

According to the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC.ORG), a current good quality photo is the single most effective tool in locating a missing child. The NCMEC encourages parents to be prepared by assembling their child's photos and vital information ahead of time.

MOCHIP is a comprehensive child identification program designed to give families of a measure of protection against the ever increasing problem of missing and abducted children.

The information on the disk is compatible with the format required by the "AMBER ALERT" program.</p>	 <p>The dental bite wafer provides an impression of the biting surface of the child's teeth, which like fingerprints, are unique to each individual. The wafer also collects enough saliva to provide a DNA sample and a source for a scent for trained canine search and recovery teams.</p>

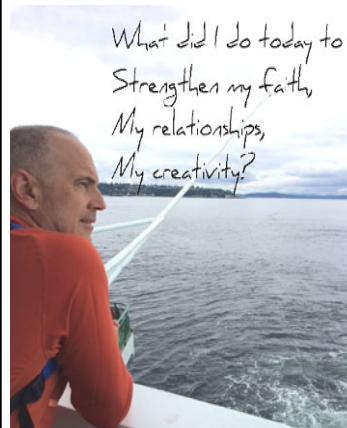

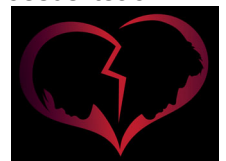

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Last week I suggested that Lent is a time for healing and I mentioned honesty and the Sacrament of Reconciliation as two steps toward healing. Today I want to mention a third step: forgiveness. I am not referring to seeking forgiveness. Seeking forgiveness is necessary for healing, but so is offering forgiveness.

During February the Gospel readings were taken from the Sermon on the Mount. There were Jesus' teachings of the Beatitudes, the "salt of the earth" and "light of the world" metaphors, and the "laws." In verse 21 of Matthew, chapter 5 Jesus provides a broader teaching on the law:



"Anyone who nurses anger against his brother must be brought to justice. Whoever calls his brother 'good for nothing' deserves the sentence of the court; whoever calls him 'fool' deserves hell-fire. So if you are presenting your gift at the altar and suddenly remember that your brother has a grievance against you, leave your gift . . . First go and make your peace with your brother; then come back and offer your gift."

How many times have I come to Mass angry or upset with someone? Again, a difficult but necessary question to ask myself. If I am honest my answer is more often than I really wish to admit. Yet Jesus tells me I must reconcile with my brother/sister before I offer my gifts to Him. If I feel hurt in any way it is my obligation to ask for and offer forgiveness. I must change my heart releasing any need for revenge and hatred. I cannot, must not worship God nor can I enter into a relationship with God when there is hatred in my heart, when there is a need for revenge in my heart, or a spirit of anger in my heart. St. John Paul II, for the World Day of Prayer for Peace in 2002, proclaimed: "the shattered order [of our world] cannot be fully restored except by a response that combines justice with forgiveness. The pillars of true peace are justice and the form of love which is forgiveness." The dramatic video footage of him sitting in a cell, forgiving his would be assassin, is an image forever imprinted in my mind. I don't know if I will ever be called upon to forgive such an offense against me, but I know that I am called to forgive others who have betrayed my trust, lied to me, defamed my character, or wrongly accused me. As part of the human family, desiring peace, I must love and forgive. These actions are from Christ Jesus and are needed for healing.

Back by popular demand. Melissa Ohden will tell her story to our St. James Youth groups following the 6:00pm Mass on March 19 in the church.

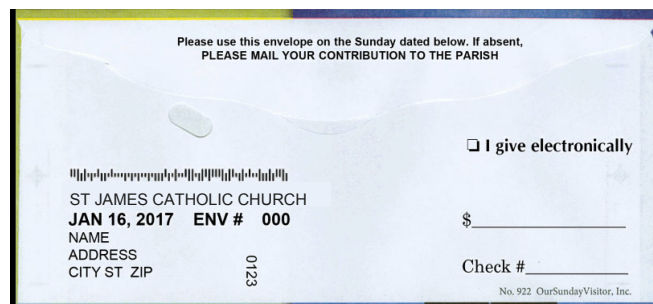
This is another opportunity for parishioners to hear her powerful story if you weren't able to attend when she spoke here last month.

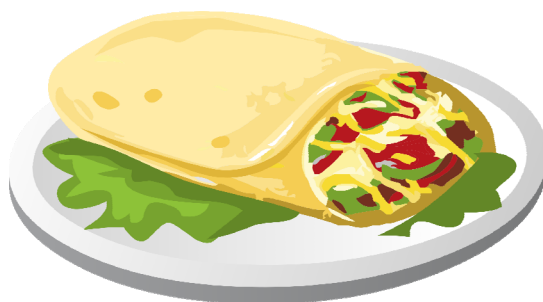

Volunteers Needed To Make Cookies For St. Joseph Table

Cookies of all kinds are needed for the St. Joseph Table on March 18 and 19. If you want to make Italian cookies, here is another simple recipe.

Tay Tu's Cookie Recipe

5 cups Flour	1 tsp. Cinnamon
Pinch of Salt	1 1/4 cups Crisco
1 tsp. Baking Powder (rounded)	4 Eggs
1 tsp. Baking Soda	1 - 16 oz Hershey's syrup
1/2 cup Sugar	1 tsp. Vanilla
1 tsp. Cinnamon	1 cup Chopped Pecans
	1 tsp. Cloves

Beat eggs, add syrup to beaten eggs, add shortening and sugar. Mix dry ingredients together, add flour and nuts. Roll into small balls.

Cook for 8 minutes at 375 degrees on ungreased cookie sheet. Cool completely. Ice with cookie icing.

Icing Recipe

1 bag powder sugar 1 tsp. Vanilla
1/2 stick of Butter (melted)
Add warm milk slowly. About 1/3 of cup to powder sugar, vanilla, and butter until slightly thickened. Ice cookies. When completely dry put in tins or plastic containers.
