

From the Pastor's Pen

Happy Birthday! On August 15, we, the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, will be celebrating our 199th Birthday. Originally founded in Rome by St. Gaspar del Bufalo, our community continues to be a vital presence in the church. Our Mission has always been focused on the renewal of the Church through the preaching of the Word and the proclamation of the saving power of the Precious Blood.

As a Society of Apostolic Life, we live in community determined by the needs of the apostolate. As those needs change, so do the ways in which community life is lived out. We live in community, not so much so that we can experience the friendship and support of each other, not in order to establish community for its own sake, rather that our mission can and will be lived out. As Missionaries, we do experience friendship and support in community, but that is not the primary reason for living in community.

Our spirituality supports and sustains us in our ministry. For St. Gaspar, the preaching of missions and retreats was the primary way in which the Community carried out its mission. Members lived together in mission houses – sharing meals, prayer, ministry and study – but always for the sake of the mission of the Community. The spirituality of and devotions to the Precious Blood offered inspiration to the members as they sought to carry out the Community's mission.

For Francis de Sales Brunner and those who came to the United States in the early years of the American Province, the community life and the ways in which the spirituality of the Precious Blood were understood was very different from what St. Gaspar had first envisioned. But the mission was the same. The circumstances had changed. The needs of the Church in west central Ohio were very different from the needs of the Church in central Italy. But the mission was the same.

As the needs of the Church changed over time and from one place to another, the specific ways in which we carry out the Community's mission changes as well. We continue to be focused on the mission of renewing the Church through the preaching of the Word and the proclamation of the saving power of the Precious Blood. In each province, vicariate and mission of the Community, we answer the call. The response may look very different from place to place and time to time, but the mission is always the same.

As a Missionary of the Precious Blood, I am happy to celebrate this great milestone and we look forward to continuing to serve the church in all our many ministries always faithful to the word and the gift of reconciliation through the blood of Jesus Christ.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I know many of you recognize this picture, and might be thinking "Why is she using a *Crazy Quilt* to begin this article?" My simple answer: "It reminds me of our Church; yes our Church." How so you say? Think of the hymn containing the words "We are many parts, we are all one body, , , ." Perhaps you are starting to see where I'm going. We are many parts, and uniquely different.

As you look at this picture notice the variety of shapes, colors, and styles. Some of the pieces are elaborately decorated, while others are just pieces of plain fabric in gold, blue, grey, green or shades of red. There are birds, flowers, fan shapes and stars. There is embroidery and appliquéd. The only repeated pattern is found in the border, holding the entire work into one creation. Again, I say this quilt reminds me of your Church, and Christ holding us all together. I don't just mean St. James, rather I mean the Universal Church with its richness and color throughout the world.

Last Sunday, listening to our visiting missionary priest, I was reminded how difficult it is to understand a culture so different from our own. How confusing to hear, "the child is a girl and she will die." Yet through the love, compassion, and persistence of Fr. Larry Daniels, he discovered the truth, and saved a life. Fr. Larry embraced this family with the love of Christ. His actions were Christ's actions. He was Christ's instrument of loving service.

As I reflected on his story, I was forced to view my own actions from a different perspective. Do I reflect Christ's love to the world? Do my actions arise from love, or are they motivated by guilt, obligation, power, success, or by how I want others to see me? Do I give freely, or do I stand back, protecting myself, afraid of involvement with people who are very different from myself? Do I serve others with humility, or am I seeking honor and praise? Tough questions, yes, but questions that I must ask if I am true to my profession of loving Jesus, of freely calling God my Father.

Looking at this crazy quilt, I see our Church and the world in which we live. I wonder which piece represents who I am. You might take a few moments to study the pattern and determine where you are. Yet, no matter where you find yourself, don't forget we are all part of Christ's body, and as such we each have a place and a role to play in God's creation. Don't forget, God's love holds us all together. Whatever your role may it always reflect Christ to those you encounter in your daily life.

PHASE 2 OF PARKING LOT CONSTRUCTION BEGAN AUGUST 11

Since August 11, the north side of the parking lot has been closed as work began on the second phase of our new parking lot. Here are some things to keep in mind during this final stage of construction.

Where To Park

- Parking is available in the newly completed south side of the parking lot.
- If you are able, we encourage you to park in the B&B Theater parking lot during this phase of construction and walk the short distance over the hill to the church. Thanks to Bob and Bridget Bagby for making this parking area available to our parishioners.

Access To the Parking Lot, Church, School, and Parish Office

- Enter the parking lot using the South Entrance (the former construction entrance).
- To access the church, school, and parish office, use the sidewalk on the school side of the new parking lot. There will be no direct access *through* the parking lot.

Other Helpful Information

- The south drive can only accommodate 2 lanes of traffic, so please adhere to the 5 mph speed limit signs posted along the drive and in the parking area.
- Use caution when exiting the drive onto Stewart Road.
- Access to the area behind the school is restricted. Please do not drive or park past the retaining wall.
