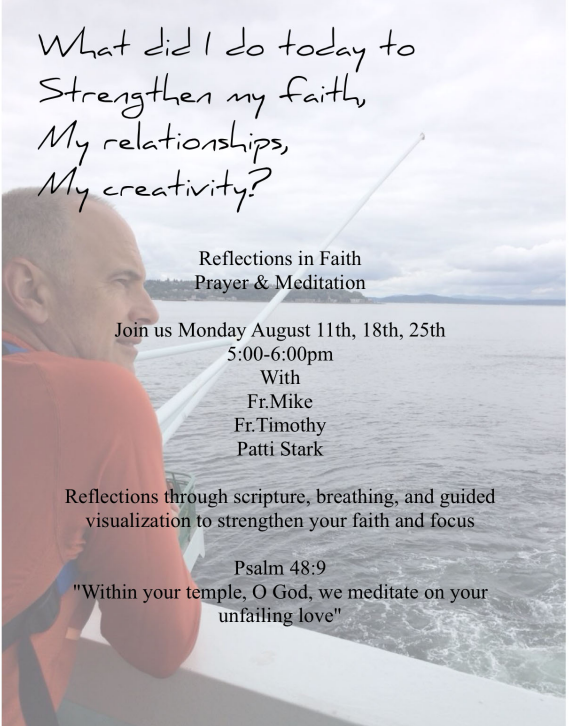

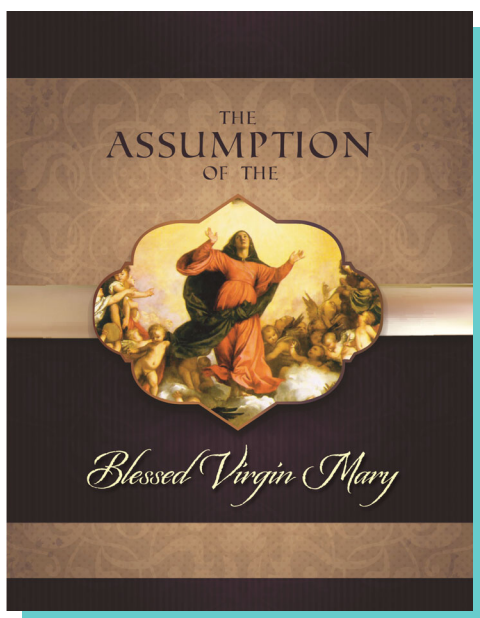

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Two weeks ago I visited the Nelson Art Gallery. I hadn't been there for many years, but thought it would be fun to take my Grandson Tyler to

experience the maze on the front lawn, and visit some of the ancient Asian and Egyptian exhibits. As I walked through the galleries, explaining some of the art to him, I was reminded how vessels made of clay are mostly what remain of mankind's earliest art, other than perhaps cave paintings. It was also amazing looking at the different forms of pottery, from very simple, utilitarian bowls to elaborate shapes with intricate designs and glazes. For those of you who have visited my home you know that I like pottery, and use a few pieces, all different and unique, to serve food to my guests.

I was reminded of our Nelson visit on the last day of July as I was praying with the daily scripture. There was Jeremiah 18:1-6 where the Lord says: "Indeed, like clay in the hand of the potter, so are you in my hand..." Later that day, I visited the KC Zoo with my four youngest grandchildren. Looking around, at the many families watching the animals, I realized the truth of this passage. No two people are exactly alike, rather we are each uniquely made by God. Some of us are simple and utilitarian, while others are strikingly beautiful, complex to understand, or perhaps impaired physically or mentally. Some appear happy and content, others tired or worried. Some are very active, others leisurely taking their time. If I could look further into each person's life there would be many similarities, and many differences. Different social commitments, different economic standings, different educational backgrounds, different experiences. There are, however, a few things we all have in common. We are all created by God (the master potter), need basic necessities for survival, flourish best when we experience love, seek meaning in our lives, and desire inner joy and peace. We also need a spiritual dimension in our lives; we want to experience God's loving presence and guidance. It's simple. Follow Jesus, human just like you and I in everything but sin. There is no need to be a carbon copy of anyone else. Just follow Jesus. Open yourself to His way, lovingly seeking *Abba*.

PHASE 2 OF PARKING LOT CONSTRUCTION BEGINS MONDAY, AUGUST 11

Beginning Monday, August 11, the north side of the parking lot will be closed as work begins on the second phase of our new parking lot. Here are some things to keep in mind during this final stage of construction.

Where To Park

- Parking is available in the newly completed south side of the parking lot.
- If you are able, we encourage you to park in the B&B Theater parking lot during this phase of construction and walk the short distance over the hill to the church. Thanks to Bob and Bridget Bagby for making this parking area available to our parishioners.

Access To the Parking Lot, Church, School, and Parish Office

- Enter the parking lot using the South Entrance (the former construction entrance).
- To access the church, school, and parish office, use the sidewalk on the school side of the new parking lot. There will be no direct access *through* the parking lot.

Other Helpful Information

- The south drive can only accommodate 2 lanes of traffic, so please adhere to the 5 mph speed limit signs posted along the drive and in the parking area.
- Use caution when exiting the drive onto Stewart Road.
- Access to the area behind the school is restricted. Please do not drive or park past the retaining wall.
