From the Pastor's Pen

"The time of Advent that we begin again today returns us to the horizon of hope, a hope that does not disappoint because it is founded on the Word of God. A hope that does not disappoint, simply because the Lord never disappoints! He is faithful!" Pope Francis said on Dec. 1 to the crowds in St. Peter's Square.

We hear different people encouraging us to have "hope" these days. Sometimes it is very easy to hold on and other times it seems it has all slipped away. As I think of this season of Advent, it just doesn't seem like it has quite begun even though we are now celebrating the Second Sunday of Advent. It always seems like it takes me till about the 3rd week to really get into it and I could never quite figure out why. Until one year I celebrated mass on a college campus. I was working with the students to schedule Sunday Mass around Christmas break. The first Sunday of Advent coincided with the last week of classes and the Second Sunday began Finals Week. The semester ended that following Friday with the last Final. It finally dawned on me that was my schedule most of my school career. I would be on campus for the first two Sundays and then head home for break the last two. The first two weeks would be busy with classes ending and cramming for Finals. Then the last two weeks would be sleep and recover for too many late nights. It was only then did I finally get a chance to take a breather and fully enter into Advent. In some ways, that schedule has stuck with me.

Getting into the swing of things, making changes in one's life, holding out hope for when things seem totally lost is all part of what Advent is about. And yet, many of us are in what seems a good place in life. Depending upon where we are in life makes a big difference in how we see things. Things begin to pile up on us and the demands of work and life get more and more frustrating. When we think we are getting ahead something else knocks us down. We finally get a chance to catch our breath and get caught up with a few days of work. That is the hope we hold out for. We are challenged to believe in the hope that things will get better. Someone will call and question just what is going on in their life. They have lost all hope and see no better answers. I hear myself repeating the words, "Just hold on, things will get better," and the response, "Yeah right, when?" We hold these words deep in our hearts. We want to believe but what is keeping us from believing?

"A hope that does not disappoint because it is founded on the Word of God." These words we speak today with power and conviction if only we can truly take them to heart.

My prayers are with you in this season of Hope as we await the One who does not disappoint.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



**WHAT ARE WE WAITING FOR?
WHO IS THAT STRANGER IN NEED?
WHERE CAN WE FIND CHRIST?**

Great Advent questions for thoughtful reflection. Your answers may change frequently depending on the particular time and situation. This month as we visit another Corporal Work of Mercy, "Clothe the Naked," I want to offer a few personal thoughts.

What am I waiting for? More often than not I suffer from lack of direction. Before I retired I knew my schedule and daily responsibilities. Now I find an infinite number of choices, and most days begin with what should I do today, and does it really matter anyway? I check my calendar frequently to make sure I haven't forgotten something, but there is no set pattern, and few timelines. However, after my morning coffee, scripture and prayer I usually feel a sense direction for the day. I believe I am waiting for direction and God's gentle push, His soft whisper.

Who is that stranger in need? To me the simple truth is Jesus. That's right, I did say Jesus. When I feel His love I know that He needs my hands, legs, voice, mind and heart. Just before I began writing this article I had the awesome privilege of a young man sharing his story of finding God. All I did was listen, and share Christ's love. No wisdom, answers, direction or judgment was needed; just patience sent by the Holy Spirit, and perhaps a small amount of God's love was channeled through me. I believe that Jesus brought Shawn into my life for a reason; Jesus needed me to be present for Him at that particular moment.

Where can I find Christ? Again the answer is simple: everywhere, in anyone. As Roman Catholics we believe Christ is present in the sacraments, especially in the Eucharist. We also believe Jesus is present whenever we gather in His name, or read His words. Although I spent many years explaining the natural world, the awesomeness and mystery of it all defies human understanding, yet is where I find Him. Nature is filled with God's grace, love and mercy. It isn't always easy for me, however, to find Christ in other humans. Even close friends and family sometimes drive me to distraction, yet I know to love God I must love the other. Enjoy your own reflections.

Corporal Work of Mercy for December: Clothe the Naked

Our Works of Mercy project begins another chapter this month with Clothe the Naked. The month of December is a month filled with generous gift-giving, and we know that families' resources will be stretched thin. So our mission this month will piggyback along with some of the things that you usually do in December--but we'll be doing them this month with an added emphasis on the reason behind the gift.

We are asking everyone to support our Advent Giving Tree by selecting the tags that have to do with clothing first. The recipients of the Advent Giving tree are people who have no resources to obtain these articles of clothing. They are kids who need school clothes or older folks who are no longer able to get to the store and with no family around to take care of this for them.



We are also looking for items of baby clothing for our *Baby Shower for Baby Jesus*. These young families are in need of diapers and warm clothes for their babies. As you select these tags and pick up these articles of clothing, have a talk with your child about who your gift will be helping, what they might be facing and how your small gift could make their life a little easier.

HANNAH WORBOYS: 2nd Grade Student

Project: Still Life of Bottles

Hannah and her classmates are learning about the principle of design called balance. They folded paper in half and cut out 4-5 various size and colors of bottles/vases that were symmetrical. Hannah drew designs on her bottles to add detail to her work. Lastly, she chose a wallpaper design for the background of her artwork to arrange her symmetrical bottles in a "family" or still life design and glued her unique bottles down to the paper.

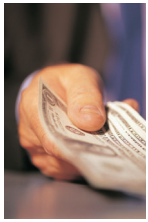
