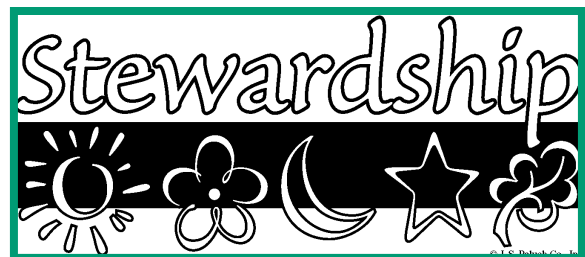
Did you know?

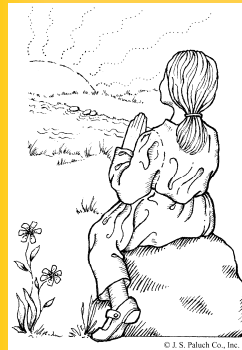

always

Advents theme is always waiting; waiting for what? Easy answer: "We are waiting for Christ." OK, what is the result of so much patience; how will the next few days, weeks, or years be any different? Of course we get older, life goes on, people change, etc. etc. etc., but once again I ask, what are we waiting for? Simply stated, I believe we all desire and are waiting for hope, joy, peace and love; intangibles that cannot be purchased, only felt; feelings which fill our hearts, minds and souls, completing our humanness.

With that simple thought, I re-present St. Paul's exhortation to the Philippians: "Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: Rejoice! Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts, and minds in Christ Jesus." (Phil 4:4-9) Sounds too simple - Rejoice in the Lord always, and you will find peace? Correct, but there is a deeper message here. All the waiting, all the rejoicing, all the prayer come after the first step. We must first give ourselves to Jesus, our whole self. We pray "Thy will be done," but too often the reality is "My will be done!" How can we wait for Jesus to enter our lives more richly and completely if we hold ourselves in that selfish embrace of desiring our own way. After all, I know what's good for me. I know what makes me happy. I know what I need to do, so God just step aside for a time until I really need you. Don't come knocking, I will call you. Yes we call to claim, beg and plead for God to fix everything. No, my brothers and sisters, that isn't what the wait is all about. We cannot truly rejoice and find peace until we desire His intimate presence in our lives, until we invite Him in, until we welcome Him with open arms and surrender ourselves to His unfathomable love and grace. It won't be easy because we first must let go of all the I wants and I knows. We must be willing to lose our whole self, and be born again with Jesus Christ as the center of our existence. So during this Advent, truly Rejoice and invite, welcome Him in.

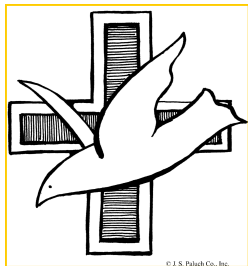

Dear friends and family of St. James Parish,

I hope you are having a joy-filled holiday season! Or as you would say in India, "namaste"! My name is Paul Nurse and I am a full-time lay Catholic missionary. I have spent the past year serving the poor and proclaiming the Gospel in India. I am originally from Kearney, Missouri and used to regularly attend Mass at St. James Church.

As a missionary, you could say that my "job description" is to proclaim the Gospel and serve the poor. One of our main ministries here in India is to run one of the first-ever RCIA programs in this country. We work with people of all different religions who want to know more about the saving love of Jesus Christ, including many Hindus and Muslims. It is such a blessing to journey with people as they encounter Christ for the first time and build a lifelong relationship with Him!

Our other primary ministry involves serving the poor in the slums. There is tons of poverty here in India, in fact, nearly 1/3 of the world's poorest people live here! We work in a slum helping kids with their homework, teaching them about the Bible, and running a soup kitchen. The poverty and corruption is challenging at times, but it is absolutely amazing to see the ways the Lord is working in the hearts of the poor here in India.

I know that some of you have been praying for me and supporting me over the past year. I want to take this opportunity to thank you, it truly would not be possible without your support. be facing and how your small gift could make their life a little easier.

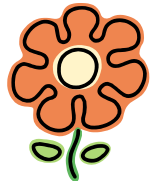

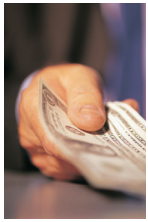
