

#### From the Pastor's Pen

Wow! What a difference four days can make! In the past week, I have now made two trips across the state of Iowa. On Thursday, March 5, I drove across Iowa on I-80 to St. Charles, IL, to St. Patrick's Church for Here I Am, Lord, Vocation Fair and returned home on Saturday. On Monday, I drove back across Iowa to Dubuque for a Vocation Day with Sixth Graders. When I first planned these events many months ago, I didn't realize how close the two events were. Anyway, as I write this *Pen* it is t-shirt weather here in Iowa whereas just four days ago, it was sweatshirt and heavy coat. The drive today was wonderful. The sun was bright and shining. The wind was a gentle breeze unlike the blistering wind whipping me off the road earlier. When I stopped to get out of the car for a break I could actually enjoy walking around and not having to make a mad dash inside or back to the car. I rather enjoyed the drive today. What a difference the cold weather can make in a person life.

Traveling to these two vocation events has given me a chance to get out and see the countryside once again. Although everything is still brown and barren, I know spring is just around the corner and new life will soon start to appear. With the warmer weather, I'm sure the buds on just on the edge of popping. I can't wait to see things start to green up and bring some new life into the brown sticks and barren stalks. It seems that the warmer weather and signs of new life can't quite come fast enough some days. To clear out the trash and clutter of the old dry vines and make way for new growth and sprouts. My one flowerbed sits barren because I was unable to get it planted last fall. What was planted there I didn't like and so I ripped it all out. It will be interesting to see if anything sprouts in that barren ground or not. I missed my chance to plant seeds last fall so we will see what the spring thaw brings.

Vocation work right now seems to be just that as well: planting seeds and cultivating the soil; talking and encouraging and inviting others to consider where God is leading them in their lives. As we journey this season of Lent, we are called to open ourselves to God's call in our lives. Where is that call leading us? Is it leading us to service in the church? Is it calling us to minister to others? Is it calling us to a vocation of marriage? Or religious life? I invite you think "What if God is calling me to service in the church as a priest, brother or sister? As a deacon?" If God is calling me, am I willing to speak to someone about this and discern more? Am I willing to pray about it and find out where it might lead?

What a difference asking one question could make in a person's life. Where do you think God is leading you today?

#### Someone is Watching and Wondering



The final pillar of lent is Give Alms. I'm sure many of you have taken a Rice Bowl from the table in the Narthex, perhaps it has a place of prominence on the table, and as part of your prayer of thanksgiving before meals you drop some coins into the box. Or do you carry it in your car, filling it with coins you receive for change. Worthy giving, yes, but I question, is that all there is to giving? I am re-

minded of Matthew 25::40: "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." So I ask, "How are we treating Jesus? Do we give Him our leftovers, or do we freely give of all that we have been given?"

I guess when I think of giving to the poor, I too immediately think of food, and the ever increasing problem of hunger in our world. So of course, filling the Rice Bowl, donating to food pantries, and helping at soup kitchens is necessary. However, I believe that to truly be a Lenten Giver we must first identify the many other faces of poverty—weakness, dependence, humiliation, loneliness, brokenness. To quote Richard Rohr, "poverty is a lack of means to accomplish what one desires, be it lack of money, relationships, influence, power, intellectual ability, physical strength, freedom, or dignity." It seems to me that true giving forces each of us to look at our culture and its institutions. We cannot continue to legitimize the status quo, understanding history and religion from the side of the powerful, but rather true giving demands that we follow Jesus' example of looking from the side of pain and suffering. Throughout scripture there is a pattern of God seeking rejected people: the barren woman, the sinner, the leper, the blind. This pattern of suffering and redemption finds its final revelation on the cross where Jesus' powerlessness redeems the world.

For our Lenten Giving I ask myself, in what ways can I become involved to bring about change for the welfare of all people? What gifts do I have which might ease the suffering of others, to eliminate physical, emotional, and spiritual poverty? I am continually amazed at the number of individuals I meet who simply need someone to be present to them; to listen; to offer empathy; to pray with; to offer encouragement and hope. So, as I look at my Lenten Giving I pray: Lord, help me become your instrument, you servant in the world, facing and engaging all forms of poverty and need!
