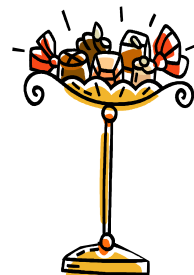

From the Pastor's Pen

"Trick or treat! Smell my feet! Give me something good to eat!" may or may not be the best Halloween Trick or Treat line but it certainly gets a person's attention. As a family, we loved to go Trick or Treating, but we also lived in the country so we were a bit limited on how many houses we could visit in one night. My sisters and I were always begging Mom and Dad to take us to town so we could hit the good houses. As we got older, they agreed and to town we went. As a typical high schooler, my buddies and I concocted a plan to do some "Tricking" with eggs and shaving cream. Not wanting to be left out, I followed along. However, instead of getting cans of shaving cream, I swiped from the farm, some cans of foaming hand cleaner my uncle had ordered. It foamed just like shaving cream, but as it ran down and dissolved, it cleaned off the dirt and grime. So what harm could it cause? All was going great until Dad decided to check the trunk. Busted! But still, Dad let me go with my friends later that night, just with no hand cleaner. I did manage to sneak back to the car later and get two of the cans. We did have a great time that night.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Do you have a close friend whom you haven't seen for quite some time? If you answered yes, imagine an unexpectedly encounter with this person. Such was my experience this month, not once, but four times. Four friends just seemed to

reappear in my life, and it was as though we had never been apart. Their presence and our conversations seemed to be a continuation of our last visit, which seemed but a few days past, instead of a year or more ago. The shared feelings were open and warm, the mutual trust was intact, and being with these friends gave me not only a sense of well being, but also an inner peace, joy, and yes even hope for my life. I was reminded of Ruth's story, and the often quoted verse: "Do not ask me to abandon or forsake you! For wherever you go I will go, wherever you lodge I will lodge, your people shall be my people, and your God my God." (Ruth 1:16) Although this scriptural passage is proclaimed at many weddings, stressing the relationship of a wife to her husband, it is the story of love and friendship between Ruth and her mother-in-law Naomi. When Ruth's husband dies, Naomi encourages her to return to her own people. Ruth's refusal is a testament to the bond between these two women, and her commitment to care and provide for the elder Naomi regardless of the cost to herself. The story continues with Ruth's marriage to Boaz, the birth of her son Obed (grand-father to King David), and this blessing from Ruth to Naomi: "Blessed is the Lord who has not failed to provide you today with an heir! May he become famous in Israel! He will be your comfort and the support of your old age, for his mother is the daughter-in-law who loves you." (Ruth 4:14-15)

Relationships need nurture. They are often trying, resulting in the need to make difficult decisions. It seems, however, when mutual love, understanding and forgiveness are the cornerstones upon which the relationship is built, it endures whatever hardships, losses or sorrows are encountered over time. In fact, in light of my own experiences, these relationships seem to grow stronger as we share both our challenges and our blessings. I think God sends close friends back into our lives when we are most in need. I don't believe my recent encounters were simply chance, but rather all part of God's plan for me and my life. He is patient, and I need His help, which seems to keep coming through the gift of friendship.

First Reconciliation and First Communion Facts

In our diocese, in order to receive the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion, a child must meet the following criteria:

- *Must be at least 7 years old
- *Must be in at least the 2nd grade
- *Must have had a least one year prior religious instruction and formation, whether in a Catholic school or a parish school of religion or in a qualified program of home study.

If your child meets these guidelines, join us for a parent meeting on **September 29th** in the Social Hall. Registration is from 6 to 7 pm, the meeting begins at 7 and should last about an hour. There is a book fee of \$20 which covers the cost of the parent and child materials. If you are not able to come to Monday's meeting, please contact Cecilia Richardson in the parish office to schedule a one-on-one make up.
