From the Pastor's Pen

"To plant a garden is to believe in tomorrow," is inscribed on a stone plaque that lies in my garden. Gone are the plants of the summer turned under by the spade. The ground raked and leveled. Spring bulbs planted and yet the ground looks barren. If I were to say the same for vocations, the plaque might read, "To pray for vocations is to believe in tomorrow," but we all know it takes more than prayer.

This past weekend, our community, Missionaries of the Precious Blood, hosted a Discernment Weekend. Five guys accepted our invitation to join us for the weekend. We began the weekend with evening meal and prayer. The chill of the night was a perfect setting for a bonfire and smores and storytelling. With morning prayer we sang, "We come to share our story, we come to break the bread," and spent the rest of the weekend sharing our community story and inviting our five inquirers to share their stories.

Fr. Vince Wertner, Fr. Matt Link, Fr. Timothy Guthridge, joined me on the weekend. In addition, Fr. Joe Nassal, Fr. Keith Branson and Br. Daryl Charron also were present to share their time and stories with us. The inquirers who joined us were Matt Perez, Ryan Cornelissen, Christopher Hoffman, Michael Petterson, and Rob Hartnett.

It was a weekend of great energy and excitement, of storytelling and laughter. What began as a weekend of knowing little more than just a name, ended with the hope of seeds being planted and the question being asked, "What's next?" For these inquirers, if they feel called to continue the journey, the next step is the Discernment Journal. The inquirer meets with a member to share his story, hear our CPPS story and see where the two stories intertwine. If this seems a good fit, the inquirer is encouraged to make application to the community.

We continue to invite and welcome others who are discerning a call to priesthood and religious life. May we continue to pray for hearts open to the invitation of the spirit. What skills of leadership and compassion and ministry does it take to make a good priest or sister or brother or deacon? Who do you know that possess those skills? Have you ever shared that wisdom with the person you are thinking of? Why not?

This weekend I am in Chicago attending a Vocations Conference along with over 300 other Vocation Directors and those working in Vocations ministry. Please keep us in prayer as we all continue to discern God's call in our lives.

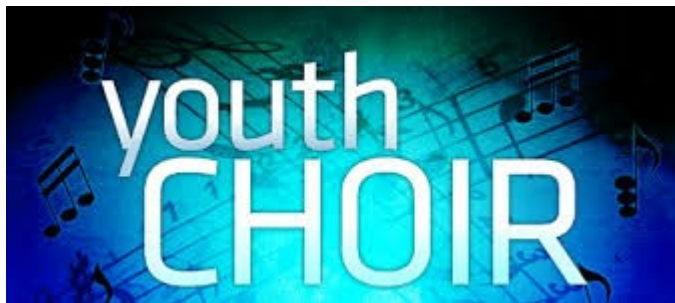

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Have you noticed how people come together for prayer during times of crisis or great need? I'm sure you have witnessed this more than once, and are aware how powerful these moments can be. It seems to me there is an innate sense or desire within every human being to help others, and there are times when the only help we can give is prayer.

During this month of November we are called to remember and to pray for all who have died, and might I suggest we earnestly pray for the entire *Communion of Saints*. As I was thinking about family and friends who have left this earthly life I discovered a beautiful letter from Paul and Timothy to the Phillipians: "I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you, praying always with you in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the Gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus. It is right that I should think this way about all of you, because I hold you in my heart, you who are all partners with me in grace, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the Gospel. For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception, to discern what is of value, so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God." (Phil: 1:1-11) Please allow me to take a few moments to reflect on these words.

Yes I give thanks to God as I remember my loved ones (both living and dead.) I am especially grateful for those who made the Gospel message a living reality. I find great comfort in the knowledge that whatever God has planned for each of us will be brought to fulfillment through Him and in His time. I also hold my brothers and sisters in Christ within my heart, and it is my prayer that His love might flow through me, bringing others to know and love Him. I also long for the time when I will be reunited with those who though no longer physically present, live on in my heart, and memories. At the same time I rejoice and give thanks for each person who continues to walk with me on this earthly journey, who prays with me and for me, and who gives me strength to continue even in those times when I feel like giving up. Finally I pray that each of us may grow in knowledge, discerning what is of value, accepting God's grace, and striving to live more Christ-like. Continue to pray with the sure knowledge that God hears you, and will lovingly care for you.

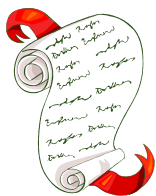

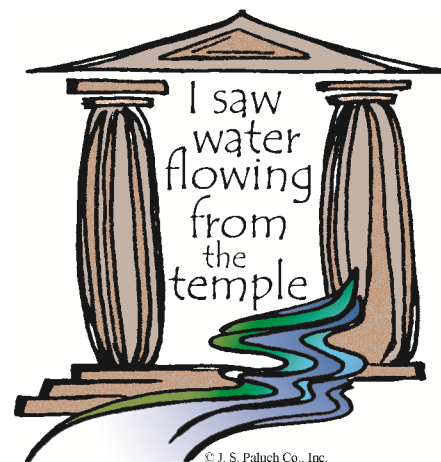

Corporal Works of Mercy: Bury the Dead

Our Works of Mercy project begins another chapter this month with Bury The Dead. This can be a difficult one to confront, as it often pushes us to grapple with our own feelings of grief and loss. We are encouraging all families to write their deceased loved ones' names in our Parish Book of the Dead, which will be prominently displayed all month long. We also invite you to bring in a photo of your loved ones to hang in our display. The display will be up all month and we invite & encourage you to participate.

The stories that we will be reading this month in our Opening Prayer time all feature characters coming to terms with the loss of a loved one--The Memory String, Always & Forever, and Grandad's Prayers of the Earth. As Catholics, we hold closely the importance of remembering those who have gone before us--November is a good month to talk about those we love whom have died.

Suggestions for ways to live out this Work of Mercy:

- Attend wakes and/or funerals of those you knew.
- Volunteer with a hospice program.
- Supply a dish for a funeral luncheon.
- Help a widow or widower in need with yard work or errands.
- Visit the cemetery and pray for the dead.
- Donate to ministries that help fund burials for those who are unable to afford one.

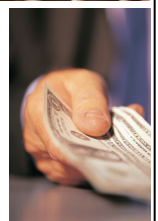
