Someone is Watching and Wondering



How is Jesus calling you;
have you heard his call; are you
hesitant to respond? I believe
Jesus calls each of us, every day,
in distinctly unique ways.
Perhaps, at this time you feel
called to become a Catholic.
Then the Rite of Christian
Initiation of Adults,

re-established by the Second Vatican Council, in the
Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*) is
the place for you. As a preview of this journey to reception of
the initiation sacraments I will explain the process by
summarizing the stages:

1a. Period of evangelization and pre-catechumenate: This is
a time, of no specific duration or structure, for inquiry and
introduction to Gospel values. It provides an opportunity for the
beginnings of faith formation.

1b. Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens. This is the
liturgical rite which marks the beginning of the catechumenate
proper, when the candidates express and the Church accepts
their intention to respond to God's call to follow Christ.

2a. Period of the catechumenate: This time is for nurturing
and growth of the catechumens' faith and conversion to God,
with a duration corresponding to the progress of the individual,
not to the school, liturgical, or calendar year. During this period
catechumens are gradually catechized through essentially an
ecclesial act. The church, (those baptized and catechized)
continuing the mission of Jesus as teachers, actively transmit
the faith, establishing in the hearts of the catechumens a
profound experience of life. The faithful provide an example of
openness to the Holy Spirit, and join the catechumens on their
journey by reflecting on the paschal mystery, and growing
spiritually. The focus of catechesis is Jesus, and its goal is to
lead people to communion and intimacy with Him. The six
fundamental tasks of catechesis are: **promoting knowledge of
the faith, liturgical education, moral formation, prayer,
education for community life, and missionary invitation.**

2b. Election or Enrollment of Names. This is the liturgical
rite, celebrated on the First Sunday of Lent, when the Church
formally ratifies the catechumens' readiness for the sacraments
of initiation, and the newly **Elect**, express their desire to receive
the sacraments.

3a. Period of Purification and Enlightenment: This time
immediately precedes the elects' initiation, usually
corresponding to Lent. It is a time of reflection, intensely
centered on conversion, marked by celebration of the scrutinies
and preparation for the rites on Holy Saturday.

3b. Celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation. During this
liturgical rite, usually integrated into the Easter Vigil, the elect
receive the initiation sacraments, Baptism, Confirmation, and
Eucharist.

4. Period of Postbaptismal Catechesis or Mystagogy:
During the Easter season, neophytes experience the fullness of
community through pertinent catechesis, and participation in
the Sunday Eucharistic celebration.



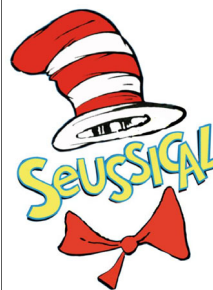

Fast Facts about Hunger:

- 40 percent of food is thrown out in the US every year, or about \$165 billion worth. All of this uneaten food could feed 25 million Americans.
- Over 50 million Americans struggle to put food on the table.
- Over 20 million children receive free or reduced-price lunch each school day. Less than half of them get breakfast and only 10 percent have access to summer feeding sites.



According to Feeding America, prevalence of a number of chronic illnesses is higher among people living in food-insecure households. When it is difficult to find adequate meals on a regular basis, the chances of negative health outcomes go up. Ross Fraser, Feeding America's media relations director, explained that "you have to have a healthy and nutritious diet in order to have a healthy active lifestyle — whenever that's compromised, you put that at risk." The problem can be even more severe for children. "The lack of adequate nutrition can literally change the architecture of a child's brain," Fraser pointed out.
