Someone is Watching and Wondering



There are many different ways to interpret this picture. Perhaps your focus is on the beauty of the full moon reflected in the water. Maybe you are thinking how peaceful to be able to just sit there and listen to the waves and the breeze in the tree above. It is a very tranquil scene, but for many it is a reflection of their feelings of loneliness. At our last "Sponsors for Christ" gathering we shared stories reflecting on times when we felt alone, bound up in a particular situation, searching for answers, and our feelings of being tested/challenged by God to trust, embrace, and follow His plan for our lives. We compared our lives to Jonah; how we too sometimes try to run away from God, and the strange consequences that follow.

Once back home I thought about what had been shared, focusing on my own feelings of being alone. I thought about all the turns my life has taken, and how I have looked for new directions, new beginnings, new ways I could be involved with other people. As often happens I turned to scripture and I happened upon Psalm 59. Like so many times in the past, the words I read were exactly what I needed. "O my strength! For you I watch; for you, O God are my stronghold. . . You have been my stronghold, my refuge in the day of distress. O my strength! Your praise will I sing; for you, O God, are my stronghold, my merciful God!" No, I didn't have an immediate revelation, and I still don't know how this new chapter in my life will unfold. However, I am sure that I am not alone. God is always present if I but take time to listen and wait for His words, His loving touch, His guidance.

So now when I look at the picture above I see an individual surrounded by God's creation, breathing in His Spirit, feeling His touch, finding peace, strength, and direction in His presence. I can rejoice in those times when no other human is around me, because I know I am not alone. Try it yourself. Reach for God in the silence of human voices, and experience His peace.

Did you know that the Back to School Season is the 2nd largest selling season for retailers ?

This means that prices for back to school items, whether it be school supplies, clothing, and shoes, are incredibly competitive this time of year.

And, what's even better is that this coming Friday, Saturday, and Sunday (Aug. 1 - 3), no sales tax will be charged on certain "back to school" items.

Here's what qualifies: any article of clothing under \$100, school supplies up to \$50 per purchase; computer software up to \$350; personal computers up to \$3,500, and computer peripheral devices up to \$3,500.

With school starting very soon, here are 4 things to do right now to get ready for the fall term:

- 1 - Take an inventory of what your kids already have.
- 2 - Make a list of what you need to buy.
- 3 - Buy HOPE Gift Cards for all of the stores where you plan to shop.**
- 4 - Go shopping and save while the sales are still running, prices are low, and your purchases will be sales tax free

We have HOPE gift cards in stock for most of the stores where you'll likely shop – whether it's Walmart, Sears, Target, J.C. Penny's, Macy's, Kohl's, Office Depot, Office Max, Best Buy, HyVee, or Price Chopper – we have them all.

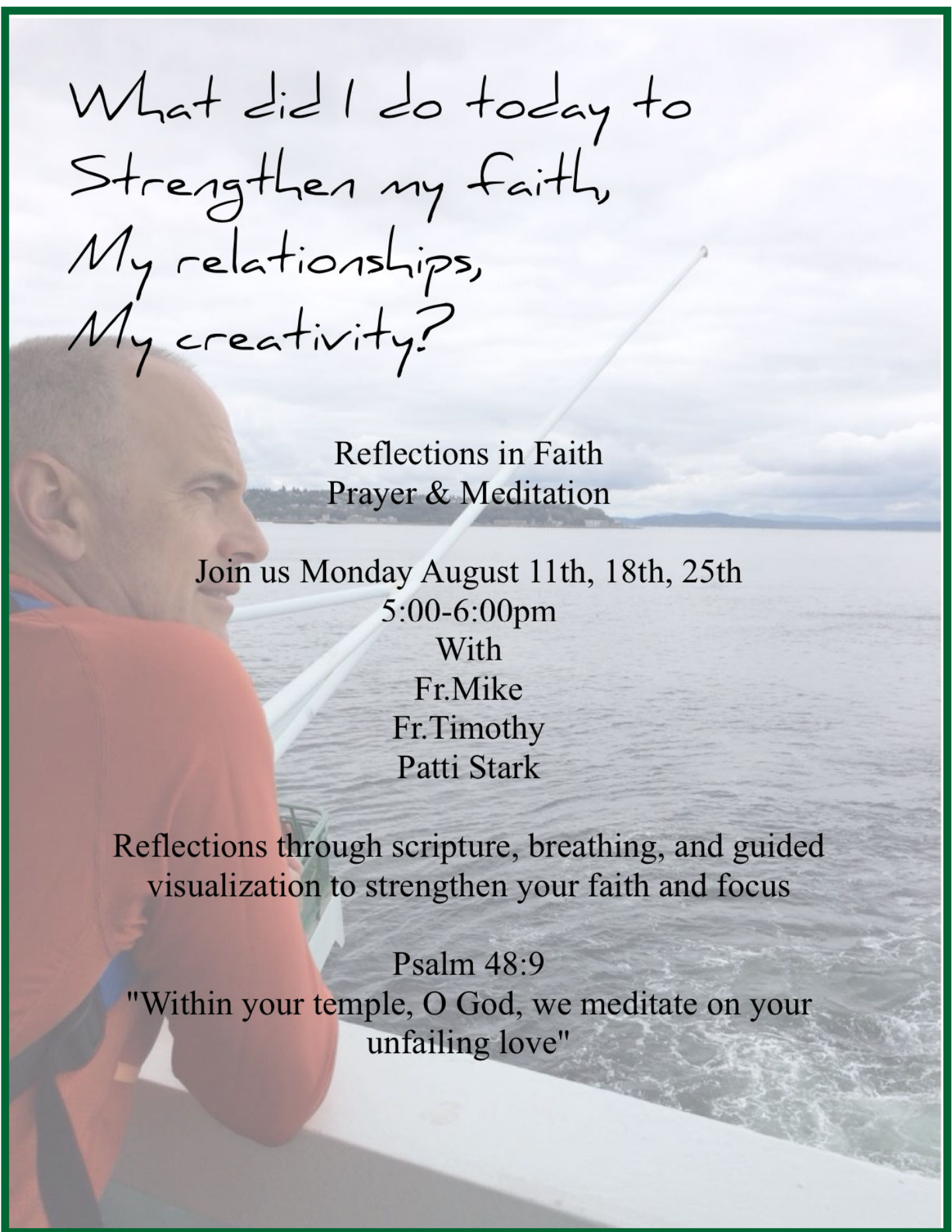
HOPE gift cards are on sale in the narthex after all weekend Masses and in the parish office during the week.

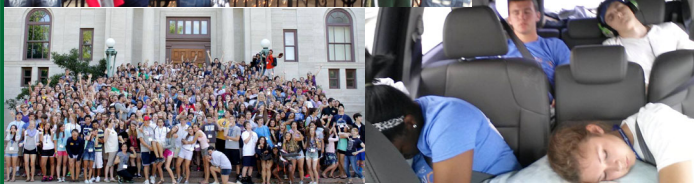
Our Faith In Action

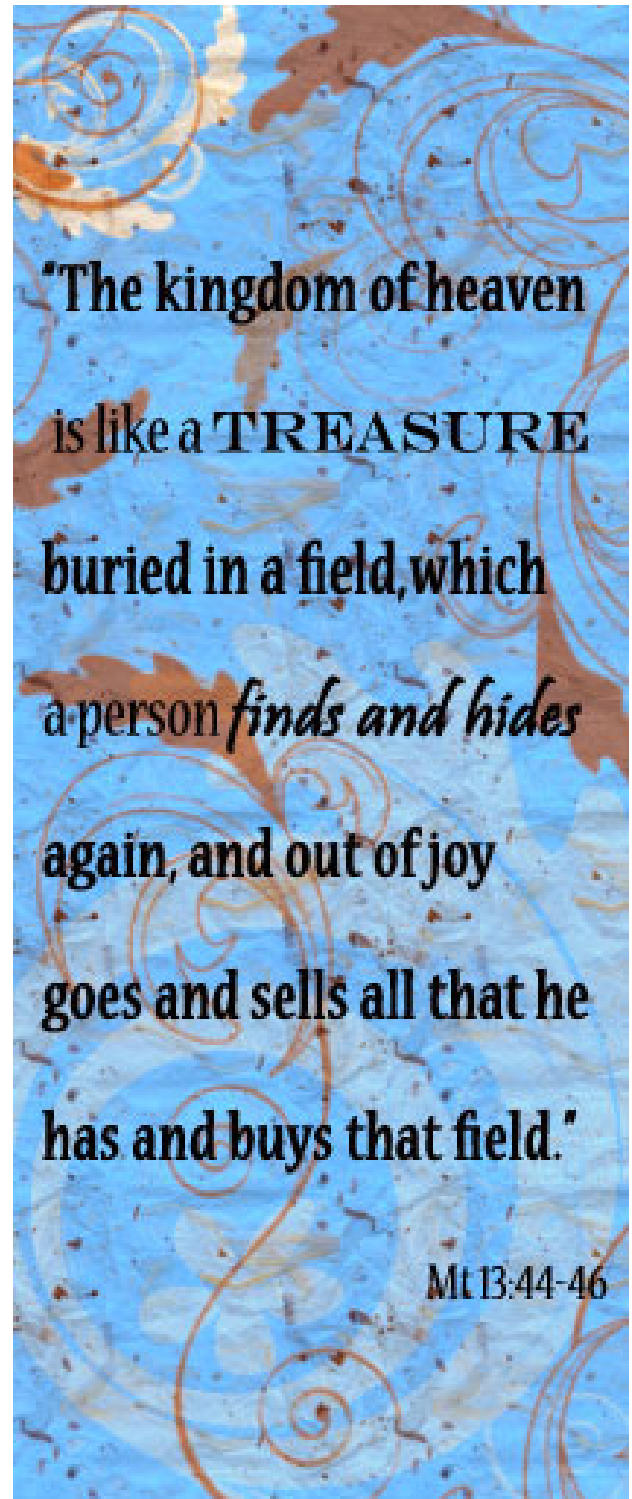
