### Stewart Road Closure

We have been notified that Stewart Road will be closed from the North for what is currently estimated at nine weeks beginning on Monday, April 11 and reopening on Monday, June 6.

*These dates are estimates* – weather and construction contingencies can impact completion.

Red Legacy (Developer) advises they will be lowering the road surface approximately 15 feet.

We have developed a plan for traffic flow into and out of St. James – for our Masses, school children drop and pick-up and normal church / school activities.

Next weekend's bulletin (April 3) will include a clearly marked route into and out of the facility.

We ask that everyone use this route *everyday* for all traffic during the Stewart Road closure.

We understand that this road closure creates challenges getting into and out of our parking lot. Working together, we can make the best of a difficult situation.

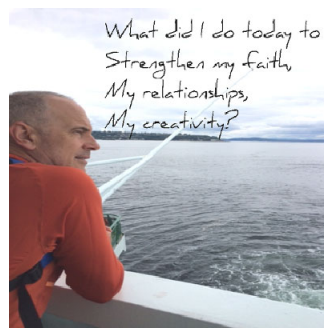

From darkness to light, from death to new life – that's what the celebration of the Easter Vigil is all about. Our Elect, Samuel Clayton Arnold, Harley Jason

Hawkins, Emily Danielle Michaelis, Genevieve Michaelis, Katherine Mae Robeson, and Dean Schropp, Jr., have been on a Journey, looking for and following the Light of Christ. At the Vigil we welcomed them to our



community through the Initiation Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Entering the waters of Baptism they died to their old life of sin and darkness, to rise clean and refreshed from the water, into a new life in Christ. Our candidates, Megan Elizabeth Caswell, Marlene Cruz, Irma Enriquez. Richard Henderson, Travis Hill, Elizabeth Michaelis, and Hollie Kosorog, made a profession of faith, were confirmed and welcomed into full communion with the Catholic Church. These individuals, however, were not the only ones embracing Christ's light and reaffirming baptismal promises. With the sprinkling of baptismal waters each of us are recalled to our vocation as members baptized into the Body of Christ. Through song and prayer we rejoice not only in His resurrection, but in the renewal of our faith community, the Church, which comes every time we reach out in loving kindness and mercy to our brothers and sisters in need. # Capital Campaign to Build A New Church



## PAST

Liberty and the surrounding area is growing! And St. James is growing with it. That would normally be good news - except for one thing! We can't keep up with Liberty's population growth. We are "bursting at the seams". Just look around you this Easter Sunday. You are shoulder to shoulder, standing room only, many sitting in the Narthex, others sitting on bleachers in the gym.

While overcrowding in our worship space is not the norm at most weekend Masses, it is often the case at our 9:15 and 11:00 Sunday Masses when temporary seating is set up in the Narthex. And other Masses are getting crowded as well.

In 1981, when we moved into our current church, after having been at our old location on Water Street since 1913, it was believed that this was our "forever church home". No one could have predicted the exponential growth in this area.

*Our present church is limited to seating approximately 500 people while another 50 can attend Mass from the Narthex.*



## PRESENT

Last summer, we moved forward with the Master Plan for our St. James Community, and launched a capital campaign to build a new church.

Our campaign goal is to build. However, before we can move forward, we must have \$6,000,000+ pledged and \$4,000,000+ cash in the bank. As of the end of February, 739 parishioners (about 1/3 of all parishioners) had pledged \$4,625,761 to this 3-year campaign that runs through 2018.

Building a new church is critical in order for us to continue to grow and provide numerous opportunities for our parish community. Just as our predecessors on Water Street prepared the way for building our current church, we too have an obligation to prepare for the future. How else will we serve in ministries, services, evangelization, and educating the community about our Catholic faith? We must have vision, willingness to become involved, and daily prayer for our continued success.



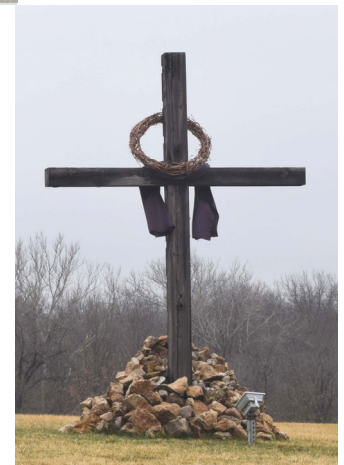
## FUTURE
