

Has this ever happened to you: You go out to eat, and the first thing you see is dessert, either beautifully displayed at the entrance, or the dessert menu is on the table beckoning you to indulge. Perhaps the meal is served buffet style, or is a potluck where everyone seems to bring a special dish plus dessert. The sweet temptations are everywhere, yet as mature adults we generally restrain our desires, and eat in an orderly

fashion: appetizer, soup or salad, entrée, followed at long last by dessert accompanied perhaps by an after dinner drink. We savor each course before moving to the next one. We wait patiently in anticipation of what is to come. In other words we prepare our minds and our palates; saving the best, the sweetness for last. About now you are probably asking, "Where is Sandy going this time?" Let me explain.

When I taught college courses, I told my students to employ the KISS system when completing assignments or answering test questions. In case this is not familiar to you I translated KISS: "Keep it Simple and Straightforward." So, my above reference to dessert is my KISS method to explain the necessity of the Church's season of Advent. Think of Christmas time as dessert and Advent as the meal before dessert. The excitement and perhaps anxiety around Christmas is already everywhere. Holiday lights are strung, shopping has begun, ornaments and cards are made ready, and parties are planned. The question remains, however, have we prepared for Christ? In my humble opinion, Advent is necessary! Advent is a time every year to pause and quiet ourselves. It is a time to wait, refresh, anticipate, and prepare for welcoming Christ Jesus into our lives. Advent is a time to renew our relationship with Him, and feel His presence in a new way. It is a time to leave the past and what was, while we embrace the present and look to the future with grateful hearts. Advent is our time to prepare for the sweet goodness of Christmas. Each of the four weeks of Advent is a unique experience, just as is each course of a wonderful, well prepared meal. Week one of Advent is a time to refocus our Hope, week two a time to rest in His peace, week three a time to welcome the joy of His friendship, and week four a time to embrace His love.

For many people this past year has been full of confusion, frustration, and at times, a sense of despair. This week, however, ask Jesus to help you shed these feelings, and receive His hope. Hope that all things are possible. Hope that we are never alone. Hope that He keeps His promises. Hope that our lives are not futile but worthwhile and meaningful. Hope that with His help we can reach out to all our brothers and sisters with His light. The celebration of Jesus' human life and family during the Christmas season is not simply the end of Advent, but rather the culmination of our Hopes, Joys, Peace, and Love which only comes to fruition through Him. Likewise, the sweetness we savor is our ever growing relationship with Jesus, our Lord and Savior.

Advent Longing An Evening of Reflection



Advent advises us to remember that we are more than we think we are at any given time in our history. What are my limits? How do I limit myself? What limits do I place on God's grace, God's generosity, and God's love? Tonight,

we will reflect on how our readings for this Advent season invite us to long beyond our limitations. As Father Ron Rolheiser writes,

"The season of Advent is a time to get in touch with our longing, our aching, our frustrations.... In our longing are the deep seeds of hope." Through prayer, stories and song, we will explore how Jesus, the incarnation of God's mercy, takes us beyond the limits of sin and death.

Hey, Girl!

You'll never guess what happened to me, not in a million years. I was going tell you all about it when I saw you, but I just can't wait. It has been a wonderful and horrible time. Joseph has told my father that there will be no wedding. That's the horrible part. Now let me tell you about the other.
