From the Pastor's Pen

Sometimes it is a challenge to come up with a thought or idea for Pastor's Pen. This week as I sat to write this, I was searching for an idea. Today, we hear the story of a rich man dressed in purple garments and a poor man named Lazarus. The story of a poor man who died and was basically forgotten. But the rich man who also died, called him by name. It is a parable of making heaven real. The rich man cries out to Father Abraham in hopes of sending word to his brothers and Father Abraham's response is, "They have the prophets. Let them listen to them." The rich man never listened nor does he believe his brothers will. And so the story goes.

As I was searching for an idea, I did a quick search of "Modern Day Lazarus." What I discovered was the story and movie, "90 Minutes in Heaven." From the website, it is the story of "Pastor Don Piper who died January 18, 1989, when a semi-tractor truck crushed his car. Declared dead by the first rescue workers to arrive on the scene, Don's body lay under a tarp for the next 90 minutes. Don's soul, meanwhile, was experiencing love, joy, and life like he'd never known before. Don was in Heaven. When another pastor's prayers helped bring Don back to life, he became a living miracle! Yet this is one miracle Don wished never happened. Heaven's bliss was replaced by excruciating pain and emotional turmoil. With the support and prayers of his beloved wife, Eva, their three kids, and friends near and far, Don clings to his faith in God and fights to regain a semblance of his previous life. The Piper family's incredible true story of perseverance and overcoming the challenges of life - and death - will bring hope and encouragement to all who see it."

I watched one of clips that was an interview of Pastor Don Piper. He shared that his hope in writing and telling his story is that he can share "Hope." For him, he survived. For his wife, Eva, she overcame. I have yet to see this movie, but I hope and pray that it will be a living witness to something good in this world. As Pastor Piper spoke in the clip, "We pray still thinking about heaven, but pray for a better life along the way." May we all pray for that better life along the way.

I realize that this movie ties more in with the story of Lazarus, the brother of Mary and Martha than it does with today's gospel. However, it is still a story of heaven and what we believe it is. Pastor Piper shared this words at the conclusion of an interview. He prayed, "Lord, thank you for the chance to do something like this. I just pray that when generations see this, even after we are long gone, they will still be inspired. They will still think about heaven, still want to go there, but have a better life along the way. In the name of the one who is building a better place. Amen."

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I don't know your thoughts, but as a Catholic Christian trying to follow Jesus I am sickened by the seemingly endless campaigning occurring in this country, the demeaning nature of the speeches, and tasteless advertising at the national, state, and local level. Just once I would like to witness politicians who refuse to be part of the system that endlessly attacks their opponents, but instead use open dialogue and debate to express what they believe will serve the common good of our nation; candidates who share their plan and vision with passion and conviction. I would like candidates who honestly give witness to their lived experience, with enough humility and integrity to admit their faults, mistakes, and short-comings. I would like candidates who put others first, instead of their own agenda and party, whose lives are a witness of service, not power. Perhaps I hope for too much, and I certainly am not advocating any particular choice for your vote. I am, however, venting personal frustration, which has increased over the past weeks as I've listened to the Gospel proclaimed at Mass. I think Jesus' message is quite clear; What are our priorities and where do we place our loyalties?

This week we hear the story of Lazarus, sitting outside the rich man's gate. I turned to several Bible Commentaries and the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) to further my understanding of this reading. Here are just a few statements, from the CCC, which stuck with me, especially in light of how we seem to be missing the mark politically. "There exist sinful inequalities that affect millions of men and women. . .that are contrary to the Gospel." (CCC1938) "Injustice, excessive economic or social inequalities, envy, distrust, and pride raging among men and nations constantly threaten peace and cause war." (CCC2317) "It is the role of the state to defend and promote the common good of civil society." (CCC1927) "Being in the image of God the human individual possesses the dignity of a person. . .not just something but someone." (CCC357) At every Mass proclaim our belief in one God. The implications of this statement are far reaching. It means knowing God's greatness and living in thanksgiving, knowing the unity and true dignity of all humanity, being good stewards of creation, and trusting God in every circumstance including our adversity. (CCC222-227)

I close by sharing this prayer of St. Teresa of Jesus:

"Let nothing trouble you/Let nothing frighten you. Everything passes/God never changes—Patience/Obtains all. Whoever has God/Wants for nothing. God alone is enough."

Please, let us also pray for greater understanding and peace.

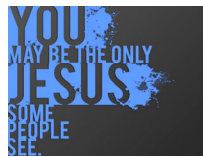
