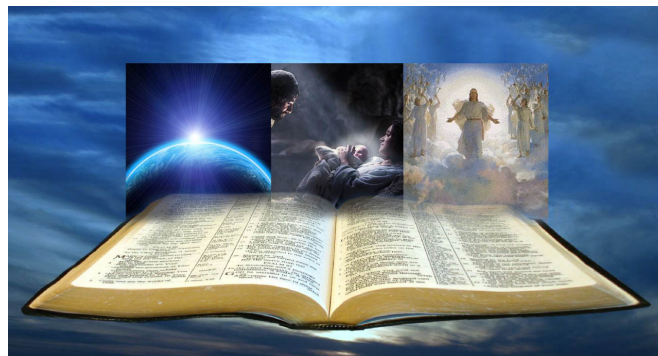

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Over time I have come to the conclusion that most humans, including children, are creatures of habit/routine. When our routines are disrupted, even slightly, we become agitated and unsettled. Think for a moment about a wonderful vacation. You planned, couldn't wait until the day of departure arrived, and perhaps it was as wonderful as your dreams. When all was said and done, however, I am sure you were glad to return home, back to the familiar habits and routine.

For many years now I have developed a daily routine, and if it is disrupted for any reason my day seems a bit off kilter. I begin my day with a cup of coffee and scripture. Yes, even on days when I attend Mass, I still read scripture first thing in the morning. Not surprisingly, I usually find exactly what I need to hear before beginning my day. When I first began this practice it was for understanding the written word. Overtime it became more meditative and prayerful. At this point in my life, however, this ritual has taken on yet another dimension. Suddenly in those quiet moments, surrounded by my constant companion, the beauty of nature, I feel the development of a renewed relationship with God; a very personal, intimate relationship. I don't know if I have words to adequately describe this feeling, but it is as though Jesus is physically present, leading me into the day. It isn't an intellectual exercise, or some type of mystical, out of body experience, but rather a sense of companionship and well being. I will admit it is not always a peaceful or joy filled experience, as there are times I feel anger, frustration, or challenges beyond my limited capabilities. Yet, there is also a sense of well being, that whatever is left for me of life's journey, I can face without fear. Jesus doesn't forget; Jesus doesn't abandon; Jesus doesn't trick me or try to trip me up. He is just waiting for me to surrender to the relationship our heavenly Father has prepared for us, and invited us into.

I have attended conferences and seminars, and heard many descriptions of *Lectio divina* (praying the scriptures.) For me, however, I think this ancient practice is really about recognizing that Jesus Christ's message is the heart of all sacred scripture, and a time to recognize and rejoice in His love which flows into and through me. As St. Teresa of Avila stated, we are His hands, doing His work in the world. First, however, we must know Him intimately, and love Him, unconditionally.

You would be paired with another catechist, usually someone with experience, with all supplies provided. We even offer a discount on your own children's enrollment fees for those who volunteer in the classrooms. Our schedule is flexible and our goal is to have teams of 3 so that each group would have plenty of flexible days "off" for family commitments (and tickets to Chief's games!)
