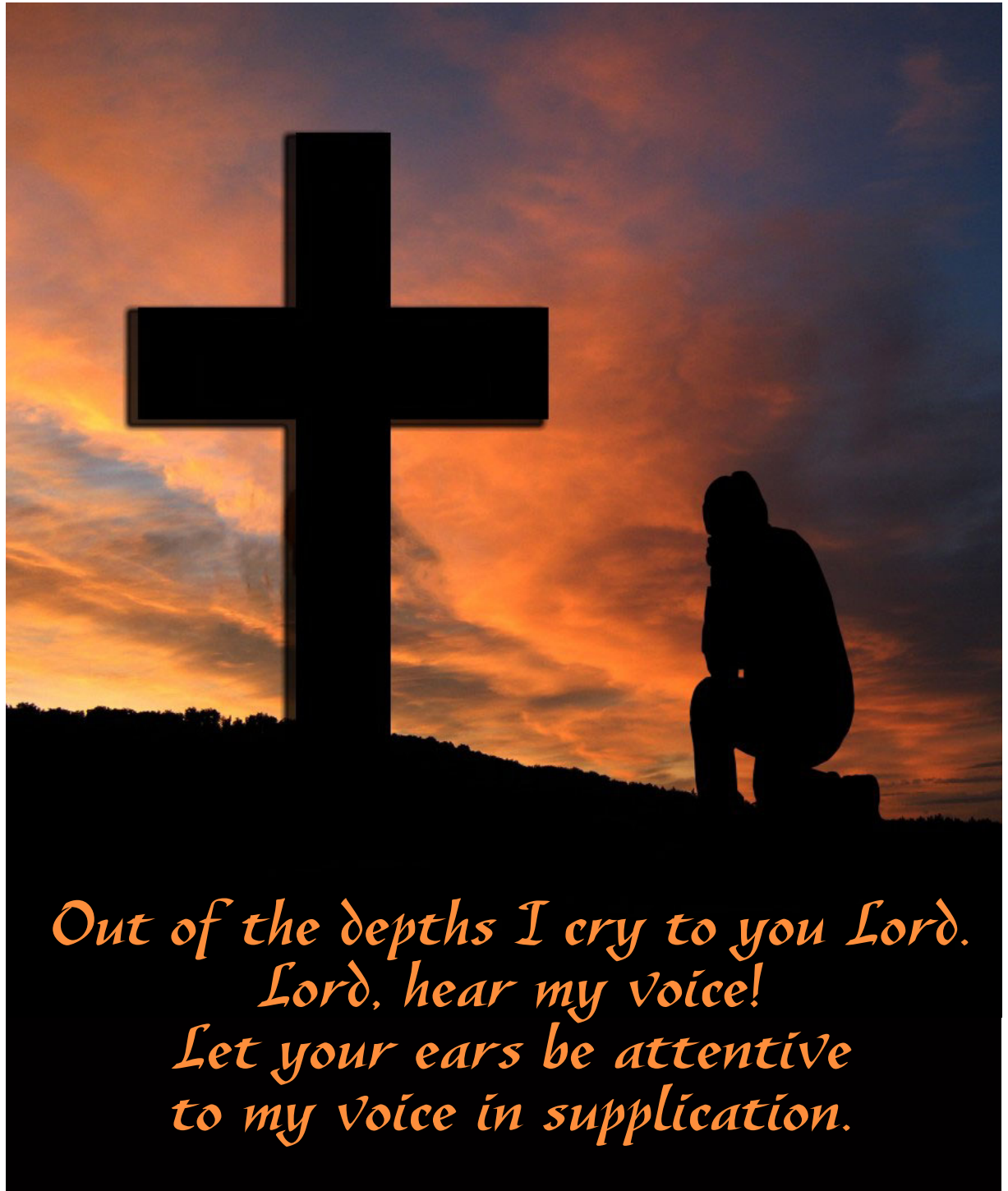

A TICKET TO THE BALL GAME MAKES A GREAT FATHER'S DAY GIFT

A from the Liturgy/Music Office



As you listen to the readings for this weekend you might hear many “key” words, but can’t discern any signs of a theme or pattern of thought. However, there is a theme here, but to see it you might have to

step back a little and give some time for these key words to sink in: “what is right; guidance; hidden; awareness; light; enmity; and finally, trust in the Lord.”

The **First Reading** is from the Book of Genesis (3:9-15) where God the Father is confronting Adam and Eve on their disobeying His direct command not to eat of the tree of knowledge. Their evasive answer shows their weakness of not taking responsibility for their actions. God condemns the serpent because He knows the serpent will never repent. He chastises and punishes Adam and Eve, but He also holds out to them a forgiving hand and a promise of redemption.

The **Responsorial Psalm** (130) tells us that “with the Lord there is mercy and forgiveness” if we are willing to open up to Him and ask for it. The Lord is always willing to extend to us a forgiving hand, but He wants us to face our weaknesses with determination to avoid them; or better, correct them in the near future.

The **Second Reading** is from St. Paul’s Second Letter to the Corinthians (4:13-5:1). This passage is a summary of the same subject in Paul’s format, wherein he reflects on his own past life and its change through the “grace bestowed in abundance.” He is encouraging the Corinthians to keep in mind the promise of heaven for those who hold out until their end. We should be encouraged by this also, for the same promise has been given to us through Baptism and the faith we profess.

The **Gospel Reading** is from the Gospel of Mark (3:20-35). This can be a confusing, or even baffling passage if we don’t put it together with the thoughts expressed above. Obviously, Satan (the devil) works behind the scenes to get mankind to sin through our weaknesses. But, if we are aware of our weaknesses and ask for God’s help against them with sincerity and a firm purpose of amendment, we can be assured that He will give us that help. And then (if we have God on our side), who can harm us?

So you see, the readings for today do make sense and have a theme – that of forgiveness through Jesus Christ, if we are sincere with Him and ourselves.

Something to think about during your prayer time this week!

Someone is Watching and Wondering



For the past several weeks many of us have been very busy bringing color and new life to our environment. In Missouri this is the time for cleaning up fall’s left over leaves and the debris of winter, pruning, cutting and planting. Our yards’ greening necessitates the beginning of summer’s endless cycle of mowing, perennials have sent forth green shoots and appear to be thriving, trees and spring flowers have bloomed and now grace our environment with many hues of green. Although I enjoy all the seasons, for me especially, spring is another of God’s wake-up calls; it is His reminder of the continuing cycle of creation. New life seems to burst forth wherever I look and I feel rejuvenated and blessed. I am, however, also reminded of these words: “God blessed them saying. . .have dominion over [all creation]. . .God saw all that he had made, and it was very good.” (Genesis 1:29-30) I often think about these words as I weed and till and plant or as I watch the various creatures that frequent my yard. Even as a child I found great peace in being in nature and as an adult I taught many students the importance of caring for and protecting the natural beauty of our planet.

There is, however, another environment that concerns our daily living, the environment of God’s people and our activities toward one another. Recall that the passage above from Genesis follows God’s creation of humans and when He pronounces everything as good all humanity is included. When He commands us to have dominion I don’t believe there is even the slightest suggestion for irresponsible use but rather for responsible care and nurture of everything He provides for us. Again, I reiterate, this command also applies to the nurture and care of one another. Immediate thoughts come to my mind to care for family and friends but in the Gospel Jesus explains that this is not enough. We must care for the hungry and thirsty, the sick and lonely, those imprisoned, and those on the fringes of society. We must even care for our enemies, respect their innate dignity, and forgive without expectation of acknowledgement or gratitude. As each year passes, one season following another, and the cycle of living continues, I realize more completely that the only person I can change is myself. With God’s love and guidance I can love, forgive, and treat others as He has shown to me. If in doubt, all I need to do is open my eyes to the beauty and diversity of both the natural and human environment I am so blessed to share. Feel the peace of all God’s creation.

Flag Day commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. In 1949 President Truman signed an Act of Congress designating June 14th as National Flag Day.

Disposing Of A Flag: The U.S. Flag Code states that the preferred method of flag disposal is burning it (throwing it in the garbage is not acceptable). If you live in an area where you cannot burn it or are not comfortable doing so, here is an alternative for you.

In the Narthex, next to the sacristy, there is a tall wooden box with a metal flag and a placard on the front that reads "For the flags that are ready to retire". Simply left the top of the box and place your old flag inside. This ensures that the flag will be properly disposed according to the U.S. Flag Code.
