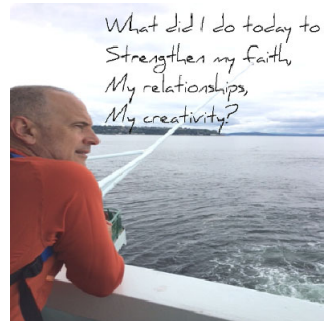

Someone is Watching and Wondering



As most of you know, August is the month when students return to school. In watching my grandchildren prepare for this event, I once again began thinking about relationships, and our interconnectedness. I thought of Jesus' teachings which challenge us to "Love one another," yet there is nothing in the definition of this word which mentions love. Webster states, "Relationship is the mutual exchange between two people or groups who have dealings with one another. In other words the way two or more people talk to, behave toward, or deal with one another. This sounds adequate for a formal contract, but not exactly all encompassing for daily, less formalized interactions between people. In turning to Scripture, I re-discovered three chapters, the focus of which is how to treat others (Proverbs 31, Ephesians 5, and I Corinthians 13.) Of course these are verses frequently read at weddings, but I believe there is much to be applied to any relationship.

In Proverbs we read "Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves (31:8), words which are often echoed by Pope Francis. The Letter to the Ephesians begins "In a word, as God's dear children, you must be like him. Live in love as Christ loved you and gave himself up on your behalf." (5:1-2), and I'm sure you can recite the final verse of I Corinthians (13:13), "There are three things that last for ever: faith, hope and love; and the greatest of these is love." As I reread these words, I was forced to ask myself how closely I adhere to and follow the exhortations. Am I patient, kind, and forgiving? Do I speak out for and act on behalf of those without a voice in our society? Am I truly in unity with the poor. There are so many examples of individuals fulfilling these roles, but I don't believe I am one of them? To be honest, I think I fall short much of the time. I get so wrapped up in my own life challenges, and those closest to me, that I forget how blessed I am. I know am comfortable in my surroundings, and feel trepidation in stepping too far from my comfort zone. There are so many questions in my mind concerning what I can and should do to live as Jesus commands. I sometimes feel overwhelmed.

Part of personal discernment is asking hard questions, recognizing limitations, and acquiring the necessary tools to complete our call to ministry as baptized Catholics. Early in my adult life I thought I had things figured out, yet overtime my future grew murky. I never envisioned myself as a teacher, yet found myself in that role, which in retirement, I continue today as a catechist. I have also found myself as an advocate for insuring that children, youth, and adults at St. James are knowledgeable regarding creation of safe environments and personal space. I cannot claim to be more than I am, but I can strive to be more Christ-like in service and love to others.

Changes Coming to Youth Programs

We ask your patience as we work through the process to locate, interview and hire a new Director of Youth Ministry. Father Mike has said that he wants to take the time to find the right person for the job and the right fit for the parish. What this means for the immediate future is that we will be keeping the youth programs running, but making no huge permanent changes. So our middle school Faith Sharing program will continue, much as before, but our catechists for those grades are taking a more active role in planning lessons/activities/possible outings. We are blessed with a group of very creative and dedicated volunteers!

Our high school program will look a bit different, as we are moving to encourage more participation from students who have already been confirmed, as well as our 9th graders. Our hope is that we can develop a strong enough program that our high school students will want to be here and take part in the evenings that the catechists are planning. A new Director will certainly come with his/her own ideas about how they want to proceed, so we are trying to be careful to respect that while still keeping the program strong and exciting. We welcome anyone who would like to be involved with either of the youth programs! Working with teens can be very rewarding--they are bright kids with lots of questions. They need good role models to show them what being an adult Catholic looks like. Is this where God is calling you?

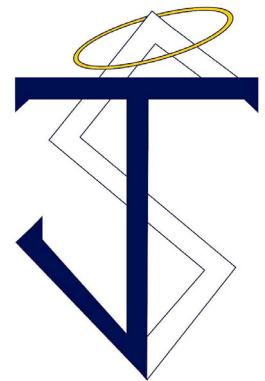
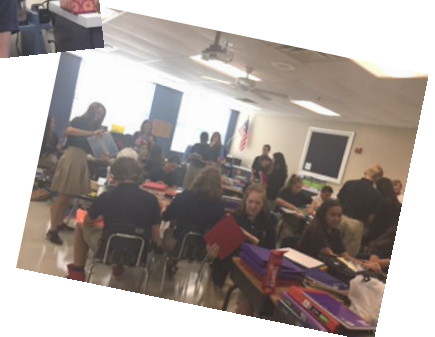

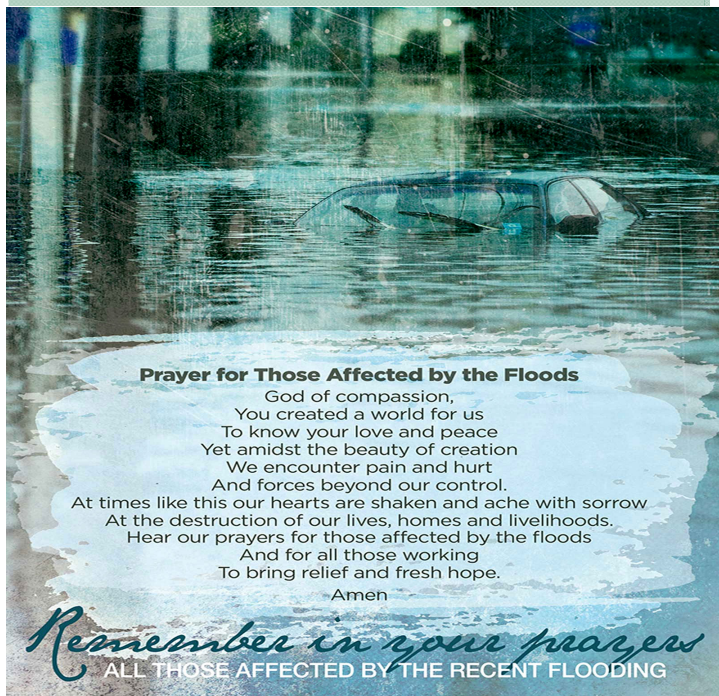
