

Snack Pack Ministry Update:

Back in June, you generously opened your wallets to start-up the snack pack ministry to feed kids in Liberty who go hungry on the weekend. The ministry is in full swing and we are currently serving 10 students at EPIC Elementary School each week. The students receive a bag filled with \$5 worth of snacks, fresh fruit, and meal items to help ensure they have enough to eat when they are without school meal services on the weekend. Snack packs are delivered by our volunteers at the end of the school week. The snack packs are filled at St. James following the 9:15 Mass at the table on the carpeted area of the Social Hall. Donations are always welcome to keep our pantry full. Cash and HOPE cards to our local grocery stores and Sam's Club/Wal-Mart are very helpful! From the Pastor's Pen

It was exciting to see the great energy and enthusiasm this past Monday and Tuesday as we gathered for our campaign events. It is a great joy and blessing to be a part of such a wonderful community. Recently I was going through some boxes and came across a box of pictures. I found a stack of pictures my aunt had taken of my ordination at the church in WaKeeney. As I looked through the pictures, I was reminded of the size of that church. Growing up I marveled at the beautiful floor to ceiling stained glass windows we have and was always in awe of how long an aisle the church had. It was many steps from front to back and as a server it seemed to take forever to get to the front when it was my turn to carry the cross and lead the procession. But now when I think of that church, I realize how small it really is. But I always remember how alive it was with energy and spirit and life. Whether it be a small church or large, the life and spirit that lives within makes all the difference. Bringing new life into the church and making room for everyone to find a place at the table is a reminder of what church is about.

It has also been an exciting summer with our community's 200th celebration. We, the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, also look to our future and ways to continue to speak our charism of reconciliation and renewal in the church. As we welcome Pope Francis this week and look ahead to this December celebrating the Year of Mercy, it challenges each of us to seek the gift of reconciliation in our own lives. This October, we will host a Discernment Weekend at Precious Blood Center. It will be Friday, Oct 23 to Sunday, Oct 25. Men between the ages of 18-45 who are discerning God's call in their lives are invited to join us for the weekend. We will come together to share our CPPS story and spend time talking about discernment and hearing God's call in our lives. Are you called to live a Precious Blood way of life? Is there a restlessness within to be of service and minister to others? To walk with those on the margins? To preach words of hope and mercy? To find the joy of the gospel and share that with others? To celebrate the hope alive in our hearts and draw others to know and understand the redemptive powers of the Precious Blood? 



Someone is Watching and Wondering



Mrs. Hall let Grandpa sit in her rocking chair. The children sat on the floor in front of him. Grandpa showed them his long-ago pictures and told them his long-ago stories.

Two weeks ago I attended "Grandparents Day" with my two youngest grandchildren (Connor and Elizabeth), who attend a Christian elementary school. I had gone with them before, but this time was different, and most exciting for them, because my 96 year old mother, who many of you know, accompanied me. I'm sure the day and all the activities were tiring for her, I know it was for me, but what a trooper. She went to all events, participated willingly, met many new people, and was lovingly present for Connor and Elizabeth.

"Oma," a German term of endearment for grandparents commonly used in Bavaria, is how all my mom's great-grandchildren address her. I share this tidbit with you, because the name immediately set her apart from all the other grandparents and great-grandparent who were in attendance. For me, however, one of my mom's unique abilities is to vividly recall and share her life stories. She patiently answered questions about her likes and dislikes when she was in elementary school. She shared where she lived, what sports she played, books she liked, times she was in trouble, where she went to church, and my grand-daughter wrote it all down. Each time I have been with Connor and Elizabeth since that day, they have made comments about Oma coming to their school. Our day together brought back happy memories of being with my grandparents and listening to their stories. The last time I was with my Grandmother Hamit, she reminded me how full her life had been. One thing I remember so vividly was her stories of travel; her first being on horseback and covered wagon, flying in a jet to visit me, and even witnessing space travel and watching the first man walking on the moon's surface. I write this today, with a simple question: How do you share your stories? Are you comfortable talking to family and friends about your past, your experiences, your troubles? Perhaps more importantly, do you also share your faith story? Can your articulate how you came to know Jesus? Did you ever experience a time of doubt or anger with God? Do you invite others to worship, prayer, intimate communion, sharing their stories? Do you have a listening heart?

Each Sunday we hear Fr. Mike, and Fr. Timothy and sometimes Deacon Chuck sharing their lives and their faith. They invite us to a deeper union with God and one another. They challenge and encourage. They invite us to participation in God's kingdom, to a greater awareness of His presence within and around us, and they help us to become aware of new pathways open for our growth as a community of believers. I know as I listen to their words, they are honest, sincere, and truly come from their hearts. They share not just because it is what priests and deacons are suppose to do, but because we are all family, brothers and sisters in Christ. Are your comfortable doing the same? Can we reach beyond ourselves, outside our comfort level and share Him with the world? What is your story?







Sacrament Preparation

In our parish and our diocese, in order to receive the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion, there are 3 "at leasts" you have to meet first. They are:

*Your child must be at least 7 years old.

*He or she must be in at least the 2nd grade.

*He or she must have completed at least one year prior religious instruction, whether in our parish school, our RE program, or in a qualified program of home study. (That means that you worked at home using a standard curriculum.)

If you hit those targets, then you are ready to begin the preparation process with your child. Because the sacraments are so vitally important in your child's faith life, we prepare and receive these sacraments as a family, rather than as a class group as many of us remember from our childhood.

We have a parent meeting in September to help prepare you to work with your child. There is a set of 3 books that you will purchase for use (cost is usually @\$20 per set). You have your choice of dates – either **Monday, Sept 28th or Wednesday, Sept. 30.** Registration time is from **6 to 7 pm**--you may come at any time during that hour. The meeting will begin at **7pm** and is usually over by 8:30 pm.



