From the Pastor's Pen

Today we hear the words of scripture known as the Sermon on the Mount. During my studies, I had the opportunity to travel to the Holy Land and study there for three months. One of our day trips was to the Mount of the Beatitudes, which is believed to be the setting for the Sermon on the Mount. Pilgrims commemorate the event at the eight-sided Church of the Beatitudes, built on the slope of the mount and accessible by a side road branching off the Tiberias-Rosh Pina highway. As pilgrims that day, we joined the crowd in the beauty of the space. We had time to sit and relish in the words of scripture. But our quiet was soon interrupted by the next bus load of pilgrims dashing from the bus into the church and back onto the bus. Many of us in the group turned and looked at each. One of my colleagues blurted out, "How rude!" as another busload charged past.

The words we hear "Blessed are..." are familiar to many of us. These words are not only instruction, but call us to live in right relationship. These are also the words we hear on November 1, Feast of All Saints. A day we recall those holy men and women who have lived lives of holiness and are a living example to each of us. This past November, Pope Francis in his homily that day challenged all the faithful to more fully understand that the call to holiness is not so much about "great deeds and extraordinary events" but rather "daily fidelity to the demands of our baptism." The call to love our brothers and sisters each and every day.

Pope Francis continued to include six new beatitudes that challenge us today. These are: – Blessed are those who remain faithful while enduring evils inflicted on them by others, and forgive them from their heart. – Blessed are those who look into the eyes of the abandoned and marginalized, and show them their closeness. – Blessed are those who see God in every person, and strive to make others also discover Him. – Blessed are those who protect and care for our common home. – Blessed are those who renounce their own comfort in order to help others. – Blessed are those who pray and work for full communion between Christians.

As we reflect upon our involvement in the world around us, these words challenge us in different ways. If we were to use this as a job description or litmus test of how we treat others, where would we score?

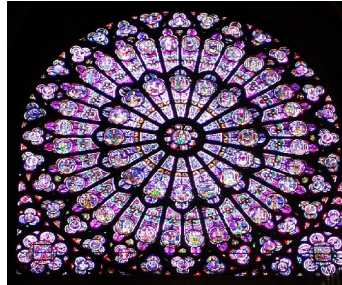

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Take a few minutes to answer two simple questions:
How do you tell your story?
How do you capture the essence and meaning of your life? Perhaps you keep a diary or journal, writing about each day.

Such writing may consist of simple record keeping, address feelings, or explore deeper thoughts regarding the human condition, spirituality, or your views on relationships and meaning in life. Perhaps you draw or paint pictures of the natural world, experiences, or people you see each day. However, while this is only a guess, I think most of us are so busy we would rather take a simpler approach, ie we take photographs or short video clips of significant life events, or perhaps not so significant events. Sharing these stories with family and friends then becomes as easy as clicking a few buttons on our phone or computer. Once made, these videos and images are easy to share by posting to the Internet with its vast array of social media sites. By adding a few simple words we make our story complete. It's easy, spreads to a multitude of people, and even allows for an electronic version of conversation by way of comments.

Stories of our faith, however, have been told over the centuries in quite a different manner. Of course we have Sacred Scripture, words that were written long ago, yet still address universal truths and hold significant insight as to how we humans open ourselves to God, who is love. We also have sacred music, the great Gothic cathedrals, and all forms of visual art. One of my favorite expressions of our faith stories are the stained glass windows found in church structures throughout the world. There are many examples in the Kansas City area including the beautiful windows at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, and right here at St. James. The beautiful Rose Window, above, is located at Notre-Dame cathedral in Paris, France. The symmetry and color of this window is easy to appreciate from a strictly artistic point of view. For Christians, however, the significance of the story, as well as the geometry which unites each section, holds even greater significance. Perhaps I will be blessed, some day in the future, to see this masterpiece, and not simply study a picture of it. If you would like to learn more about the great Gothic cathedrals, let me recommend a book: *Heaven in Stone and Glass-Experiencing the Spirituality of the Great Cathedrals*, by Bishop Robert Barron. While I was reading this book I couldn't help but vision possibilities for our new worship space, and how we might integrate our Parish stories, past, present and future. We certainly have stories to tell and pass on.

Melissa is the survivor of a failed saline infusion abortion in 1977. Despite the initial concerns regarding her future after surviving the attempt to end her life at approximately seven months gesta-

tion, she has not only survived but thrived. With a Master's Degree in Social Work, she has worked in the fields of substance abuse, mental health, domestic violence and sexual assault counseling, and child welfare.

In 2012, Melissa founded The Abortion Survivors Network (ASN). ASN seeks to educate the public about failed abortions and survivors while providing emotional, mental and spiritual support to abortion survivors. Since ASN's inception, Melissa has been in contact with over 206 survivors.

She is the author of "You Carried Me, a *daughter's memoir*", her story about what happens when an abortion survivor finds and forgives her birth mother, who never knew her daughter was alive.

"Beatitudes for Parents"

Blessed are you parents who are poorer than some because you put children first – your own kids ahead of fancy cars, expensive homes, luxury vacations, and the kind of all-consuming job it would take to pay for it all.

Blessed are you for putting other children ahead as well: the kids you can name whom you coach, guide, or tutor – the nameless kids who get to eat or learn or live because money is something you give away instead of grab.

Blessed are you parents who mourn – mourn the loss of innocence in a culture that has kids growing up too fast; mourn the plight of the world's hungry, homeless, destitute children who grow up too fast for reasons entirely different; mourn with the bottomless ache of a parent whose child will never grow up, who has lost a precious, precious child of your own.

Blessed are you parents who show mercy – your children will see shining in you one of the best reasons of all to call our God "Father," how it really is possible to love our neighbors, even our enemies, as our self. A hard world grown obsessed with perfection, fairness, and revenge will become a softer place for your kids to land, knowing that they can (again and again) fail and still (always, always) merit love.

Blessed are you parents who are pure of heart – who forfeit the human temptation to gossip or brag or blame. You teach your children that true self-worth comes from within, in right relationship to God and neighbor, not in the false security of putting others down in order to make yourself feel superior.

Blessed are you parents who are peacemakers – who put yourself in a crossfire of relationships when there are warring factions in your school, your parish, or your extended family; who teach your children how to negotiate their needs while affording others theirs and their dignity as well. The efforts you make to have each side see things from the other's point of view, to muster a little more empathy and a little more understanding (even if in the end peace remains elusive), makes you a true child of God.

Blessed are you parents who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness – who get snickered at for going to church each Sunday instead of the shopping malls, who give away part of everything you own in the belief that it's not yours to hoard in the first place, who spend time teaching the faith to your kids because you know it's a treasure that will never rust. Yours is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are you parents when anyone insults you or persecutes your good name for believing in all of these things that Jesus taught. Rejoice and be glad, your reward will be great in heaven as it already is right now, on earth, when you teach your children these things by your powerful example.

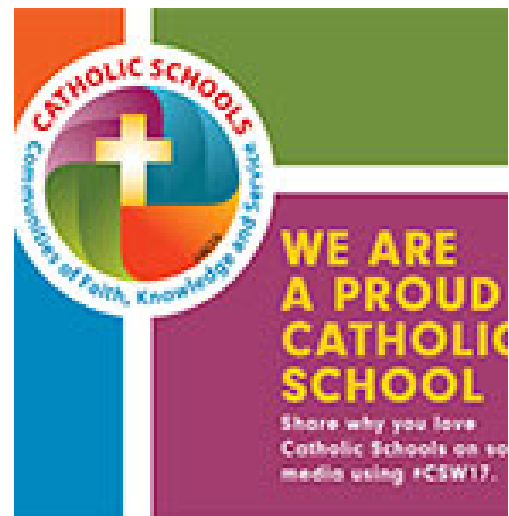
