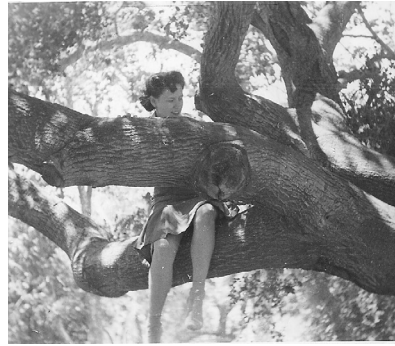

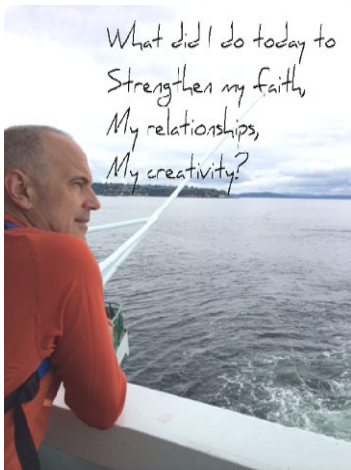

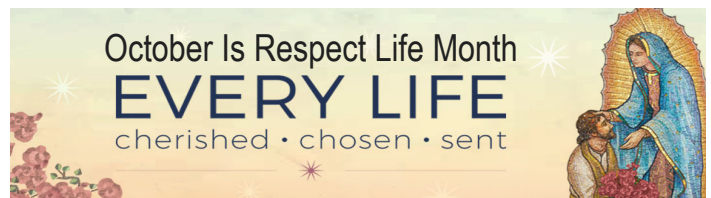
How To Order Yours

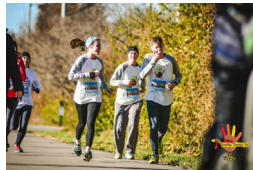

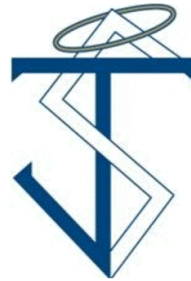

One of the ways students at St. James School are assessed for Religion is through the ACRE test.

The Assessment of Catholic Religious Education (ACRE) test measures knowledge of the faith as well as beliefs, behaviors, attitudes and practices of the faith. ACRE carries the endorsement of the National Catholic Education Association (NCEA) and is based upon the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The diocese measures religious knowledge through use of the ACRE in grades 5, 8 and 11. At St. James School, students in 5th and 8th grade will be taking the ACRE test in November.
