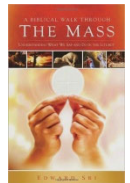

The fish tank that has been in the Narthex for the past several weeks has been emptied.



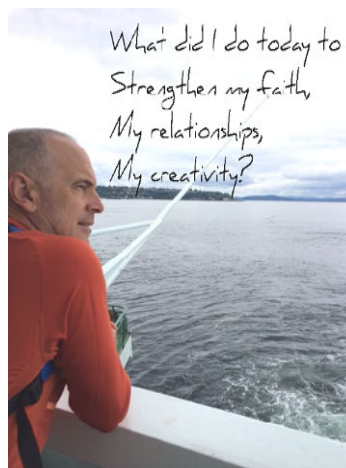
There were 25,874 coins, plus some cash in the tank.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I have always been curious and beginning in elementary school, science answered many of my questions. As some of you know I was trained in chemistry and microbiology to be an educator/researcher, and worked in that area for more than 33 years. In fact, I still read scientific articles and enjoy the pursuit of new knowledge especially in the fields of microbiology and medicine. Yet, I cannot imagine a world devoid of "The Arts."

From an early age I was exposed and grew to love music, dancing, literature, drama, needlework, weaving and other folk art, which are still a very important part of my life. Albert Einstein has been quoted as saying, "Creativity is intelligence having fun." I couldn't agree more, although my creative outlet was grounded in scientific work. In fact, I must confess my attempts in the arts remain basic and childlike. Even though my attempts are less than satisfactory, I remain engaged in appreciation of artistic accomplishments and I realize how these works continue to provide meaning and inspiration in my life.

Upon further reflection, however, I have come to understand that the inspiration for most great works originate with the Genesis story and God's creation of the entire physical and natural world. This is also for me where science and art converge into one elegant package. The DNA molecule, structure of the atom, geometrical shapes, the stars and planets are unique, beautiful, and God's work. The mountains, oceans, rivers, and lakes proclaim His majesty, and every life is an expression of His love. Even our earliest ancestors captured small pieces of God's work in cave paintings and stone carvings. Not only have artists' captured what God continues to provide, but their works also speak to the human condition in both its beauty and ugliness, as did Jesus. When I listen to music, read a book, watch a play or visit the Nelson Art Gallery, I am transported to a different world, level of understanding, or amazing place of beauty and wonder. Even in my own meager creative attempts, I feel a sense of contributing to other people in this place and time that I call the present. Science has provided answers to some basic questions, but art continues to lift us up will pointing towards a greater understanding of God's gifts and blessings.

2017 HOPE Gift Card Challenge

Do you have a HOPE Gift Card in your wallet?

Many of your fellow parishioners who have accepted the HOPE Gift Card Challenge are making sure they have one or more HOPE gift cards in their wallets when they go grocery shopping or go out for a meal.



If you haven't accepted the challenge to use HOPE cards to purchase 25% of your weekly food needs, why not?

Is it because your weekly food budget is less than \$100 and the minimum face value of many of the cards is \$25?

If that's the case, maybe you don't realize that you can use your HOPE card as many times as necessary until you use the total face value of the card. For example, say you buy a \$25.00 gift card and spend \$50 a week for food – 25% of that amount is \$12.50. You would pay cash or write a check for \$37.50 and tell the cashier that you'll pay the balance with your gift card. Your card will still have a balance of \$12.50 for next week's shopping trip. The following week, you'd buy another \$25 card and repeat the process. See how easy that is?

Alternatively, you could use the entire \$25 every other week to accomplish the 25% goal.

So get started right now. Your purchase of HOPE cards helps support the many ministries and education programs at St. James. And, after all, **"Ya Gotta Eat!"**

Cards are on sale in the narthex after all weekend Masses and in the parish and school office during the week.

In 2012, Melissa founded The Abortion Survivors Network (ASN). ASN seeks to educate the public about failed abortions and survivors while providing emotional, mental and spiritual support to abortion survivors. Since ASN's inception, Melissa has been in contact with over 206 survivors.

She is the author of "You Carried Me, a *daughter's memoir*", her story about what happens when an abortion survivor finds and forgives her birth mother, who never knew her daughter was alive.

To Help Someone in Need

One of our catechists has been working with the Don Bosco Center's ESL school that teaches English, primarily to refugees and immigrants. She has found that among these refugee families, there is a great need for simple household goods.



They come here with very little, and often without warm clothes and blankets. The refugee families are primarily from Somalia and Syria, both of which have much warmer climates than we have here. Our parish office has been organizing a small effort to collection donations of things that these families could use. She noted that these families are very grateful for any donations and that they are very respectful and careful to take only the barest of essentials so that others may share.

So if you have extra blankets or coats, or household goods (like dishes, pots/pans, etc) that you don't need or were planning to donate, you are welcome to bring them to the parish office during the week, or to Religious Ed during class time, and we will see that they get down to the Don Bosco Center for distribution. Large items, like furniture, are too difficult logistically for this, so you can continue to donate those to Hillcrest Hope – just take them to the loading dock at the side and they'll be happy to unload them for you!

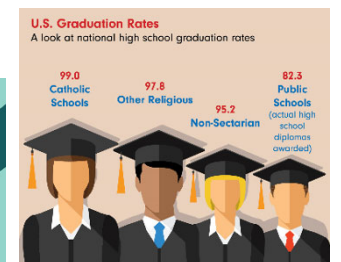
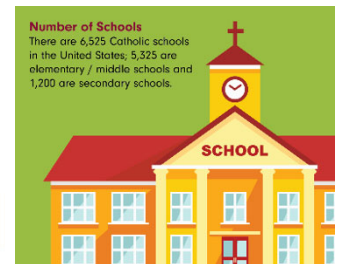
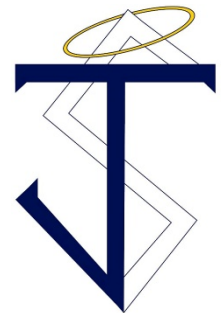
