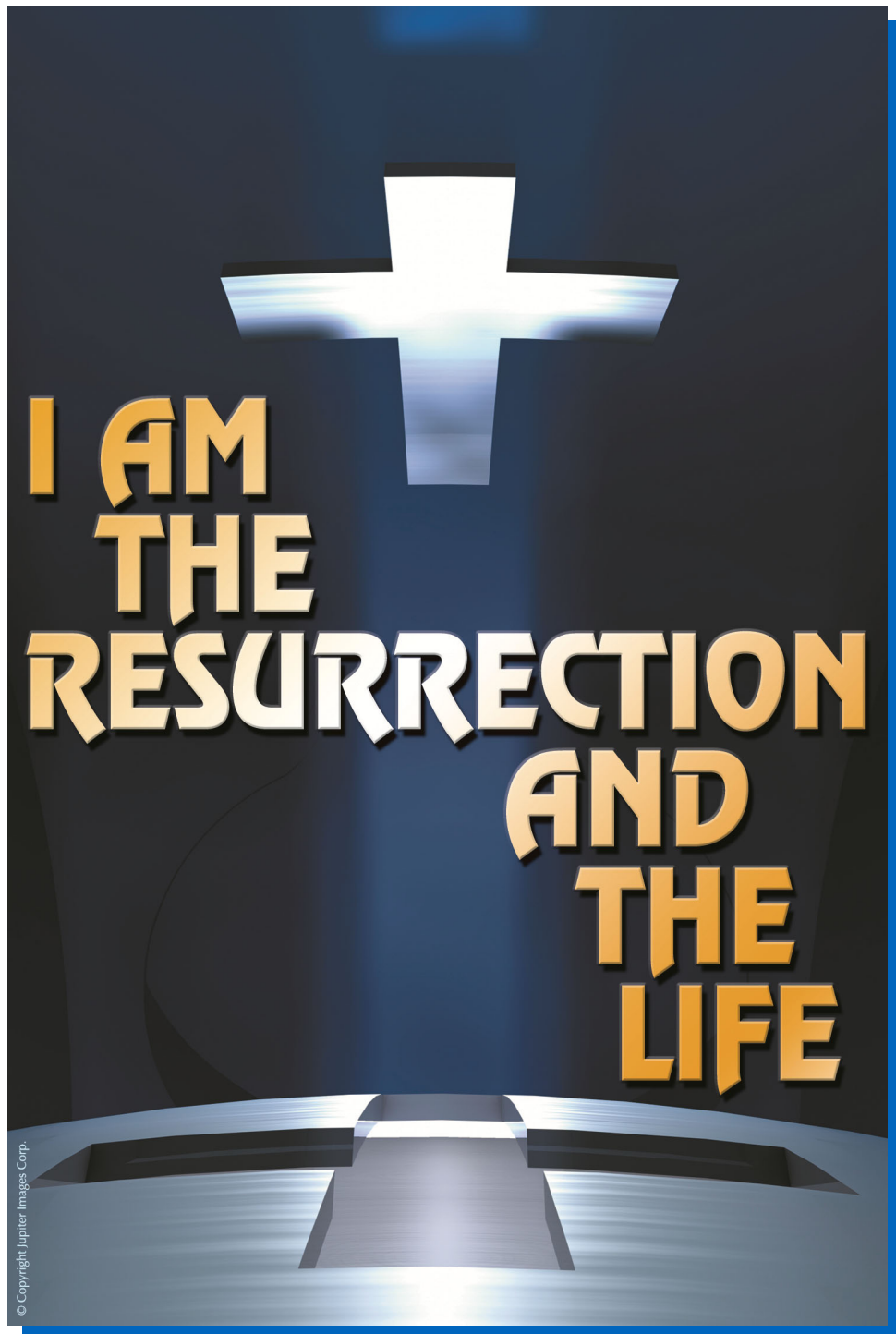

### Discerning a religious vocation

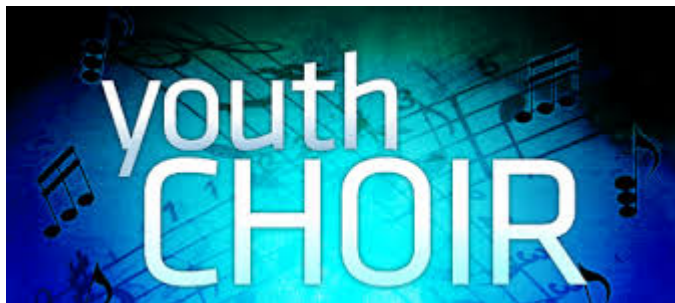
The Benedictine Sisters of Perpetual Adoration will host "Tune Into God's Call," a monastic event for women who are discerning a religious vocation.

### Someone is Watching and Wondering



Friday many people enjoyed *Halloween*, yesterday the Church celebrated *All Saints*, and today is *All Souls*. What if anything do these three days have in common? I hope you allow me some latitude as I suggest these three days, and the balance of the Liturgical year are a time to prepare ourselves for Advent. "Oh no!" you say; "Isn't she rushing things a bit?" Quite the contrary. I am suggesting purposefully preparing for this season of waiting.

As I mentioned last week, the origins of Halloween came from the Celts, and was a festival to drive away evil spirits. As a first preparatory step for Advent, I invite you to use this time for inward reflection; searching for dark areas within yourself, then humbly ask Christ to send His cleansing, healing love. Let Him drive out your darkness/evil spirit, and replace it with His light.

Second, look to the Communion of Saints. Seek out an individual who interests you and to whom you relate. Perhaps his/her life has similarities to your own. Perhaps he/she exemplifies a trait you desire. Perhaps their story fills you with hope, guidance, or motivation. Pray with your saint, seek their intercession, and gain strength from their example.

Third, remember those who have died, especially close friends or family. Reflect on the role they played in your life. How did they lead you towards a deeper relationship with Jesus? What void is left in your life since their passing; do you still experience their love and hope of being reunited in the glory of the risen Lord?

Like Halloween, *All Souls* originated as an ancient pagan festival celebrating the belief that the souls of the dead returned once a year to share a family meal. While the underlying focus of *Halloween* is driving out evil, and *All Saints* is the glories of those in Heaven, *All Souls* is a reminder of our obligation to live holy lives, and to pray for the heavenly reception of the souls of the dead. Most Catholics understand purgatory as an afterlife, existential state, or something experienced instantaneously outside the confines of time and space, that is a necessary for purging of sin and purification of souls before entering heaven. As we remember and pray for the dead, may we also let our experiences of them continue to lead us to surrendering our lives to Jesus, and His purifying grace. Intuitively we know death is not something to fear, but rather a time to give thanks for earthly life, and joy for the coming glory of being with Jesus. Yet we may still feel great sorrow in remembering our deceased loved ones. So as a part of your preparation for Advent let loving memories of these individuals continue to lead you to a closer relationship with Christ.

Again, let me suggest that you take your experiences of *Halloween*, *All Saints*, *All Souls*, and the remainder of the liturgical year to prepare your heart and mind for Advent, remembering it is also a time of waiting for our own reunion with Jesus, and the full experience of His glory.

### Corporal Work for November

Our Corporal Work for November is **Bury the Dead**. To follow this work, we are called to take action and support all who are facing death. We are called to help ease their suffering regardless of the circumstances surrounding their passing. But how? The Maryknoll Society suggests we take the following steps:

- Provide companionship, be a good listener, have compassion.
- Offer prayers for the terminally ill, and for the peace and comfort of surviving family.
- Urge those who have difficulty in coping to seek pastoral or professional counseling.
- Support organizations which care for the dying and those that offer grief counseling.
- Attend funeral or wake services; your presence can mean so much to survivors.

In addition, we should also work to address the underlying health and social justice issues which contribute to untimely deaths.

Be sure to visit the Narthex and our Altar of the Dead. You may also wish to place the name of a loved one who has passed in the Book of the Dead.

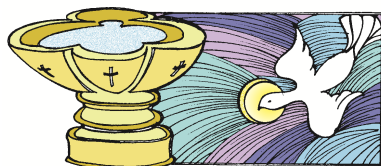
