

### Someone is Watching and Wondering



In a recent interview with Bishop James Johnston on Kansas City's Public Radio Station (KCUR-FM), he stated his vision for our diocese; a desire that all Catholics would see with the eyes of Jesus, act as His hands and love one another as He

commanded. I ask myself: "How do I measure up to the Bishop's vision?" Many times I've seen a picture like this, and thought about the unselfish acts of ordinary people, yet I cannot remember a time when I was called to help in such a dramatic manner. Although I try to live the Gospel message, I know I often fall short. There was definitely a time in my past when it was all about me, taking care of myself, living my dream. I couldn't see others' need or work to eliminate social disparity.

Change began for me while living in Germany. There were many Gls sent directly from Vietnam. They were without family members, sometimes angry, and often drank excessively to hide from their war experiences. As I became friends with some of the other wives, we started a group to provide special dinners for these men. There was a warm, friendly atmosphere, they could be themselves, and feel part of our "overseas family." I will never forget those years, friendships and experiences. Our mutual need was life changing. I wasn't thinking about Jesus, but I learned to love some pretty strange people. Upon returning to the USA, I continued to grow in an understanding that humans are very different, from diverse cultures and backgrounds, with unique abilities and talents, which can lead to significant contributions to our society and world.

St. Paul wrote: "The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I don't need you!' Nor can the head say to the feet, 'Well, I don't need you!' On the contrary, we cannot do without the parts of the body that seem to be weaker; and those parts that we think aren't worth very much are the ones we treat with the greater care" (I Cor 12:21-22.) I must ask myself: "What value do I place on the weakest members of our society. It is so easy to fall into the self-centeredness trap, wearing blinders that shield me from the suffering of others. If I don't sleep well I am cranky. When I am hungry, or aching I tend to attack like a she-lion. When someone disagrees, I rage back explaining in great detail why they are wrong. I get frustrated when I am stuck in construction detours and traffic. Then I see a picture of a child in need, an elderly person alone, a homeless person huddled inside cardboard, and I feel shallow and humbled. In my mind I hear Jesus saying: it's easier to see the splinter in another's eye than to see the plank of wood in our own. I know it's time for some re-evaluation of my life. It's time to see with the eyes of Jesus, to hear with His ears, to love as He taught, and to leave behind my fear of following the path He places before me. I must witness to the value or others, especially the weakest and vulnerable. I must look beyond any preconceived ideas regarding why they are in their particular situation. They deserve love advocacy, and assistance. I think I'll keep this picture as a reminder of what we all can become as part of the body of Christ, led by His Sprit, surrendering to His grace and love. We can all witness His glory, sometimes we just need a reminder to open our eyes and hearts. Praying for blessings, and peace.

# Childhood Sacrament Preparation What to Know

First Reconciliation & First Communion -- in our diocese, before we can prepare a child to receive these 2 sacraments, he/she must meet 3 simple criteria: they must be baptized, they must be at least 7 years old and in at least the 2nd grade, and they must have completed at least 1 year of prior religious instruction, whether in our Catholic school, in a parish RE program, or in a qualified program of home study. Once those 3 basics are met, we can work with parents to prepare their child to receive the sacrament--First Reconciliation in the fall and First Communion in the spring at the weekend Masses for the 4 weeks following Easter. Parents meet for each sacrament at the beginning of the process to receive the books they will use with their child and to have a quick refresher on the sacrament.

This year, we have sacrament preparation meetings for parents scheduled for - your choice of days -Monday September 26th or Wednesday September 28th. You pick the date that works best for your schedule. The first hour, from 6 to 7 pm, is registration time and you may come at any time during that hour. You will be signing your child up for the sacrament, as well as purchasing the set of three books that you will use with your child. The cost for the set of 3 books is \$20. If you have 2 children, the cost for the set of 5 books is \$30 -- and that just covers our costs. The meeting will begin at 7 pm and last about an hour. We will cover a quick refresher on the sacrament as well as go over the plans for the entire year. We try to be respectful of your time so we move pretty quickly, but we are always there to answer any questions.

Important Insider Tip: If your child was not baptized here at St James, you will need to provide a copy of his/her baptismal certificate. If you don't have a copy (or you can't remember where you put your copy) you can get a reprint from the baptizing parish, but that can take some time. It is heartily recommended that you begin that process now, to reduce the need for nagging emails from me later this year!


