From the Pastor's Pen

As we begin the month of May, we enter into the last month of the school year, as well as a busy month for celebrations – graduations, weddings and other events!!

We continue to celebrate the Easter season, as we reflect on the Gospel this week of Jesus reminding us “I am the Vine, you are the branches” – may we remember our relationship with Jesus, the Risen Lord in all that we do!

We pray for our diocese, as we await the naming of a new Bishop for the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph. We pray that Pope Francis might appoint a pastoral man, who would lead us as a diocese in the ways of healing and renewal. It's been a very difficult last several years and we pray that we can come together and continue to spread the message of the Gospel, and that those who feel estranged, or disillusioned with our diocese or with the Church, might see the hope and the presence of the Risen Lord in all that we do.

We are in the process of laying the groundwork, forming committees for our upcoming Capital Campaign which will happen in the Fall. It is our goal that we are able to raise enough monies to begin building our new church! Please keep our efforts in your prayers. It's an exciting time for our parish community, and we pray that all of us might come together and support our future!

At Christmas time, I put out a plea to our parishioners for your generosity to help those who come our way in need. And you were very generous and responsive.

Over the last week, a couple major requests of our parish if we could help – a family whose loved one is in need of a heart transplant, and needs to travel quite a distance, but his wife needs lodging for several weeks to be with him, and the medical bills are overwhelming. This family is fairly new in the Liberty area, and have recently joined our parish. I feel that we have a responsibility to help those in need. I have promised this family that we will certainly be there for him.

Another need is a single mom who came to Fr. Timothy and me. Her disabled sister died suddenly in a group home setting, and they have no funds available for burial. Again, one of the corporal works of mercy is to ‘bury the dead’, so we have promised this family that we will support them.

So I am personally asking for your generosity at this time. We don't want this to be a burden on others, but to those who feel so inclined, we appreciate your gifts. Those gifts can be sent to me personally, and Fr. Timothy & I will make sure they are put to a good cause!! Whenever we have asked, people have responded – so thanks in advance for your generosity!!

A special THANK YOU to the women of the parish who have been planning over the last several months for our “Ladies Night at St. James”---this coming Tuesday, May 5th---it's a great opportunity to come together and enjoy one another and the gift of our parish community!! All women of the parish are invited!

May you and your families continue to know the beauty of Spring and the Presence of the Risen Lord among us!

Someone is Watching and Wondering



As any Missouri gardener knows, spring is the time to prune those parts of trees, shrubs, and plants which appeared dormant over the winter, but now are definitely recognizable as

dead. The gardener also knows that sometimes the pruning must be drastic if new growth is to occur, and the plant survive. For me it is sometimes discouraging to remove so much of the plant, which only last summer was lush and beautiful. Yet, I know that as long as the roots are alive, and with the proper care, my plants will grow and perhaps be more beautiful than before. I admit, however, due to my lack of patience, it is difficult to start over, or in this case wait for the plant to grow back to where it was before.

In today's gospel (John 15:1-8) Jesus tells His disciples: “I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does He prunes so that it bears more fruit. . . just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. . . whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing.”

As I read these verses I felt both joy and trepidation. I asked myself: “Do I allow myself to remain in Christ; How do I need to be pruned?” Being brutally honest, I discovered the pruning list was rather long (anger, frustration when things don't go as I think they should, fear, focusing on negatives, anxiety about the future, loneliness, trying to fix others, etc.) The pruning I need seems pretty drastic, and I wonder where the new growth will be. More specifically, I wonder “What does God have in store for me when He is finished pruning; Where is He leading me; How many more changes will I face?” I must admit the prospect is daunting.

On the other hand I felt a sense of calm, joy. It seems so obvious that as long as I remain with Jesus, there are yet great possibilities for my life. It isn't over, each day is full of His grace, and He offers numerous opportunities to grow and flourish in His love. It seems the possibilities are endless, but first, with His help I must let go of those parts of me which are emotionally, spiritually crippling. I must not be afraid of change brought about through His pruning away those parts of my life that only bring death. I know He is very precise, allowing me to hold onto beauty and goodness, while He clears away the sadness and sorrow, while shining His light in the darkness. Don't be afraid of His pruning; it can only lead you to become more like Jesus.

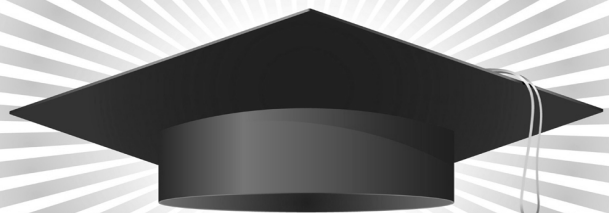

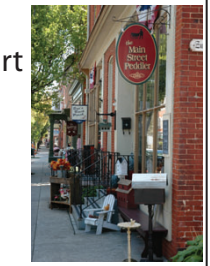


