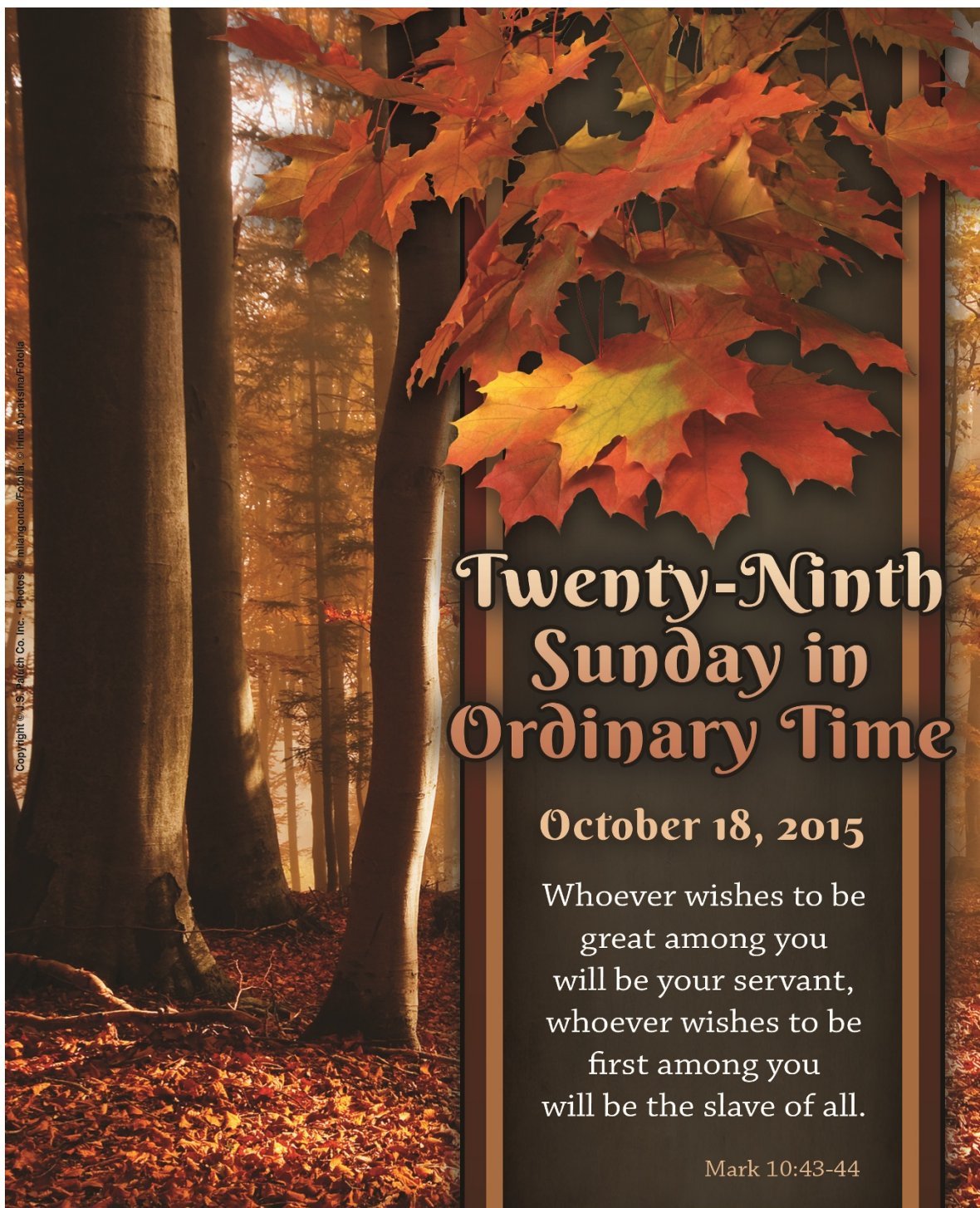

Someone is Watching and Wondering



As you may know, October is *Respect Life* month, and the picture above speaks to my heart in ways words cannot; one elderly life embracing one new life. It also reminds me that "God created human beings in His own image. . . male and female He created them," (Gen 1:27) and then proclaimed His creation "very good." Reflecting on this image and these words, I am once again reminded of the constant theme found in all Pope Francis' public messages: all life is holy. The respect, dignity, and caring for all life is, in fact, the central theme of Jesus' message. Verse after verse teaches that love and service to God is the same as love and service to one another.

This picture also reminded me of a verse from the prophet Jeremiah: Before I formed you in the womb I chose you, and before you were born I consecrated you." (1:5) We are made holy by our heavenly Father from the moment of our conception, and that fact cannot be changed by our circumstances of life. For me, respecting life begins with first respecting the gift of my own life. If I cannot accept myself as created in God's image; if I cannot accept my life as good; if I do not see my existence as filled with meaning and purpose; if I loathe myself, belittle myself, and refuse to accept the dignity and holiness of my own life then how can I ever acknowledge the dignity and holiness of others' lives? I have thought about this question many times, and have reached the conclusion that it is impossible to love God or to love others if I cannot accept God's gift of my being, if I cannot love myself, my being. That isn't to say there are not aspects of my person in need of change, but these areas are of human creation, mostly my own, and not of God's. My self image is a result of a life lived. There have been influences by others, both good and bad, which are deeply imbedded in my self image. There are decisions I've made, actions taken, and regrets heaped in my mind which sometimes contradict what I know in my heart. I am a beloved child of God, and His desire is that I might love Him and trust His goodness and His mercy. While this sounds easy, I'm afraid my ego often gets in the way, and I forget to ask for His guidance. I plow ahead, believing I am acting alone and believing I am right. Big mistake! All I am, everything I have depends on my Father's will, and He alone knows what I can be.

This last picture helped me visualize the uniqueness, yet sameness of humanity. It also reminded me that it is OK to be myself. I don't need to be like everyone else, because each of us already is created in God's image. It is God who gives life, and when the time comes for us to leave our earthly bodies and existence behind, we are once again united with our Lord and God as He intended from the beginning. It is my hope that these meanderings of my mind will give you pause to think about your life and ask this questions: Do I see my life as holy? Do I love my life? Do I respect my existence? Do I see myself as made in the image of God, and do I know His love enough to ask for His help and trust the path He shows me in reply.
