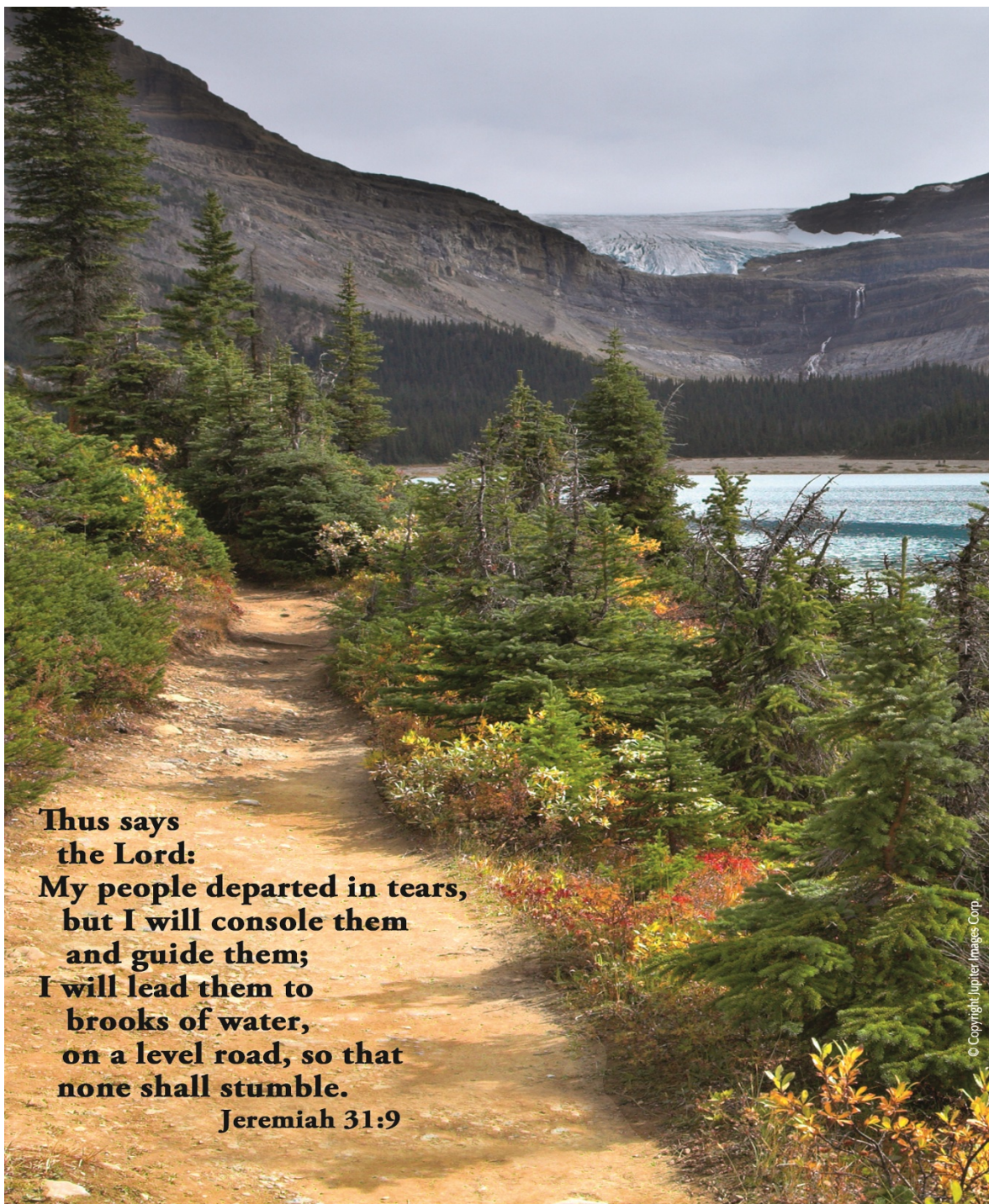

From the Pastor's Pen

What a great gift being able to see is. I once sat with an elderly lady who had slowly over the years lost her eyesight. As her eyesight diminished her other senses became more acute. She learned to navigate her room by memory and by feel. She learned to know others by the sound of their voice and the shuffle of their feet. On one visit, she asked me to get something from one of her shelves. It was a clown figurine. She described the clown, the shelf, and everything on the shelf. I stood in front of the shelf, but didn't see the clown. It was nowhere to be seen. As I continued to look, she began to tell the story of every knick-knack on that shelf. I was a bit embarrassed when I finally had to say, "I don't see it!" "What?" she didn't believe me. After a few minutes of frantic searching, her nurse appeared. After explaining what we were doing, the nurse shared she had moved the clown after the lady had told her she was going to give me the clown. The nurse had put the clown on her tray table right in front of us. I had seen it there but didn't realize that was the one we were looking for. I was both amazed and embarrassed. Amazed at the lady's memory and details she shared about each knick-knack and the stories she told, but embarrassed I couldn't see to find what we were looking for.

How good is your eyesight? How good is your memory? If you were to lose your eyesight tomorrow could you navigate your way around? What would you miss seeing the most? The blind man encountered Jesus and cried out to him. The disciples didn't want to be bothered. They didn't want to see him. Yet he kept crying out. As Jesus restored his eyesight, the blind man followed him. He saw something more in Jesus than what the disciples did. He saw healing, mercy, forgiveness and compassion. What do we see in Christ today? What do we see in one another? What do we see in ourselves?

This weekend we continue with our Commitment Weekend and invite those who have not yet made a pledge to faithfully see how we can make a sacrificial gift to support the building of our new church. It is with eyes of faith that we see this dream become a reality. Also this weekend, I ask for your prayers as our community, Missionaries of the Precious Blood, host a Discernment Weekend at Precious Blood Center. It will be an opportunity for men to see what our community is about and discern where God is calling them in their lives. As people of faith we are called to see Christ in one another. Do you see in your life where God is leading and calling you? Is it to service in the church? Do you see Christ in someone else and feel he or she would make a great priest, brother, or sister? Speak to that person and encourage the person to see in himself or herself God's calling.

What do we see today? Is it a day of great joy and blessing or gray clouds? For even behind the clouds there is great joy and blessing in the Son.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Are you wondering about my sanity as you look at this picture? No, I haven't totally lost my mind, or forgot that I am writing for the St. James Weekly Bulletin. Believe it or not, I spent several hours on the internet looking for a picture that represented the diversity of humankind, and ran into a problem. Nearly every picture I found represented a **particular** group, culture, religion, promotion or global location. Then I remembered a Lego picture I found with my youngest grandson, Connor. It certainly represents a diverse group of characters, standing together, and proclaiming welcome. So what's my point?

For several weeks now we have sung: "Let us build a house where prophets speak, and words are strong and true where all God's children dare to seek to dream God's reign anew. Here the cross shall stand as witness and as symbol of God's grace; here as one we claim the faith of Jesus: All are welcome, all are welcome, all are welcome in this place." Of course we want to think of our community as a place of welcoming hospitality, but how are these words translated through the reality of our actions. I think it is safe to say that we are most comfortable with people who are very similar to ourselves. This may be based on age, sex, economic status, where we live, what is important in our lives, what we find entertaining, marital state, or the way we worship. Perhaps we reach out to those that are different through acts of compassion and charity, but do we actually welcome them into our lives and our hearts? These are questions I have been asking myself for quite sometime. What I realized, with some trepidation, was I am somewhat a misfit. By that I mean I associate with many different people, wear many faces, and live many different roles, but often feel on the outside looking in. Please don't misunderstand. I enjoy friends, family, and meeting new people. I'm not asking for sympathy, just admitting it is difficult for me to get close to people. Politeness is easy, but intimacy is hard. When I think of being a welcoming presence, I think of entering into relationships, that lead to developing intimacy with one another.

Intimacy begins with openness, trust, mutual respect, and the love of Jesus. That is, unconditional love, no strings attached. It means being open to the truth of the other person, not creating an image of who they are or what they should become to satisfy my inner needs. It does not mean bending him or her to my way of thinking and acting. It means celebrating our individual uniqueness, given to us through grace, God's pure gift, God's love.

The root words, in Greek, for *catholic* are *katha holos*, which literally mean "to include everyone." To be catholic calls me to be welcoming to all people, regardless of their human circumstances. It demands that I reach out in *agape*, whether to family, neighbors, close friends, or people far removed from my daily experiences. It means to care without borders. It requires me to respect people of different faiths, and different ways of expressing their love of God. It insists on open dialogue, and learning. St. Augustine used *catholic* as "being open to the truth, wherever it can be found." Parochialism and closed-mindedness are not words proclaimed in the Good News of Jesus, and have no place in the Catholic faith and tradition. However, welcome comes through His message, no matter how it's spelled. Loving Jesus is to love one another. I pray for openness of my eyes, mind, and heart, to become truly welcoming and unafraid of intimacy.

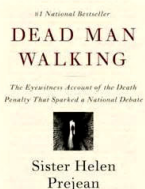
