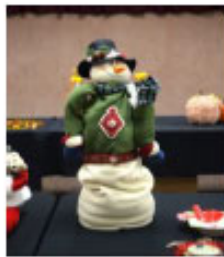

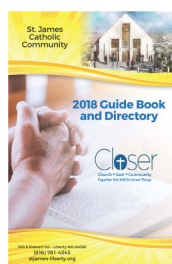

Reflection

In the Gospel reading this Sunday, the disciples try to prevent a man from driving out demons in Jesus' name because “he does not follow us.” But Jesus teaches them that even those who are not part of the inner circle can lead others to him, for “whoever is not against us is for us.”


Like the disciples, we too can be quick to point out who belongs to the “in crowd” and who does not. Too often we fail to recognize that the people we see as outsiders – those who look differently, speak differently, vote differently, or worship differently – can help us grow tremendously in our Christian life. An immigrant mother who works two jobs to provide a better future for her children models Christ's unconditional love for others; a devout Muslim's commitment to prayer five times a day might inspire us to embody a more fervent prayer life of our own; and even those people who have different musical preferences than ours (gasp!) can teach us new, richer ways to pray and experience the Living God.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



WOW! What a difference in just a few weeks. Labor day weekend was hot and humid, however, the past two weeks, we have experienced much more pleasant day and evening temperatures. No one should be surprised; this is Missouri and Autumn has officially begun. The Fall equinox has passed and we are beginning to see a change in outside colors as well as a new, yet familiar, crisp feel to the air. This is my time of year! Blue jeans, a light sweater or jacket, football, hayrides, hot apple cider, and sometimes cozy evenings around a fire. For me, the long hot days of summer were just an interlude to new beginnings. For some a new school year, possibly a new address or job, but for me it is yet another of life's adventures or opportunities which God provides to each of us through His grace and love.

Many people think of this time of year as an ending. Plants seem to be dying, animals are migrating, and the days grow shorter and shorter. I see Autumn as another new beginning. As the trees are turning brilliant colors, they are also busy producing buds, which will become next spring's new growth. Likewise flowering plants are producing extensive root systems or seed which will insure their survival during the cold winter months. And, while one group of animals are moving away, another group are taking their place, coming from further north to winter in our area. There is also an abundant harvest of fall crops such as apples, pumpkins, squash, and delicious nuts. How bountiful is our Lord.

As people of faith, Autumn can be a time for discernment, looking for a new path God places before us. It is a time to re-feed and re-nourish the roots of our spiritual life. Of course, I have a suggestion to begin your discernment. It is something I first discovered in *Catholic Update* (Feb 2010) called “**Praydreaming**”. This idea originated with St. Ignatius of Loyola who stated “Good discernment consists of prayerfully pondering the great desires that well up in my daydreams.” Ignatius believed that God dwells in the desires of a good person, and are one of God's communication tools. “God enflames the heart with holy desires, and with attraction toward a life of greater divine praise and service.”

So you ask, “How do I tap into these great desires, which God plants in my heart?” Simple, you daydream. You let God's voice resound in those quiet moments when you feel His presence, peace and love. To quote Mark Thibodeaux, S.J., “I let God dream in me and I sit in silent awe and wonder as these holy dreams come to life before the eyes and ears of my soul.” You might begin by finding a beautiful spot outside. Quiet yourself, and ask God to show you the wonderful things He has set aside just for you. You may envision many different things as you sit quietly and let your mind go. Then spend a few moments thinking about what it all means for your life. Like Mary, ponder what God has shown you. As you continue, Praydream the possibilities and choices open to you. Take a moment to discern which dreams give you a sense of peace and feelings of wholeness. When you feel a sense of rightness, thank God for the new insight, and go forth to begin your spiritual renewal. Hope you enjoy the experience.

Temptation – New Patterns

Remembering we are focusing on being an Everyday Steward of God's gifts – it is a whole package: My time, My talent, My treasure.

In today's Gospel, Jesus takes the extreme in his narrative to make the point about what leads us away from Him: Cut off your hand! I hear His side as – get rid of the temptation, stay with me. If we take our blessings of life for granted; or we feel entitlement instead of gratitude; or lazy about our spiritual life, focusing on ourselves rather than God. Well we need change! Big Change! (I don't think he really wants us to hurt ourselves.)

New patterns are needed – so we can get back to God. Move our focus to the miracles and gifts God shares with us each and every day. Our life, faith, family, challenges, resources, relationships – Everything He brings to us, He will help us through. If we only let him. If we turn the other way or pick the things that distract us, we are picking the temptation. PICK the New Pattern. CHOOSE to Change. Change is hard and we already know "temptations" will always be there in life. But we also know as Christians, that we can come back. So empty out the bad, leave it behind. Christ is waiting for us.

This week try to leave behind one thing that takes you away from the good things in your life. Have faith – it is a gift from God!

TIME: 6:30 pm

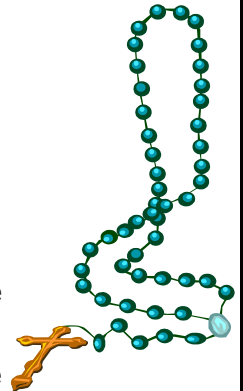

First Reconciliation Preparation

If you missed the parent meetings last week, you will need to contact the RE office right away to get on the list for the make up meeting. Just to recap the requirements to receive the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist, a child must be:



- At least 7 years old
- In at least the 2nd grade
- Have completed at least one year prior faith formation in either a Catholic school, a parish Religious Education program or a qualified program of home-study.

If your child does not meet those 3 requirements, then you would begin the preparation process next year and use this year to complete the basics. These requirements are not meant to be a burden for a child and his/her family, but to make the process easier for all involved.

Contact the RE office right away if your child is ready to receive these sacraments this year.
