But once I turned onto the church drive, Wow! I noticed it. Although there is still much to be completed, it is an encouraging sight to behold. I shared my excitement with Fr. Mike one evening but it was soon squelched when it dawned on me that we will lose access to the garage. All along we have been having conversations about where cars will park and how many will fit where. Many people have been making use of B&B Theater parking and walking over the hill. I overheard someone laugh that we are full service church now providing both prayer and exercise. And soon, I'll be joining the ranks of those parking in the B&B lot and hiking over the hill. Fr. Mike and I laughed when he reminded of all the stuff I'm sometimes hauling as well. Oh well! It will only be for a few more weeks I keep telling myself.

I also wish to thank each one of you for your prayers and cards of good wishes during my surgery and recovery. I am happy to say that I am doing great! The surgery was Wednesday and went as planned. By Friday the pain had subsided to where I no longer needed pain pills. My biggest challenge now is learning and adjusting my diet. The doc cautioned me on fried and fatty foods but otherwise he said, "Just try it, and see what happens." So I'm eating again and hope for the best. I will be having a follow up visit on Thursday, July 31. I then head out to Berkeley, CA, on Friday August 1 for a CPPS meeting focused on Young Adults. So, I'm still taking it a bit easy but also getting back into the swing of things.

May we continue to hold each other in prayer each and every day.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



You may think I looked at the wrong scripture before I began writing today. However, last Sunday’s gospel reading from Matthew has remained on my mind, and has given me much to think about. I always wonder what Jesus is actually telling us when he talks about selling all we have to do this or that. Additionally I am left with the perplexing question: “Can anyone buy their way into heaven?” That most certainly is a question with no validity, however Matthew 13:44–52 is most confusing to me. So I do what I always do when I’m searching for answers, I research the problem. Interestingly, I found a very interesting commentary on this particular Bible passage; one never came across before. It takes a very different view, and I would like to share it with you.

This author suggests that the pearl of great price is each one of us; yes God’s human children. We are each unique, just like every natural pearl. We are each precious and beloved by our heavenly father, and God’s abundant love is most evident through the incarnation. Yes, that’s right. God loved us so much He became human. Jesus is like us in every way, except he never fell into sin. Jesus wasn’t just God, coming from heaven each day and somehow “zipping on” human identity. He was just like us. He came into the world as a helpless baby, born of Mary. He was raised into adulthood by his parents, and was taught just like you and I. He cried, he needed food, he showed many emotions, even anger, and he learned to love and serve his Father, *abba*. God, the *logos*, became human. The price, however, did not end with His humanity. No, as we know, Jesus gave all that he had. He sacrificed his very life for our salvation. Yes, God loves us so much, he finds us each so precious, that He paid the ultimate price for us, His-self.

Jesus’ life is our example, our guide to loving, faithfulness to *abba*. When we unselfishly give to one another, we recognize the preciousness of each and every life. We embrace God through embracing one another. We too are willing to pay whatever the cost to protect human dignity. Are you willing to give all you are for a single human pearl? Just a thought.

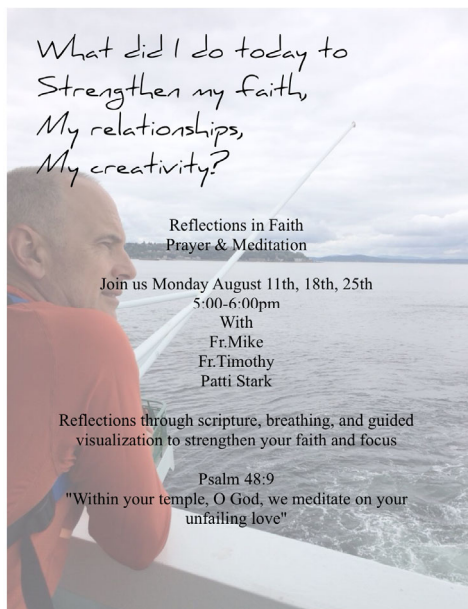

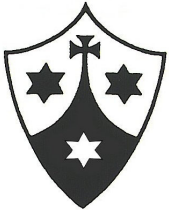

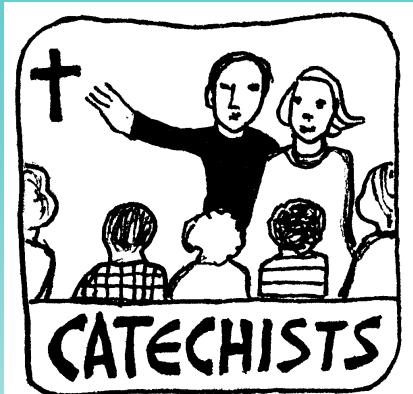


Meditation Matthew 14:13-21

Born of Jewish parents, Edith Stein, a brilliant philosopher who stopped believing in God when she was 14, was so captivated by reading the autobiography of Teresa of Avila that she began a spiritual journey that led to her Baptism in 1922. Later she became a Carmelite, taking the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. In 1942, she was transported by cattle train to the death camp of Auschwitz where she died in the gas chambers. She was canonized in 1998.


