristan knows you've arrived and can tell you of any special procedures for that Mass. If possible, sit as close to the ambo as you can.

WHO PUTS THE READING BOOK ON THE AMBO?

The sacristan usually has the reading book open on the ambo. But it's always good to check before Mass to make sure it's there and open to the correct page.

WHO CARRIES IN THE GOSPEL BOOK?

Usually whoever is proclaiming the first scripture. Lead the procession, holding the book above your head for all to see. After placing it in the stand on the altar, turn and line up next to the servers and wait for the presider to join the line. Bow when he does and go to your seat.

WHEN DO WE GO UP TO PROCLAIM OUR READING?

After the presider is seated, the first lector makes his/her way to the ambo. The second reader should wait until the cantor has finished the responsorial psalms and returned to his/her seat before making his/her way up to the ambo. Never rush! Remember to pause after saying "Word of the Lord." We **do not bow** before or after the proclamation

WHAT DO WE DO AFTER WE'VE FINISHED THE READING?

If you're proclaiming the first reading, move the ribbon and or turn the page so the second reading is prominent.

If you're proclaiming the second reading, close the book and place it on the second shelf to make room for the Gospel book. Then return to your pew and sit unless the congregation is already standing.

WHAT DO WE DO AFTER MASS?

After Mass both lectors should pick up the collection basket from in front of the altar and take it to the sacristy where there are bank money bags. Put the money in a bag and one lector accompany the presider or designated person to the safe. Return the basket to the back of the church with the individual collection baskets. Return the Gospel book to the table in the back of the church or if you are at the last Mass, put it in the vestment room.

WHAT IF YOU CANNOT LECTOR AT YOUR REGULAR DAY/TIME?

We ask lectors to try to find their own replacements. First try calling one of the lectors listed as substitutes. Then try switching with a lector who usually reads on another Sunday at your same time. If you can't find a replacement, call Dick or Mary Loy Brown at 781-1766.

HOW DO YOU DECIDE WHO READS WHICH READING?

The easiest way is to rotate each month. You can also determine whether a particular reading would be more effective read by one or the other, i.e., male voice vs female; adult vs youth; low-pitched vs high.
