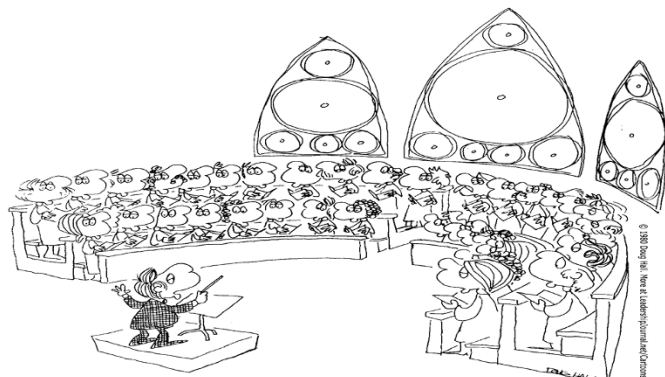
Children's Choir

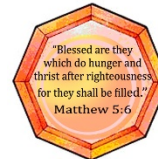

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Let the celebration begin! How appropriate for the Royals to win the World Series on November 1st, the month which begins two plus months of festivities and celebration. It also seems appropriate that the Gospel message for this day was Matthew 5:1-13.

We all know this passage. It is the consistent theme of Pope Francis' messages. Let me refresh your memory with a visual. Yes, the Beatitudes. Every time I read or hear these words, I am forced to look at my life and my inner feelings. It is easy to get caught up in the momentum surrounding celebrating a major accomplishment such as winning the World Series, landing a new job, completing college, moving into a new home, holding a new born, or reunions with family and friends. I don't think, however, it is easy to wrap our minds around, and celebrate these words of Jesus. We seem programmed to celebrate success, wealth, strength, and high spirits.

Our American culture, with a spirit independence, accomplishment and pride seems at odds with His words. How are we blessed in mourning, persecution, and hunger? When did meekness become a virtue? How pure is my heart? Is it possible to celebrate the Beatitudes with the same enthusiasm as winning baseball's crown?

My answer is a simple yes! In fact is there anything more worthy of celebration than surrendering to and receiving God's love? That is really the simple message behind these words. When God is first in our lives, when we trust in His mercy, when we believe He is with us always, leading, guiding and nurturing, then true peace and joy fill our lives. I don't necessarily mean feeling happy, rather a heartfelt knowledge that all is right with God. While I cannot foresee the future with sure knowledge of what I am to do, God knows, and He cares. If I can surrender to His will, He will lead me through my darkest days, and guide me with His light. I can become His voice, hands, feet and heart. I can learn to love as He loves. I can heed Jesus' words and reach out to others.

It is always a shock to my system moving from daylight savings to CST. It seems as though the world suddenly becomes darker, and I must confess it is easy for me to fall into a funk. As if darkness isn't enough, November is often cloudy, and certainly gets colder. Perhaps that is one reason people begin preparations for Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Years so quickly. We are hungry for bright colors, light, and celebration. I know it is no accident that we celebrate the birth of Jesus so soon after the longest night of the year in this northern hemisphere. With Christ in our life, what isn't too celebrate.

In a short time, celebrating over the Royals success will fade, yet in Spring the team will once again begin the quest for yet another winning season. I'm sure there will be successes and failures, but we'll continue to cheer for "Our Boys in Blue." We don't have to wait for another season to sing praises and celebrate the glory of God. God's love and grace surrounds us every second of every hour of every day. It's simply matter of opening our hearts and receiving what He provides. At the same time, we must be willing to acknowledge and accept that every day may not appear ideal and perfect. In my heart, however, I know that every breath I take is a gift from God, and all life is worthy of celebration. No, there is no harm in celebrating victories, but remember the greatest victory is life, both given and redeemed through the cross of Jesus Christ.

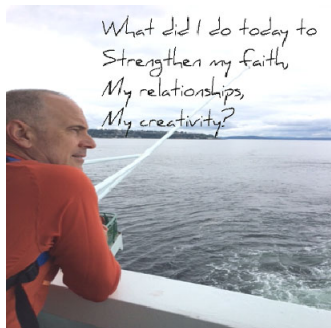

St. Frances Xavier Cabrini (Mother Cabrini)

Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, also called Mother Cabrini, founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, a major support to the Italian immigrants to the United States. Born in Italy in 1850, she took religious vows in 1877 and added Xavier to her name to honor the Jesuit saint, Francis Xavier, the patron saint of missionary service.

In 1889, she sought approval of the pope to establish missions in China. Instead, he suggested to her that she go to the United States to help the Italian immigrants who were flooding to that nation in that era, mostly in great poverty

She was the first naturalized citizen of the United States to be canonized by the Roman Catholic Church, on July 7, 1946.

Saints for the Month

St Martin de Porres

Martin de Porres was born in Lima, Peru, to parents of mixed race. Raised primarily by his mother, a freed slave, Martin experienced the effects of racism and poverty early in his life. He became the apprentice of a barber, learning not only how to cut hair, but to perform basic medical treatments. Feeling called to give his life to God in service of the lowly, Martin entered the Dominicans, who accepted him as a lay helper and later as a brother. He spent his days caring for the those who were sick and poor, as well as performing menial tasks within the monastery. His nights were spent in prayer, penance, and adoration. Martin treated everyone with respect and dignity, regardless of their race or social status. He was instrumental in founding an orphanage to care for Lima's many street children.

Saint Martin experienced the exclusion, derision, and discrimination of racism. Instead of growing bitter, he used his experience to reach out and comfort others. Martin's unwavering love of God and devotion to the Passion sustained him in his charitable works that often went unacknowledged.
