

From the Pastor's Pen

With the flip of a page, we begin the month of October. Each year as October rolls around and I look ahead to the end of the month, my thoughts drift to western Kansas. Just down the road from the farm about an hour is Victoria, KS, and St. Fidelis Church, the Cathedral of the Plains. At the time of its dedication it seated 1,100 people which made it the largest church west of the Mississippi River. The building was begun in 1908 and completed in 1911. It is a beautiful church constructed of large native limestone blocks. St. Fidelis Catholic Church is not the seat for a bishop, so it is not a Cathedral. It received its nickname from William Jennings Bryan when he visited St. Fidelis in 1912. After several years of petition, St. Fidelis was named a minor Basilica in 2014.

Why do I even mention this church? It is a beautiful church with Romanesque design containing German windows and works of art, Austrian hand carved stations of the cross, and an Italian marble altar. Having grown up in the area and being of German descent, it is very much a part of our faith and traditions. I think of it because not so much what one sees but what lies beneath it. Although I may never step foot in certain Haunted Houses, I still like reading about them. The story of St. Fidelis Church goes that the youth group used to host a Haunted House in the steam tunnels that ran under the church. It was dark, spooky, scary crazy fun and the best part, no one had to do any decorating. The space itself was dark and scary and the banging of the pipes just added to the ambiance. So every year as Halloween rolls around and Haunted House invitations start arriving, my mind wonders about those dark spooky tunnels. I wonder if they still open the tunnels for a Haunted House or just give the quiet tour of the church? It's just one of those fun traditions of the season.

Another great tradition of this season is a hay rack ride and bonfires. With the weather changing and the days getting shorter, it is a great time to be together with family huddled around a fire and share stories. Many times, especially if a really dark night, we would take a ride on the hay rack and neighbors would see us coming and decide to try to join us. However, their joining was usually jumping aboard when we least expected it and scaring the daylights out of us. Oh what great memories!

What great memories does this season bring? With the changing of the leaves we know it will soon be winter and our days outside will be fewer. What great fun can we still have outside before the snow flies?

Singing is an Expression of Joy

In Colossians 3:16, St. Paul exhorts the faithful assembled in expectation of their Lord's return to sing together. He says, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly..., singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God."

Our relationship with God is one of love, and whether we sing loudly or softly, on pitch or out of tune, sing! St. Augustine very rightly says that, "it is natural for a lover to sing." We might also remember the ancient proverb that tells us "those who sing pray twice."

So sing your praise, your love song, to God - He will surely be pleased.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



A common request I receive as the RCIA Director is "When will you teach me the Catholic prayers. Never quite sure what is being requested, I ask for an explanation. A frequent response is, "You know, like the Rosary." Further, when I introduce the Mass as the most common communal prayer of the Church I receive some very surprised looks.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* describes four basic types of prayer: **blessing-adoration, petition, intercession, and thanksgiving-praise.** In prayers of blessing-adoration we exalt the greatness of God, and acknowledge our dependence on Him in all things (eg: the Gloria). Prayers of petition are requests to God for what we need (both spiritual, physical and emotional). However, petitions should always include a statement of our openness to accept God's will. Intercession is a prayer of petition which leads us to pray as Jesus did. Like Jesus, we are not concerned with our needs, but rather with the needs of others. Just as we ask the saints to intercede for us, we, in turn, intercede for our fellow Christians, asking God to shower His mercy on them by answering their requests. Prayers of thanksgiving-praise are perhaps the most neglected of the four types. Other than grace before meals, we should thank God throughout the day for His many gifts, and through praise, acknowledge God as God. Paragraph 2639 of the Catechism states that praise "lauds God for his own sake and gives him glory, quite beyond what he does, but simply because HE IS." The Mass and other liturgies of the church moves between these four types of prayer. Our individual prayer should also incorporate blessing-adoration, petition, intercession, and thanksgiving-praise.

St. Thérèse of Lesieux wrote "prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy." St. Damascene echoed her with similar words: "Prayer is the raising of ones mind and heart to God. . .(praying) out of the depths of a contrite heart." For me these words capture the very heart of prayer. In prayer I raise my mind and heart to God, baring my innermost thoughts and feelings, asking for forgiveness and healing, praying with a contrite heart. I know I cannot hide from God, so why not speak to Him honestly as I would to a trusted friend. In whom can I place my trust if not God. Catholic prayer is all about our conversation with a loving Father, recognizing our very human need for God to be God.

Recently I was sorting through my reference books and I found *A Prayer for New Stephen Ministers*, which I had used for a bookmark. I was struck by how this prayer incorporates the four basic types of prayer of the Catholic Church: "We praise you Lord Jesus. . . fill these ministers with your love and care. . .we pray for them in your name. . . thank you Lord, for the gift of your spirit." If you are still concerned that you aren't praying Catholic prayers here are 10 suggestions: Sign of the Cross, Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be, Acts of Faith, Hope, Charity, and Contrition, Grace before and after meals, Guardian Angel prayer, and of course, don't forget the Mass.






