

# Save The Date - Tuesday, February 7 Altar Society / Respect Life Program Featuring Nationally Known Speaker & Author Melissa Ohden



Melissa is the survivor of a failed saline infusion abortion in 1977. Despite the initial concerns regarding her future after surviving the attempt to end her life at approximately seven months gestation, she has not only survived but thrived. With a Master's Degree in Social Work, she has worked in the fields of sub-

stance abuse, mental health, domestic violence and sexual assault counseling, and child welfare.

In 2012, Melissa founded The Abortion Survivors Network (ASN). ASN seeks to educate the public about failed abortions and survivors while providing emotional, mental and spiritual support to abortion survivors. Since ASN's inception, Melissa has been in contact with over 206 survivors.

She is the author of "You Carried Me, a daughter's memoir", her story about what happens when an abortion survivor finds and forgives her birth mother, who never knew her daughter was alive.

### From the Pastor's Pen

I looked out the window as we touched down in San Antonio. The first thing I noticed was the green grass. I thought to myself, "We're not in Kansas anymore!" On January 3, I traveled to San Antonio to join 13,000 college students for SEEK 2017 sponsored by FOCUS missionaries. I along with Fr. Steve Dos Santos, Sr. Patty Kramer, Sr. Karen Elliot, and Lori Benge are all part of the vocation team for the Precious Blood family. We represented the men's CPPS along with the Precious Blood Sisters and the Adorers of the Blood, ASCs. In addition to interacting with the students at our vocation booth, we also had the opportunity to participate in some of the workshops learning more about FOCUS and how we as chaplains and campus ministers can better interact with our college students.

I had several wonderful conversations with various students. One recurring question that kept coming up is "What does God want of me?" or "I'm trying to decide what next in my life?" One student shared with me she was feeling "left out." As I questioned what she meant she shared that many of her classmates heard God talking to them in their life and vet she has never heard God's voice. She shared some different stories of what others had experienced and her feeling left out was that she never had an experience anywhere close to what the others had experienced. I told her, "If I ever hear God's voice booming loud in my life, I'm running the other direction!" As we both laughed a bit, I shared with her my experience of hearing God in my life is usually more of a sense of peace as I've come to make a decision after much thought and debate. Not really hearing God's voice like you do someone sitting next to you, but just simply that calming presence knowing that I have made a good decision. As we talked more she shared that she understood what I was talking about as she too had some of those same God moments in making life decisions.

We hear the stories of God speaking to various people and we might sometimes question how do we know if it is truly God speaking to us? Are we at peace with what we've heard? Does it stir something within us to respond? Does it bring us a sense of peace and direction? Or does it terrify us to want to run the other direction? It's one of those things in our lives that when God speaks, we just know it.

May God continue to speak to our hearts today. Fr. Timothy

### Roses For Life - January 15



# Someone is Watching and Wondering



How appropriate that just two weeks into the New Year 2017, followers of Jesus throughout the world will celebrate the *Week of Prayer for Christian Unity*. A good deal has been written about Pope Francis' outreach to our Christian brothers and sisters throughout the world, but I would like to share the story

of a less well known figure, the French priest, Paul Couturier. He was born in Lyon, France in the year 1881 and became a priest in the Society of St. Irenaeus, serving as a science teacher at the society's local school for almost 20 years. In 1923, however, he joined a relief effort working with Orthodox Russian refugees who had fled their homeland following the Russian revolution. Fr. Couturier helped them find shelter, employment, food, and schooling, while forming close friendships and growing to love the beauty and strength of their faith. He was deeply concerned, however, that the Catholic and Orthodox Churches were separated and this division awakened in him a desire for unity. He believed that the walls of separation did not rise to heaven, and he sensed that greater unity was possible.

Fr. Paul Couturier came to understand what he termed the "Geometry of Ecumenism." His idea of unity did not necessitate the conversion of others to the Catholic Church, but rather called for a conversion and drawing closer to Christ. He pictured a spiritual journey where people ascended from opposite sides of a pyramid, coming together only when they reached the top. Each person pursued union with Christ through their own tradition and along the journey they also grew closer to one another. In the end, each person is united with Christ, at the peak of the pyramid, resulting in all Christians being united to one another through Christ Jesus.

In 1933 Fr. Paul composed a "Triduum of Prayer for Unity" which invited people in Lyon to join him in prayer, not that Orthodox and Protestants would return to union with Rome, but rather that all Christians would become united in Christ. Over time, these three days of prayer grew into a full octave (eight days) which is observed every January as the *Week of Prayer for Christian Unity*. His work is widely regarded as paving the way for the Second Vatican Council's *Decree on Ecumenism*, and every ecumenical initiative that has come out of Rome since that time.

Please join in prayer, this week, for our Unity in Christ, with all our Christian brothers and sisters.

### First Communion Parent Meeting

We will again offer two options for the parent meeting – you can attend the session on Sunday January 22nd, or the session on Wednesday evening, January 25th.

The Sunday session will begin with the registration hour from 1 to 2pm. The meeting will begin at 2 and should last about an hour. We will have the same format for the Wednesday session – registration from 6 to 7pm, meeting beginning at 7 and lasting until around 8pm. You will purchase a set of three books, just as before, and the cost of those is \$20, just as for Reconciliation.

### Children's Collection Fund


