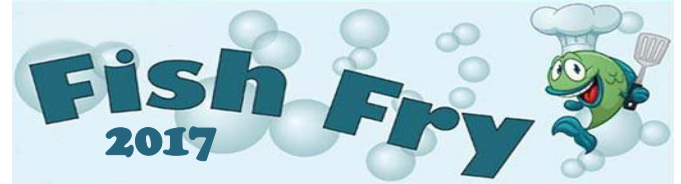

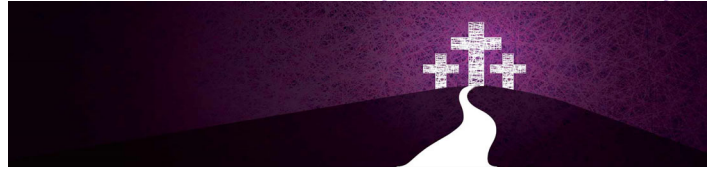

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Today, I want to suggest my seventh step for healing during this Lenten season: **"Never lose Hope, Seek Joy."** Looking back to last Sunday I am reminded that, God doesn't condemn or reject, He forgives and loves. He graces each of us with His mercy. In today's Gospel we listened to Martha's desperate cry: "Lord, if you had been here my brother would not have died, but even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus replied, "your brother will rise." When the stone was removed from the tomb, Jesus prayed "Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me. . . Lazarus, come out!" Both Martha's and Jesus' words are a reminder to me that even in the darkest hours of my life there is hope. God hears my voice raised in confusion, disbelief, and anger, as well as my whisper for Him to stay with me, to hold me and to comfort me. Without these assurances, I fear it would be all too easy to fall into despair, to feel abandoned and totally hopeless. With these assurances, however, I can instead feel the joy of His loving presence.

In two short weeks we will once again celebrate the Easter Vigil, which begins with fire and the lighting of the Paschal Candle. In thinking about this great liturgical celebration I am reminded of the following words:



"We will light candles this [night]
Candles of joy, despite all sadness.
Candles of hope where despair keeps watch.
Candles of courage for fears ever present.
Candles of peace for tempest tossed days.
Candles of grace to ease heavy burdens.
Candles of love to inspire all my living.
Candles that will burn all the year long."

Although I received these words on a Christmas card during a time that I felt alone and lost, I find them appropriate for this 5th Sunday of Lent, when I present this seventh step of healing. Never lose hope, embrace the joy that comes though falling in love with Jesus. Let His light shine upon you and through you. Looking forward, it is but one week until we enter into the Holi-est Week of the Year. Embrace Jesus, embrace His cross, and know that only He can bring hope, inner peace and joy.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY IS APRIL 23



Divine Mercy Sunday is the Sunday after Easter. Our Lord asked Saint Faustina to pray and work towards establishing a Feast of Divine Mercy on that day.

When Pope John Paul II canonized Sister Faustina (making her Saint Faustina), he also, on the same day, surprised the entire world by establishing Divine Mercy Sunday as a feast day for the entire Church.

He set aside this day as a day of forgiveness of sin and punishment due to sin (with sacramental confession 20 days before or after and receiving Holy Communion).

He even prayed the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, the prayer that Jesus gave her, at the saint's tomb. Given all these connections between St. Faustina and Divine Mercy, is it any wonder that Pope John Paul II died on the Vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday (the evening before the feast day), which fell that year on April 3, 2005 and was canonized St. John Paul II on the Feast of Divine Mercy, 2014.

Our Divine Mercy celebration will be April 23, with Eucharistic Adoration from 2:00-4:00pm, including opportunities for Confession, private devotion, and praying and singing of the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Benediction.

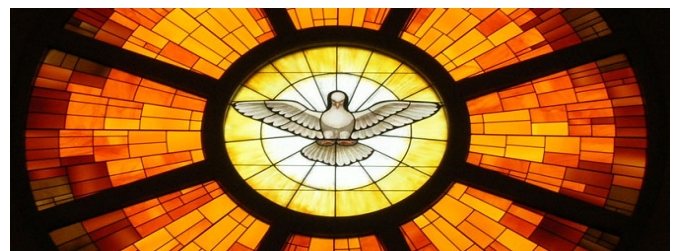
Some of our helpers from the recent Burrito Breakfast Fundraiser.
