

The contract with A.L. Huber "General Contractor" for construction of our parking lot was written for \$1,009,139. "All In" expenses were \$985,770 a positive variance of \$23, 369. Jay Dooley and Vince Garrett were the onsite superintendents for Phase I and Phase II respectively. SFS architects led by Marsha Hoffman and Kelly Stindt designed and certified the job.

St James also employed the services of an "in house" team of parishioners. Dave and Scott McDonald worked tirelessly as our St James engineers. Clint Elloitt (lighting) and Mike Kromeich (landscaping) furnished materials and services at a pricing level very beneficial to St. James. Wally McCubbin donated the irrigation system. Thanks to you all.

Fr. Mike's leadership and Fr. Timothy's boundless energy served as the glue that kept it together. Fr. Mike reminds us that this is a marvelous effort but is only the first step. We need the continued support of 2000 worshipping families as we move toward our New Church.



H.O.P.E. / SCRIP GIFT CARD NEWS 2015 HOPE Gift Card Challenge

Do you have a HOPE Gift Card in your wallet?

Many of your fellow parishioners who have accepted the HOPE Gift Card Challenge are making sure they have one or more HOPE gift cards in their wallets when they go grocery shopping or go out for a meal.



If you haven't accepted the challenge to use HOPE cards to purchase 25% of your weekly food needs, why not?

Is it because your weekly food budget is less than \$100 and the minimum face value of many of the cards is \$25?

If that's the case, maybe you don't realize that you can use your HOPE card as many times as necessary until you use the total face value of the card. For example, say you buy a \$25.00 gift card and spend \$50 a week for food — 25% of that amount is \$12.50. You would pay cash or write a check for \$37.50 and tell the cashier that you'll pay the balance with your gift card. Your card will still have a balance of \$12.50 for next week's shopping trip. The following week, you'd buy another \$25 card and repeat the process. See how easy that is?

Alternatively, you could use the entire \$25 every other week to accomplish the 25% goal.

So get started right now. Your purchase of HOPE cards helps support the many ministries and education programs at St. James. And, after all, **"Ya Gotta Eat!"**

Cards are on sale in the narthex after all weekend Masses and in the parish and school office during the week.

St. James Funeral Dinner Ministry Volunteers Needed

As a parish community we are called to serve one another.

As family members grieve at the loss of their loved ones, the St. James Funeral Dinner Ministry helps to provide comfort and support by providing a dinner for the family and friends of the deceased. This outreach ministry is a precious work of mercy to help one another emotionally to "bury the dead".

This ministry is in need of people to assist with the dinners. Volunteers are assigned to one of three funeral dinner teams. Depending on the number of people on the team, they are not necessarily called each time it is their team's turn.

How You Can Help

Providing Food - The parish provides the meat and drinks; therefore volunteers are called upon to provide side dishes, breads, and desserts. For those who don't have time or are unable to prepare food, volunteering to provide food can be as simple as buying bread, chips, cookies, and even packaged side dishes such as potato salad.

Serving - Generally each team has 2 groups of volunteers (1) those who assist getting ready for the dinner by making drinks, setting up the buffet table, etc. and (2) those who serve the food, making sure that side dishes, desserts and drinks are refilled and cleaning up after the dinner.

It was like being in a small town church where everyone knew everyone else.


Before the mass started and again at the kiss of peace people went out of their way to find their friends and give good wishes.


