Our new electronic sign in our entryway is almost complete. Following the completion of the parking lot, this is our next huge endeavor before the building of our new church.

The sign will be on the pedestal you see now at an approximate mid-point between our Palisades and the commercial road. It will have brick pillars and cast aluminum caps meant to bring to mind the frontal silhouette of our new church.

“St. James Catholic Community” will be scrolled into the aluminum and lit internally at all times. The sign proper will be two-faced LED 16mm and will have full capability to display any message we chose to post with user friendly software to allow maximum capability.

The sign will be fully visible from Stewart Road and the entrance parkway and service road and very noticeable from I-35. In the future it will be surrounded by a garden.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Jesus performed many miracles (like changing water into wine and calming the storm-swept sea), healed the blind, deaf and lame, and brought the dead back to life. As a person who studied and worked most of my adult life in science (primarily chemistry and microbiology) I honestly confess that I cannot explain any of these things with empirical evidence or mathematical calculations. Yet in my heart I know they are true. Additionally, I cannot prove that ordinary bread and wine becomes His body and blood. To quote a dear friend, much of what we profess, in faith, to be true remains a mystery. What I do know, however, and have witnessed with my senses is the transformation that takes place in the lives of individuals who open their hearts, minds, and lives to Jesus. Ordinary people doing extraordinary things. Permit me to make a few suggestions: The mother who is exhausted but remains at the bedside, caring for her sick child; the firefighter who continues to go into a burning home until the last person is safely outside; the physician who continues to care for the wounded well beyond the work-day; the father who takes his son to rehab after yet another relapse; the child who shares her lunch with the new kid at school; the old woman who makes quilts for pre-mature infants. I'm sure you could make an exhaustive list of similar acts of kindness that go beyond tasks for which we are paid.

To my simple way of thinking this is the real transforming power of Jesus. His love changes us. His sacraments strengthen us. His mercy sustains us. When we humbly acknowledge all He has given to us and how he surrounds and protects us, then we are on the road of conversion. A convert is one who is transformed by the power of God, to change their life, follow Jesus's teachings, and live conformed to His will. At times our tasks seem daunting, but with God anything is possible. Mystery, yes, impossible, no. It really isn't unreasonable to believe that I too can be transformed into an instrument of His peace.

Two ways to make this hassle free with no extra fees for you or the church!

You may use your own online banking to send us electronic checks. At most banks this is a free service and you can set it up however works for your family. Please use the memo section to tell us how you want the money distributed.

You may join our auto draw system. We make one draw a month on the first Wednesday of the month. You tell us the amount and how you would like it distributed (Tithe and/or NCF), and we break it up. Our Auto draw system (ACH) continues to grow. We currently have 347 families using the draw. This is an easy and convenient way to give to the church. It is free to us and you, in most cases. Out of town – no worries, the draw takes care of this for you at the beginning of each month. Forgot your envelope – no problem, the draw has you covered. Mistake on using the incorrect envelope – nope, not with the auto draw. If you would like to use this system or have questions – please feel free to contact me, it really is easy.
