Someone is Watching and Wondering



I have a close friend from India and I have seen some beautiful henna art on her hands. So I was particularly drawn to this image when I was searching for an image to represent the topic for this article “Open Heart, Open Hands.”

Throughout life we are called to make decisions, some rather trivial but others that impact our lives in dynamic ways. As a Catholic Christian I find myself turning to a conversation with God as I face day to day living. Lately, however, I seem to hear the same response in my mind: “Who is in charge here?” It isn’t easy to surrender and truthfully answer: “You are Lord. Help me to understand and open my heart to your will.”

I’m sure that I am not alone in remembering a prayer conversation that went something like this: “Lord if you do A, B, and C then I promise to do X, Y and Z.” In short I am telling God my needs or desires with conditions, instead of ending with a plea for God to lead and I will follow. I am so convinced that I know exactly what I need and desire that my heart, mind, and blessed humanity are closed to God’s grace and love. At the beginning of this New Year and with Ash Wednesday only a few weeks away, I must ask myself, “When will I open my heart to God and follow His will through the work of my hands?” I know it is time to stop going to God with options, expecting Him to choose one of my preferences. Instead I must go to God with an open heart and empty open hands. I cannot have a hidden agenda, empty promises or anything held back. I must be open, honest, trusting and receptive to His response.

One of my favorite authors, Max Lacado writes: “Ah to be your instrument, O God, like Paul to the Gentiles, like Philip to the eunuch, like Jesus to the world. . .to be your instrument. To be like a scalpel in the gentle hands of a surgeon, healing and mending. To be like a plow in the weathered hands of a farmer, sowing and tending. To be like a scythe in the sweeping hands of a reaper, gather and using. To be. . .an instrument for noble purposes. To be honed and tuned, in sync with your will, sensitive to your touch. This, my God, is my prayer, form me on your anvil, shape me with your hands, and let me be your tool.” I can only add to these words, open my heart and my hands so that I may do your will. Lead me and I will follow.
