From the Pastor's Pen

Happy 4th of July! I hope everyone had a safe and wonderful celebration. I have been on the road to a few places and have one more trip to go. I've been to Chicago and back, Western Kansas and back, and one more trip to St. Joseph College in Rensselaer, IN, for the community retreat. Wow! Where did the summer go? Anymore I'm not sure I should plan for summer trips or just let them happen.

The mission trip to Chicago with Debbie Bolin and the three high school seniors was amazing. We spent 4 days in Chicago building relationships with Precious Blood community members and the young men who come to the Precious Blood Ministry of Reconciliation Center. The Center began in 2002 to reach out to youth ages 14-24 who have been involved in gangs, who have been imprisoned, and for those who are looking for an alternative to violence in their lives. Sr. Donna, Sr. Carolyn, Fr. Dave, Fr. Denny, and "the boys" were great hosts for the week as we sat in circle with them and shared our stories as well as hearing their stories. Sitting in circle is a prayer ritual, sharing experience that builds on the core values of truth, respect, listening, and confidentiality. It creates a safe space for people to share his or her story and to be heard. The one who has the talking piece is the only who is allowed to speak. In addition to the circles, we worked on various projects. We painted inspirational words on rocks, we decorated a rocking bench/plant stand with the words "welcome", we tended to the community garden beds, we tended to the flower beds, and we attended a meeting with representatives from various social service agencies that serve the needs of those in the area. In addition to the "doing stuff" we had the opportunity to explore Chicago with "the boys" and go on a boat ride and watch the fireworks off Navy Pier, we toured Navy Pier and I watched as the others rode the Ferris wheel, we did a walking tour of the Magnificent Mile and had lunch, took in the view of Chicago from the 95th floor of the John Hancock Building, we took a picture under the Bean, and on the rocks near Lake Michigan.

Although we might not have done much service, the true gift was the interactions and the relationships we created and the stories we heard and shared. I even got to see some of Chicago I had not seen before.

As I continue to unpack and reflect upon all that we did, I will share more of this great experience. Right now I just want to cram as much fun into this summer as possible before it's over. How about you? What great adventures lie before you?

In the midst of all this summer fun, may we continue to pray for the gift of peace so that we can enjoy our independence and this great country. We pray for those who struggle daily with the threat of violence in their lives and uncertainty of what lies before them. In the goodness of His Peace, Fr. Timothy

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I don't know about you, but the Fourth of July has always been one of my favorite holidays.

Family gatherings, picnics, barbecue, homemade ice-cream, swimming, kids riding their bicycles decorated with red, white, and blue streamers, and of course, fireworks. Ok, so maybe it's hectic, hot, and noisy, but its also exciting, beautiful, and the one time of year to reflect on the beginnings of our great country. After traveling to many other countries on three continents, I can honestly declare there is no place like the USA.

As we are nearing the end of this holiday weekend, I wanted to take a few moments to reflect on the commonalities between our country and our church. I'm sure the following quotes are very familiar to you: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness; We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves, and our Posterity. . ." As you know, the first quote is from the Declaration of Independence, and the second the Preamble to the US Constitution. As I reread these words, I realized how closely they resemble our Church's teaching on social justice, which in turn reflect the words of Jesus. Take a few minutes to reread Matthew 25:31-46, or reflect on the refrain from a familiar hymn, *They will know we are Christians by our Love*. (Let me substitute the word used for love in the Christian scriptures, "*They will know we are Christians by our agape.*") I have commented on this Greek word before. It is God's love, unconditional, entirely focused on the other; it is pure gift. When we love as God loves we offer ourselves to one another without any expectation of reciprocity. Remember the great *mandatum* Jesus gave: "If I, therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash one another's feet. I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do;" "love one another even as I have loved you." It is our call to love God by serving others.

For me, the words of our Declaration of Independence, and Constitution which declare "unalienable Rights endowed by the Creator" can only be viewed through Jesus' teachings, which I must try to live if I continue to claim my faith and Christianity. I cannot, in fact I must not subjugate any other individual. I must never treat anyone disrespectfully. I must strive for the common good of all people, regardless of their race, sexuality, beliefs, education, social/economic standing, physical or mental condition. Embracing each individual as a son or daughter of God, I should always let God's light shine, and desire His love to flow through me. I am proud to be a citizen of this great country, and I believe it was founded on principles which are shrouded in the Good News of Jesus Christ. I am happy to be an American Christian of the Catholic Church.

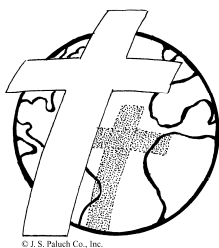

Nature & God's Creation!

Second grade's yearlong theme is Building Blocks! Two components of this theme is Building a Habitat and Building a Nest. One of the ways we do this is in the fall, we receive live caterpillars which are carefully watched as they progress into their chrysalis and then emerge as beautiful Painted Lady Butterflies. The students really enjoy being able to observe the life cycle of this insect. Second graders also get to dissect owl pellets and compare the bones they find to an owl chart of digested animals, then in computer class, all second graders create a PowerPoint using research they have found on one favorite bird, thus becoming an expert on a Missouri bird!

Second grade also has two study trips to Martha Lafite Thompson Nature Sanctuary. On one trip the students learn about animals and their environment. On the second trip, students make a birdfeeder and learn more specifics about our "Feathered Friends". This gets our students excited and watching for birds through our class windows which look out into our Bird & Butterfly Garden.

Second Grade is certainly a fun year to learn about nature and God's creation.
