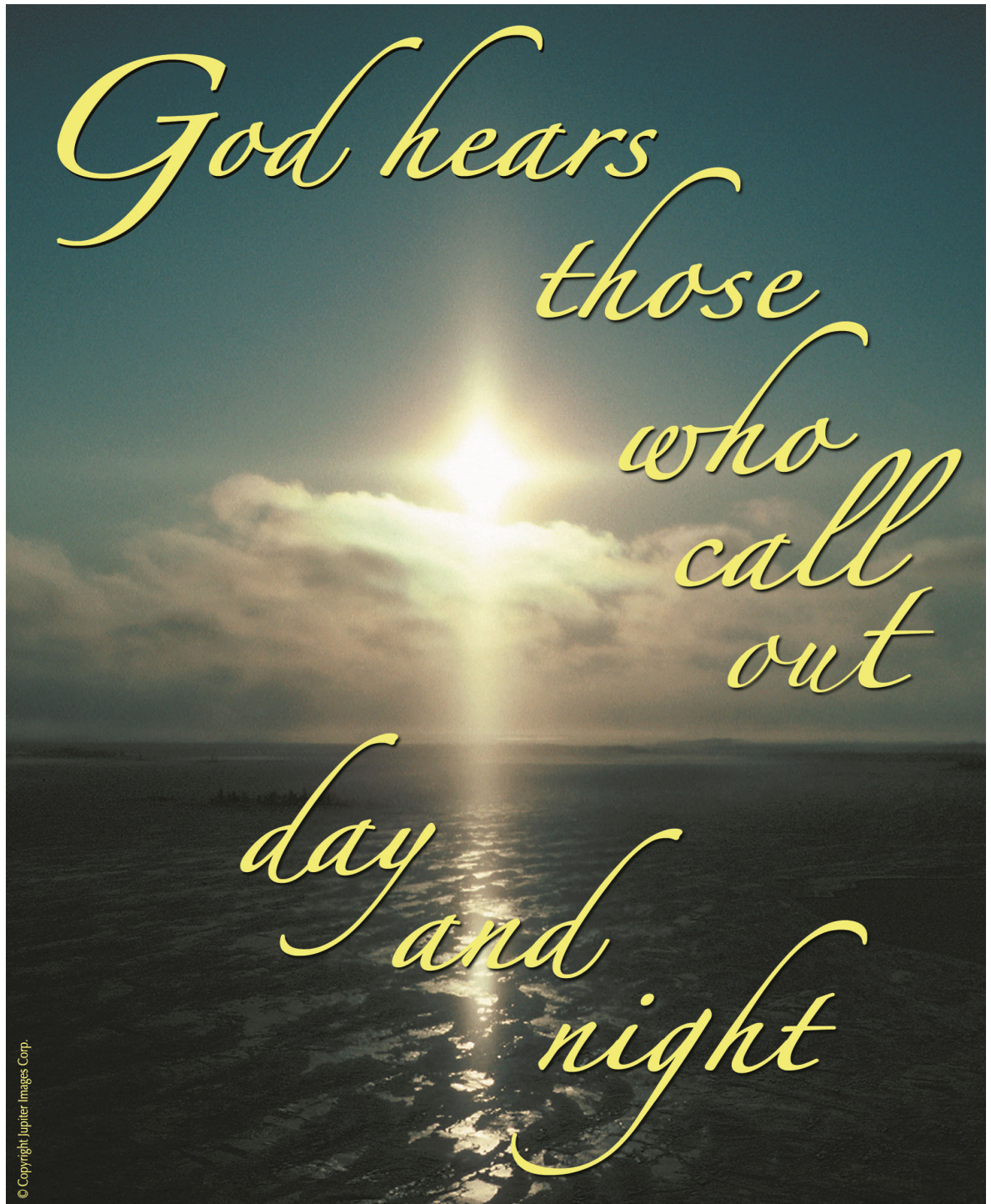

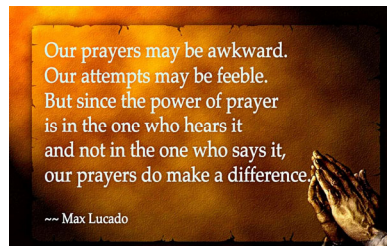

Someone is Watching and Wondering



This past week as I was thinking about the construction of our new sacred space, I re-read the "Letter of James." Although scripture scholars agree it was not written by James the Apostle, for

whom our parish is named, this book non-the-less has an important message for our community today. Basically, this letter is a discourse on living a moral life. I was particularly drawn to Chapter 4, and I was reminded of the Gospel from two weeks ago where Jesus compared the power of faith to a mustard seed. The first 12 verses explain causes of division in our society, while verses 13-17 warn against presumption. After reading these words I felt compelled to evaluate my prayer life. How often is my prayer more the demand of a petulant child, rather than a petition that is open to God's will. In verse 15 the author warns against making assumptions about the course of our life, and says we should qualify all our actions by saying: "If the Lord wills it, we shall live to do this or that." In other words, I must always trust in God's loving care.

I sometimes think it is hard to embrace the ethos of our culture in the United States and simultaneously remain humble and faithful to the Gospel. The belief that through hard work and persistence I can achieve anything seems to be in conflict to surrendering to God's will. I am not saying that we shouldn't strive to do our best, to be contributing members in our society, to work hard, and to aspire to living a good life. What I am saying is that my life isn't all about me and what I want or what I think I can achieve on my own. My life is in God's hands. I must have faith that He will lead me, answer my prayers, and never abandon me. My faith must extend to an understanding that my will is not necessarily God's will. God's plan is much larger than what I can comprehend. My mind, vision and understanding is limited by my humanity as well as the time and place in which I exist. I ask myself, how many times has personal tragedy resulted in a reordering of my life which resulted in something positive and good? Therefore, how should I pray, and prepare myself to let God answer? I think St. Paul provides a starting point. He writes that we should know and be molded by the word of God (2Timothy 3:10-4:2). I also find the *Serenity Prayer* to be a great help. This prayer truly speaks to my desire to trust God, to surrender my life to Him, and to following His word, even through life's most challenging moments. Perhaps this simple prayer will be a starting point to improving your prayer life, and invoking a greater willingness in your life to accept that "Our ways are not necessarily God's ways."

The Serenity Prayer

God grant me the serenity
to accept the things I cannot change;
courage to change the things I can;
and wisdom to know the difference.
Living one day at a time;
Enjoying one moment at a time;
Accepting hardships as the pathway to peace;
Taking, as He did, this sinful world
as it is, not as I would have it;
Trusting that He will make all things right
if I surrender to His Will;
That I may be reasonably happy in this life
and supremely happy with Him
Forever in the next.

Amen.

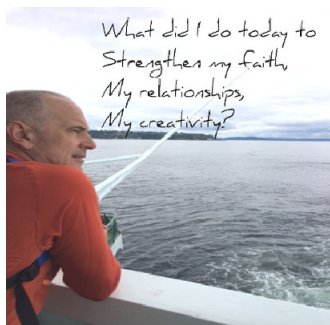


