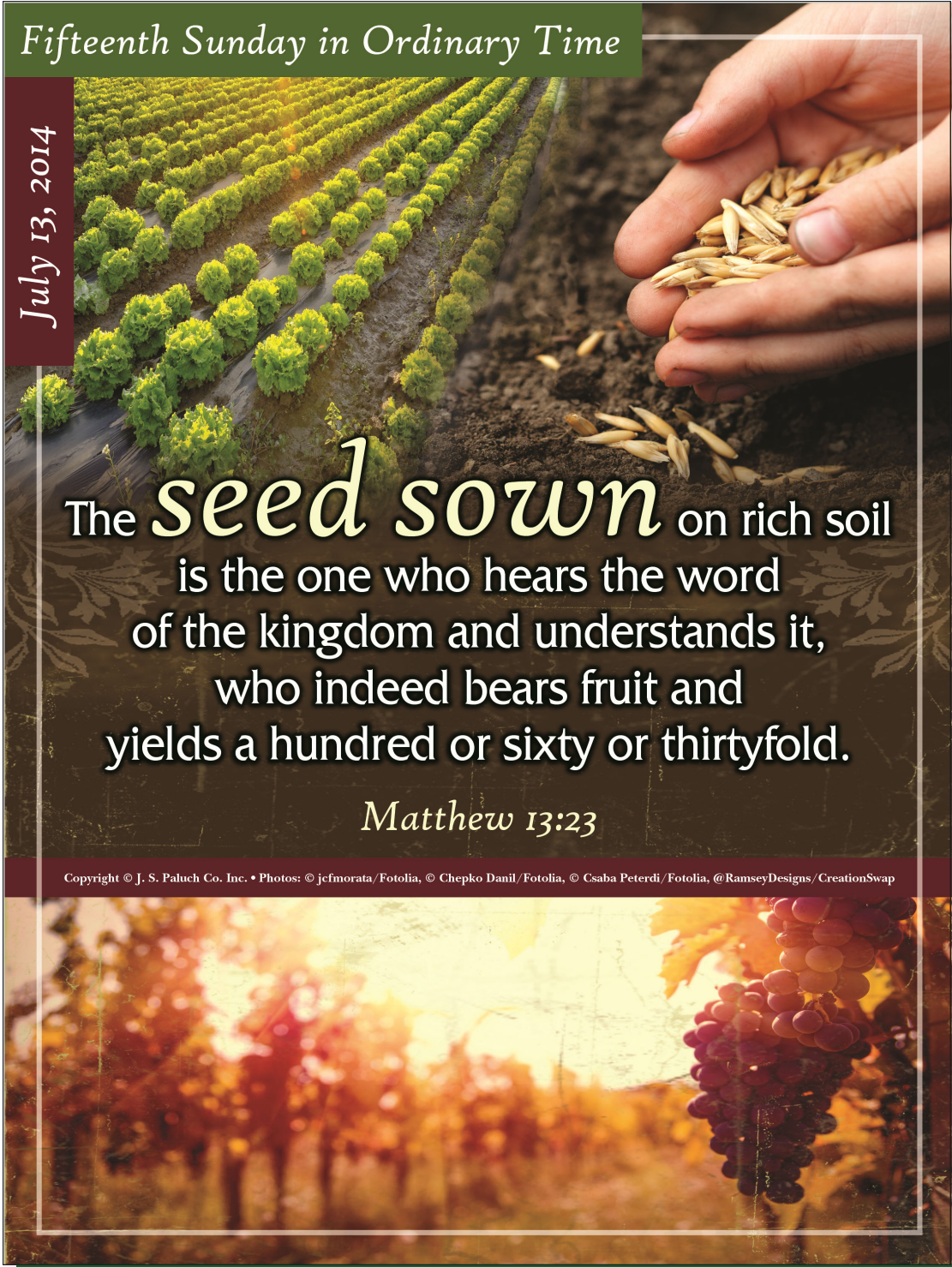

Someone is Watching and Wondering



You might think I am on a theme lately comparing American patriotism with being a Catholic, and perhaps I am. In May we celebrated Memorial Day when we honored those who have or are serving in the military. Last week we celebrated the signing of the Declaration of Independence on July 4th. In September we will remember all who have worked to build this country and provide for families as we celebrate Labor Day. I am also sure that most of you regularly see the above words found on our currency, or you hear them spoken. My question is, however, what do these words, the motto of our country, mean to the average American? Furthermore, what does it mean to each of us who claim the title of American Catholic?

So I begin by asking you to spend a few moments with pen and paper, listing the ways you "Trust in God." How extensive is your list, did the words flow onto the paper, or did you stop and think, "What can I, should I write?" While you're at it, take a few minutes to think about the now popular phrase "Pay it Forward." Add to your list the ways you pay it forward. Having problems with these lists? I must confess I did.

For many of us hearing the word "Tithing" may bring on a groan, a "not again," "I can't afford to tithe with all my other financial obligations, or "I do other things for the Church." This isn't meant to be a criticism or judgment call; that's not my intention. However, as I reflect on the ways I trust God, and pay it forward, I am reminded of the many excuses I make, and how often trusting God is hard to do. Too frequently I worry and fret over the future, and my financial independence. I don't want to be a burden to anyone. I want to take care of myself. Unselfish sentiments by the standards of our culture, true, but also selfish, self centered statements based on the teachings of Jesus. Over and over in the gospels we are called to turn our lives over to God. To love and serve God, by loving, unselfish service to one another. In fact the two fold mission of the church is to spread the good news of Jesus Christ, and provide loving care of others.

So if I truly trust God, if I have given Him my life and my love, then paying it forward is more than buying the person in line behind me a cup of coffee; it is putting God and the church at the top of my list of payees. It is taking a part of what I have, no matter how small, and giving it to the church to continue His mission. Yes there are so many ways to serve. Each of us have been given gifts and talents which we use for God; prayer, teaching, cooking, transportation, healing, being present to listen, to hold a hand, to share tears. All of these, and many others, are work we are called to do in the name of Christ, but sometimes we need to financially support others who also do God's work. We need to support needs of our church, whether it is taking care of buildings, buying supplies, paying the utilities, or building for the future. I really like this drawing, because it shows how easy it really is to pay it forward, and that every amount is worthwhile, but it takes our entire community to do God's work. It is not an obligation or duty; it is God's call to trust and to love. He will always love, care for us and provide. Take the challenge: Pay it forward for God.

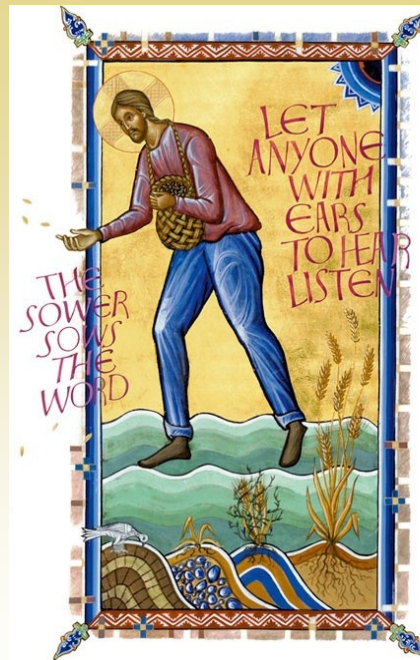

Jesus' parable of the sower is aimed at the hearers of His word. There are different ways of accepting God's word and they produce different kinds of fruit accordingly. There is the prejudiced hearer who has a shut mind. Such a person is blind to what he or she doesn't want to hear. Then there is the shallow hearer. He or she fails to think things out or think them through; they lack depth and their mind wanders to something else. Another type of hearer is the person who has many interests or cares, but who lacks the ability to comprehend what is truly important. Such a person is too busy to pray or too preoccupied to study and meditate on God's word. Then there is the one whose mind is open, always willing to listen and to learn. He or she is never too proud or busy to learn. They listen in order to understand. God gives grace to those who hunger for His word that they may understand his will and have the strength to live according to it. Do you hunger for God's word?

St. James Middle School

What destinations would you like your child to reach this year? Focusing on guiding students to set goals and reach for their own personal destinations is a major aspect of middle school here at St. James School. One way we do this is by building strong leaders for our school community. In sixth grade students implement the program we call safety patrol to greet families each morning as they arrive at school. Seventh grade students are responsible for working closely with Mrs. Stephens and leading stations during field day. They are also responsible for coordinating lost and found items so they are easy to identify. Eighth grade students create and implement morning announcements each day. By having middle school students utilize these roles, they are leading by example to help guide the younger students to create an atmosphere of responsibility that is family oriented.



“Being there experiences” are important to our St. James Middle School. Such destinations include a focus on the theatrical arts in relation to integrated curriculum instruction. By immersing themselves in “being there experiences” students develop a greater appreciation for historical events and the people they affected. Students also gain hands-on learning experiences that integrate math and science through the Crayons-to-Cad program. This is a way for students to use creativity to design and create a 3D model of a green space.

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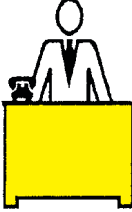
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
