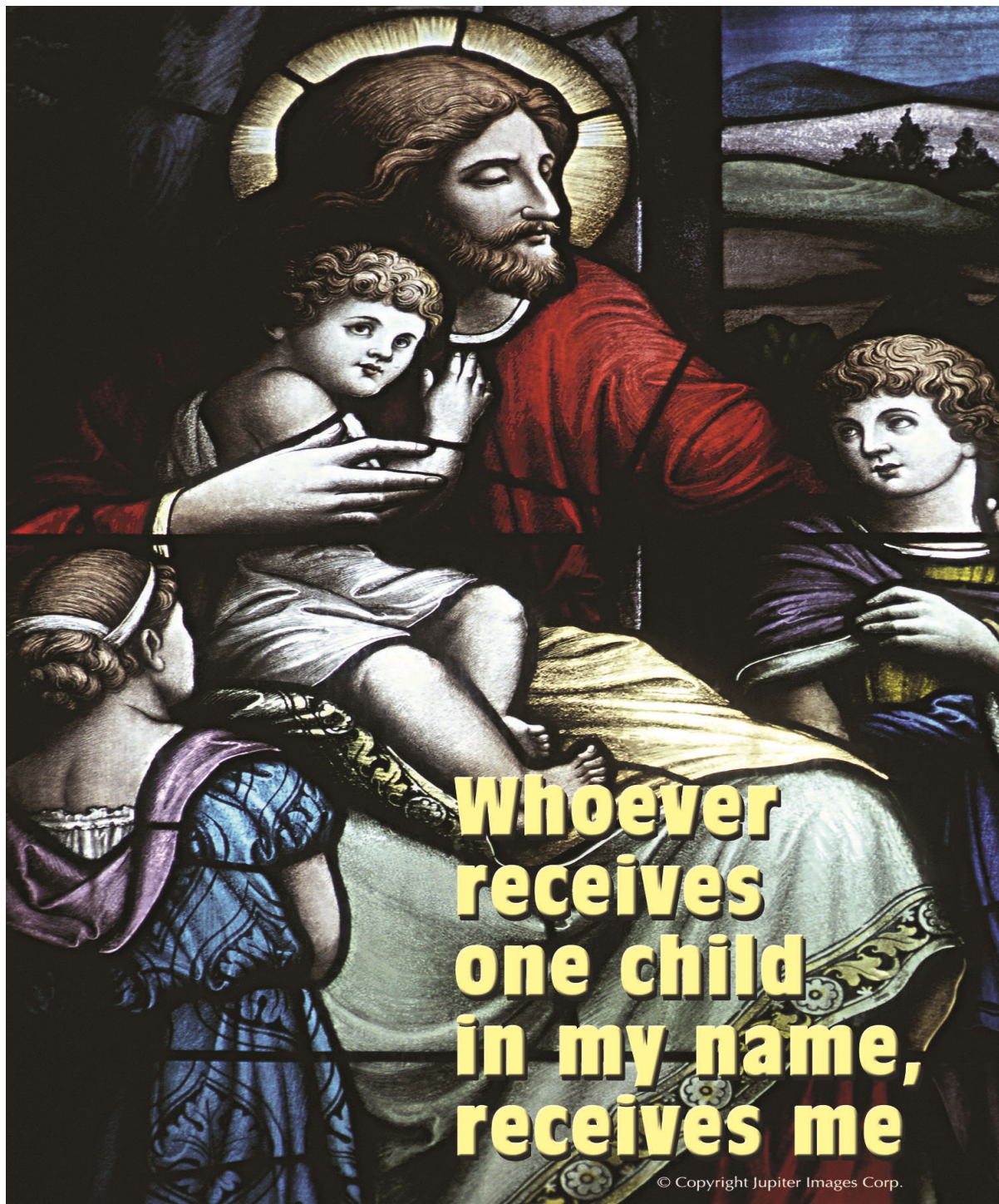

Children's Choir

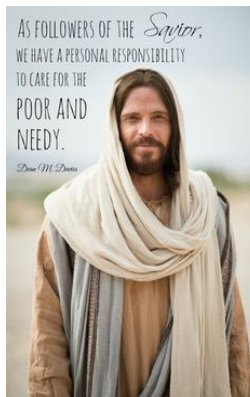


It's not too late to join the Children's Choir – you can register at the first practice your child attends.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



The Sunday epistle this month has been from James, a letter addressed to Jewish Christians scattered all over the Greco-Roman world, but concentrated in countries near Palestine such as Syria and Egypt. It presumes that the readers are familiar with the Hebrew Scriptures, and consists of a series of moral exhortations such as how to behave in time of trial, the origin of temptation, how to control the tongue, good relations and sympathy with one's neighbor, and the power of prayer. There are two main themes: 1. concern for the poor and 2. Christian's profession of faith without good works is empty. (You might want to take some time to reread this entire, letter.) I was especially taken with chapter 2:18 "...show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith."

Upon further reflection of this letter from James, I came to the conclusion that I was reading a summary of Jesus' gospel message, reflections on some of St. Paul's writings (e.g. 2 Corinthians 9:7, Galatians 2:10), and excerpts of passages from the Hebrew Scriptures such as Proverbs 21:13 — "If you close your ear to the cry of the poor, you will cry out and not be heard," or Proverbs 29:7 — "The just man has a care for the rights of the poor; the wicked man has no such concerns." The message reverberated in my mind: actions do speak louder than words.

Now the hard questions this forced me to ask myself: Do my actions reflect Christ Jesus to those I meet, or are they merely outward projections of my ego, wants and desire? Do I show empathy and concern; do I give of my time, talents, and treasure unselfishly; do I offer assistance willingly; do I share His love without patting myself on the back; do I give freely and generously without an expectation of a return on my investment such as another gold star to somehow reserve my place in heaven? If I answer these questions honestly, I know I fall short of what Jesus asks, and James reiterates. There are times when my selfishness and self-centeredness get in the way. Other times I feel disheartened, tired, overwhelmed. I sometimes find it difficult to let go, or to know when it is I'm hearing God's voice and not my own rattling around in my head.

When I feel most discouraged, perhaps even ashamed of my lack of action for the good of others, I remember one of the first Bible passages I memorized as a child: "For God so loved the world (including me) that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." (John 3:16) It reminds me that God formed my human life, and gave me freedom through Jesus. He loves me and cares for me, even in my sinfulness and failings. He is waiting for me to turn to Him. He wants me to feel the embrace of His love. He offers me guidance, hope, and peace. He fills me with joy, and gives me the strength to carry on even when I so want to give up, to quit, to escape from further pain. He is with me always. Being with Him is pure grace, gift beyond measure. At the risk of sounding heretical, I believe heaven surrounds us. It is a state of surrender, unity with our creator God. I can neither create heaven or earn it. My faith tells me not to worry, God provides what I need precisely when I need it. He blesses me each and every day. It is up to me to receive from Him, what I can then give to others. He gives the gifts freely, only asking me to use them wisely. I don't know when or how He will call me, but I must be willing to act when I hear His voice. I must be aware of the needs of others, and share what I have already received from Jesus. Yes, actions speak louder than words.

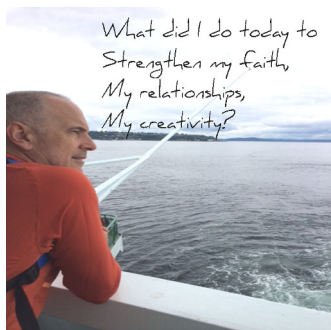
Help Wanted: Caring individuals willing to spare an hour of their time to help someone in need. The Community

Sacrament Preparation

In our parish and our diocese, in order to receive the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion, there are 3 "at leasts" you have to meet first. They are:

- *Your child must be at least 7 years old.
- *He or she must be in at least the 2nd grade.
- *He or she must have completed at least one year prior religious instruction, whether in our parish school, our RE program, or in a qualified program of home study. (That means that you worked at home using a standard curriculum.)

If you hit those targets, then you are ready to begin the preparation process with your child. Because the sacraments are so vitally important in your child's faith life, we prepare and receive these sacraments as a family, rather than as a class group as many of us remember from our childhood.

We have a parent meeting in September to help prepare you to work with your child. There is a set of 3 books that you will purchase for use (cost is usually @\$20 per set). You have your choice of dates--either **Wednesday, Sept 23**, or **Monday, Sept 28th**. Registration time is from **6 to 7 pm**--you may come at any time during that hour. The meeting will begin at **7pm** and is usually over by 8:30 pm.
