Parishioners "Cast Votes" on Master Plan Design Design Team Members Present Options and Lead Discussion

Design Team principals, Marsha Hoffman of SFS Architecture and Chris Castrop of Castrop Design Group presented St. James parishioners with a list of needs to be incorporated into the master plan that will include a new worship space. They then asked those attending to express their preferences in design options that would meet the longterm goals of the parish.

These needs include:

- Parking
- Handicap Accessibility (throughout the facility)
- Restrooms
- Larger Worship/Narthex/Meeting Space —1000 Seats (expandable to 1500)
- Larger Fellowship Hall

- Intimate worship space for Daily Mass
- Cry room with visibility to Worship
- Longevity of structure/materials
- Expandable design
 Tabernacle location - front and center
- True crucifix (wooden cross & corpus) relocate
- current icon
 Visibility from I-35 and community
 Catholic Identity
- Larger Sacristy
- Statue of Blessed Virgin Mary in Alcove



- Adoration Alcove with votive (long stem perpetual adoration chapel)
- Railings/Accessibility


