

From the Pastor's Pen

Wow! What a whirlwind of a trip! Left on Sunday, returned on Sunday, left again, and now home again! Rome was an awesome treat and a great time to be a part of the celebration for the 200th Anniversary of the Founding of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. Although our founding is August 15, we chose to celebrate with the International Community on July 1st, Feast of the Precious Blood in Rome, and then will have a local celebration in Liberty to celebrate August 15.

Our week of events began with a walking Tour of Rome following in the footsteps of our founder, St. Gaspar. We traced from his birth home to church where he was baptized to the church where his mother prayed at the relic of St. Francis Xavier during his eye illness to where he first preached and served as a Canon to where he ministered, to the apartment in which he died and finally a visit to the church where he is buried. On Wednesday, July 1st, we began the day with a tour of the Vatican Museum and Sistine Chapel. After the tour inside, we made our way to the top of the dome of St. Peter's and stepped out onto the ledge for a view of the city from high up. That evening we gathered for the International celebration of the Eucharist at St. John Lateran Church. It was awesome! Over 700 members. companions, and lay associates joined together to first greet our founder. A bronze replica of his tomb depicting him lying on his deathbed with mission cross in hand was carried in leading the procession with celebrants following. We then filed out and processed in for the beginning of the liturgy. Seeing the many faces, the sea of red vestments, and the mix of languages in word and song was beyond words. Although it was mostly in Italian, I still caught a few words of Gaspar and hope and reconciliation.

Thursday, Friday, and Saturday found us on the bus traveling to various places outside Rome. We traveled to Albano and visited the Gaspar museum. Albano is where St. Gaspar was originally buried. After his canonization he was moved and enshrined in Santa Maria in Trivio near the Trevi Fountain. That afternoon, we celebrated with an international picnic. Each national group was invited to share a native dance and song for afternoon entertainment. And FYI, our place just happens to be across the road from the Pope's summer home. Friday was on to Giano, with a visit to the Abbey of San Felice, the birthplace of the Congregation. After lunch, we had a short visit to Assisi and back home. Saturday was a long drive day with a visit to Sonnino, where St. Gaspar famously ministered to the banditi and Acuto, the birthplace of the sisters, Adorers of the Blood of Christ. St. Maria de Matias founded the adorers after hearing St. Gaspar preach.

And then, Sunday morning found us up early and headed to the airport! It was just that fun, wild, crazy, and jam-packed full. I have many pictures of the places we visited and a blur of memories in mind. Oh but what a celebration it was!!!

Welcome Back - Fr. Joshua Barlett



We welcome back to our parish Fr. Joshua Barlett, who is currently Associate Pastor at St. Andrews in Gladstone.

Fr. Barlett, a former parishioner, will be the celebrant at the 11:00am Mass next Sunday, July

26. Following the Mass, the Knights of Columbus is hosting a reception for him in the Social Hall, giving him the opportunity to thank everyone at St. James for their love and support throughout the years!

Joshua, as we knew him then, was baptized, grew up and was confirmed at St. James. While his family was at St. James, he attended the 7:30am Sunday Mass and then in high school switched to the 6:00pm Mass. He attended VBS for all grades and was a volunteer helper in the years following. He was always involved with decorating the Church for the special seasons, was a member of the Music Group for the 6:00pm Mass from its foundation, ministered to the Deaf community as a member of the Hand Choir, and also spent some time in the children's choir and hand-bell choir.

Fr. Barlett started serving from an early age and then moved into being an usher when older. He shared that he first thought of being a priest when he was eight years old, but fought it off-and-on, especially in high school as he really wanted a family. However, at a morning Mass at St. James during his Senior year, he truly encountered Christ in the Eucharist for the first time in his life and decided to enter the seminary. He said that morning Mass changed his life forever!

He was ordained on May 23rd of this year with six of his classmates. Adding the other two ordinations together for this year, he was ordained with a class of 10 total - 10 new priests for our diocese! (1 in October, 7 in May and 2 in June).

Please join us next Sunday at the 11:00am Mass, and afterwards in the Social Hall, as we congratulate him and give him our best wishes in his life journey as a priest.

Someone is Watching and Wondering

On the feast of the Epiphany, 1972, the Catholic Church reinstituted the Rites for Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). The world's bishops recognized the Rites as a tool for missions in developing countries, and a way to revitalize faith in de-Christianized Europe. No one believed the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults would make much difference in the post-conciliar church, especially in the United States. Subsequently, in October 2000 the U.S. bishops compiled Journey in the Fullness of Life, in which they reported that the RCIA "is renewing the life of the Church in the United States." Since RCIA is a journey of conversion, by extension it is a journey for all the faithful. In the subsequent years, Christian initiation has moved from obscurity to a place of great prominence in the American Catholic Church. Where it is implemented well, it functions as a source of energy and new life.

Initiation rites are about identity. They define a community demonstrating who the community is and what it holds dear. Yet along with identity, initiation also involves change. While identity sounds firm and comforting, change is an occasion of risk. The rituals are joyful, yet filled with awe and perhaps fear, because they ritualize the acceptance of stepping into a new, unknown future. As the parish celebrates initiation rites, the baptized faithful also takes risks, and goes through a process of change. They are called to redefine social values and re-evaluate what it means to be Catholic Christians who remain faithful to the teachings of Jesus. The complacent may become unsettled, and the jaded refreshed as they witness the changes in the heart and soul of the community. This process of continual conversion is defined as *mystagogy*.

Christian initiation is centered in catechesis, however, many people mistakenly assume that catechesis refers to specific doctrines or theologies. When I talk to people about becoming Catholic, their common response is "I want to learn the 'Catholic stuff'." Catechesis, however, is much more than simply learning the "Catholic stuff;" it supersedes such a narrow interpretation. Catechesis is a life long process that involves a radical relationship with Jesus. Catechesis explores and recognizes God's action and presence in our natural lives, in scripture, and in the life, faith, and worship of the people of God. As such Initiation is both catechetical; and a public, liturgical process. Evangelization, ministry to the alienated, hospitality, accessibility, and the face the parish presents to strangers draw strength from the initiation rites. The RCIA has turned the church outward and has invited the faithful to recognize themselves as church who embrace their identity and mission as baptized disciples. Thus it is the entire community who bring new Christians to birth. The Rite states that those requesting initiation "seek the living God and enter the way of faith and conversion." People come to St James saying "I want to be Catholic." deeply seeking God, and a community of fellow believers. Our parish as witness to the faith, experience Christ more deeply by sharing experiences, praying with and for the catechumens and guiding them along this life-long journey. We invite them into a wondrous process where they develop, deepen and enrich their relationship with our loving God in Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit. Likewise when we witness catechumens giving up old ways of doing/being, and committing themselves to Jesus, it makes us want to recommit ourselves to Christ, to renew and refresh our faith lives..

Most of the time when someone is asked why they aren't a blood donor, the reply is simple, "I've never thought about it." Well, now's the time to think about it. Facts about blood donation:

- If you can handle the pain from getting pinched, you can handle a needle stick.
- Preparing for your donation is easy: Drink plenty of water and eat iron-rich foods the day before.
- ▼ A single donation can help save 2-3 lives.
- You get a free mini-physical when you are screened for your donation. Your heartrate, hemoglobin, and cholesterol are all checked and it doesn't require a co-pay ☺
- The whole process, from registration to refreshments, takes less than an hour. The donation itself is only about 10 minutes.
- ▼ Refreshments you say? Yes, there are refreshments! We wouldn't let you come and give us a pint of your blood without giving you something in return ^③. One donor commented, "I really just come for the Nutter Butters!".
- Giving feels great, especially when you understand that one hour of your time and one pint of blood can save so many people. In addition, what goes around comes around. If you want blood to be available to you or your loved ones when it's needed, do your part to make sure it's available for others as well.


Summer 850 Prayer Challenge Calling all 6th-12th grade teens....



St. James School News

St. James Middle School

What destinations would you like your child to reach this year? Focusing on guiding students to set goals and reach for their own personal destinations is a major aspect of middle school here at St. James School. One way we do this is by building strong leaders for our school community. In sixth grade students implement the program we call safety patrol to greet families each morning as they arrive at school. seventh grade students are responsible for working closely with Mrs. Stephens and leading stations during field day. They are also responsible for coordinating lost and found items so they are easy to identify. Eighth grade students create and implement morning announcements each day. By having middle school students utilize these roles, they are leading by example to help guide the younger students to create an atmosphere of responsibility that is family oriented.





"Being there experiences" are important to our St. James Middle School. Such destinations include a focus on the theatrical arts in relation to integrated curriculum instruction. By immersing themselves in "being there experiences" students develop a greater appreciation for historical events and the people they affected.




