

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. James,

Thanks to the financial support from St James this year we were able to finish a small Eucharistic Adoration chapel, a sidewalk that allows access to it, a sacristy and plaster a back wall. We are planning to enlarge our worship space because it is just too small for all the people who are attending Sunday masses. We will also need to finish a second floor in order to have more meeting spaces for all the groups that belong to La Capilla. This will be a huge undertaking and we hope that we can work together to make this happen.

Recently, in the month of May we undertook a fund-raiser activity for the benefit of our church and raised 4,000 soles (\$1350). That money will be needed to build a second story on top of our current church.

Along with our new pastor is Padre Hilton Rodriguez, CPPS, we look forward continuing our bonds of mutual friendship and support despite the distance between us.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I have a habit, or perhaps you might call it a discipline of watching television, no more than 2 hours a day, and only in the evenings. That was not the case the week of Pope Francis' visit to our country. Instead I felt drawn to watch and listening to him both through live feed and DVR. His humility, sincerity, openness and love of God, expressed through both his actions and words, filled my mind and heart with hope. It was as though he was looking directly into my life, my heart, and calling me to greater trust of our Lord. Pope Francis' call to service was a wake-up to leave my self-centeredness and seek out my place in communion with others. It was a call to listen to God, to follow in the footsteps of Jesus, loving and serving without reservation or fear.

I turned to a *Concordance of the Bible* recently and found, as I already suspected, that Jesus almost never used the word "I." Of course, there are a few significant times with one very well known passage in the eighth chapter of Mark: "Who do people say that I am?" Two short verses later He asks, "But who do you say that I am?" Pope Francis reminded me to not only answer that question from my own heart, but also to ask myself what Jesus is asking of me. All too often my life revolves around my hope, my wishes, my desires, aspirations for my future, my abilities to succeed, my feelings or pain, sorrow, rejection or loneliness. It is so easy to forget that everything I have, all that I am comes from God. It is easy to fall into what I call the Job Syndrome; complaining, whining, venting my anger at God. While focusing on the bad things surrounding me, it is so easy to fall into darkness and not see His love which continually fills my life with light, hope, and inner peace. It is too easy to ignore the questions God posed to Job beginning in Chapter 38: "Where were you when I laid the foundation of the Earth?" Yes, where have I been? Perhaps hiding from what I fear most, surrendering my life, completely to Him.

This quote from Danny Thomas truly re-proclaims the gospel message, the good news of Jesus. Life isn't all about me. A life in Christ is a life of service. It is a life filled with the glory of God,

seen through our everyday experiences. It seems to me that in our interactions with one another, especially those ordinary things that go unnoticed, even to ourselves, we can serve the Lord. I really like the black and white drawing at the top because the actions portrayed are nothing special. Great miracles are not pictured, just everyday help. It seems, however, these actions are a sign of God's presence and love. Humans reaching out to other humans. Not thinking of themselves, personal gain, or lavish accolades. Rather, reacting to the need of another. I know a smile, a hug, or a simple hello can change my day. These actions call me to respond to the other person. They call me out of my introverted shell, into communion with another of God's children, demanding a response, like the *Sign of Peace* during the Mass. We cannot eat at the Lord's table with anger and bitterness towards our neighbor. Instead we offer them the love, hope, joy, and peace of Christ. Only then are we in communion with our Lord.

Let us all joyfully serve Him by serving one another. Thank you Pope Francis for the reminder, "the one who is least will be first."

Stewardship of Treasure

There have been questions asked of me that I feel others may be asking. Here are a few of them.

Q.) Clarification of the New Church Fund (NCF) numbers that I published for 06/30/2015 year end. What happened to the other \$715k?

A.) \$2,463,624.38	collected 11/2012 to 06/2015
\$1,117,135.64	parking lot cost
\$ 642,885.47	retirement of old debt
\$ 54,492.00	Cathedralicum
\$ 64,412.29	Feasibility Study, Newsletters, and 2016-18 Campaign cost
\$ 584,698.98	Balance in fund as of 06/30/2015

Q.) The \$6.1 million needed in pledges, does that include any of the past pledges for the 2013-15 campaign?

A.) It does not count the pledges. The Diocese wants every parish to be as fiscally sound and responsible as possible. So each phase of our master plan will be treated as individual projects. We had enough money for the parking lot, so we moved ahead. We will be able to count the funds in our NCF toward the \$4.1 million needed in the bank. Remember this is an "and" situation. We need both \$6.1 in pledges and \$4.1 in the bank before we can move forward. These numbers are based on the building cost of \$8.2 million.

FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY ROSARY CELEBRATION WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 7


Join with your fellow parishioners on Wednesday, October 7




