#### Master Plan Unveiled at Recent Town Hall Meeting Design Team and Fr. Roach on Hand to Answer Questions

Marsha Hoffman, our lead architect, and Chris Castrop, our liturgical designer presented details of the of the master plan (shown at the right) on September 15. This Town Hall meeting was well attended by St. James parishioners. Fr. Roach also answered questions about the plan and the rationale for it.

### How many will the new church seat?

We originally talked about a sanctuary that would seat 1,000 to 1,200, but we settled on 1,200.

#### How many will the new Daily Mass/Adoration Chapel seat?

It will have a capacity for approximately 35 people.

# What will happen with the existing parish office space?

In Phase II, the rectory will be demolished. Parish Offices will be relocated to a portion of the existing sanctuary.

What will happen to our existing pipe organ?



The existing pipe organ can be moved to the new church. Plans are being considered to add ranks to the pipe organ when it is moved.

# Will the new church have a lower level?

Yes, however, Phase I will only build the shell of the lower level. It will be completed in Phase II and will include a new parish hall.
