As we journey through the month of October, with the excitement of the Royals and the beautiful Fall weather and colors, we can see the goodness of God among us!

As you've been hearing each weekend, monthly we at St. James are highlighting one of the "Corporal Works of Mercy" to see how it can be lived within our own personal lives and our parish community. This month the emphasis is on 'Feeding the Hungry'. We have the opportunity throughout the month to bring in food for the "In As Much" Food Pantry. We are grateful for your generosity. We at St. James are also involved, with other Churches in the Liberty area, as well as other Catholic Churches in the Northland, in working with the efforts of CCO (Communities Creating Opportunity) through the Northland Justice Coalition. For the past couple months, our emphasis has been on 'Dignity Voting'. This is an effort to help everyone realize the importance of voting, and what a privilege and civic duty it is to VOTE! Often we take the privilege of voting for granted, or we simply don't vote. The only way we can let our voice be heard, and live out our Catholic values of dignity for the poor and be a 'voice' for the marginalized, is to cast our vote on Election Day. Presently, we are involved in making phone calls to voters who may not have voted in recent elections, or who just don't see the importance of voting, or who think their voice is not being heard! This is one way we can live out the Gospel message, and care for those who often, feel they have no voice or hope in their lives. Carol Bloomer and Pam DeMasi, of our parish community, are very involved in the Dignity Voting effort. We are in need of more volunteers over the next few weeks. If you could offer your time or effort in helping us in this much needed task---please give me a call personally and I can get you involved quickly! I/we feel it is important that we work in collaboration with other churches in our area to help 'change' the system--to see that the poor and those who live in need have a voice, and folks to care for them. Thanks much! Over the next couple weeks, you'll be receiving letters thanking you or asking for your help as we have finished our parking lot and hope to move forward to make our dream of a new church a reality! Also, thanks to those who are such good and faithful stewards on a regular weekly/monthly basis to support our parish community in the 'day to day' operations by your weekly envelope. We are called to be good and generous stewards---giving back to God from all that God has given us so generously! A reminder our School Auction is coming up Saturday, November 8th. It's a great cause and a fun night with other parishioners. We invite you to come and join us!

Pope Francis Symposium

On Saturday, Nov. 1, Rockhurst University and *National Catholic Reporter* will co-sponsor a daylong conversation on the milestones and lessons from the first 18 months of Pope Francis' transformative papacy. 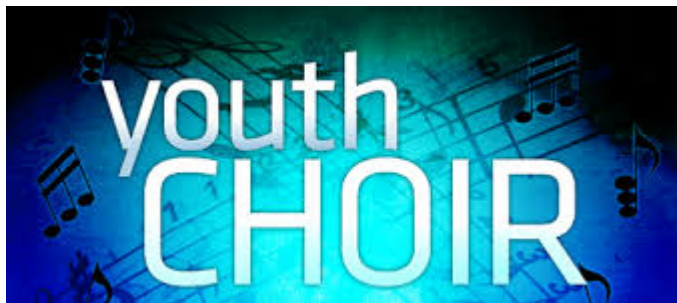

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I remember when I was in elementary school it seemed as though time almost stood still. I was always waiting for something: recess, lunch, gym, summer vacation, and yes, even returning to school in the fall. With age, however, it seems time flies. There never seems to be enough time to complete every task I find waiting for my attention. Then a week passes, a month, a year, and I wonder "Where did time go?"

I'm sure most of you are familiar with Ecclesiastes 3: 1-8 which begins "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die. . ." You can read the rest for yourself. What struck me as I was rereading this passage, however, were the verses which follow (3:9-11): "What advantage has the worker from his toil? I have considered the task that God has appointed for the sons of men to be busied about. He has made everything appropriate to its time, and has put the timeless into their hearts, without man's ever discovering, from beginning to end, the work which God has done." I began to wonder if I allow myself to be so busy doing my things that I fail to recognize the work of God, and I fail to recognize the work God has given to me. Verse 14-15 continues: "I recognize that whatever God does will endure forever; there is no adding to it, or taking from it...What now is has already been; what is to be, already is; and God restores what would otherwise be displaced." (NAB) Yes, God's work endures forever, and time as we understand it is only relative. Even as I write, this moment becomes the past, and the future keeps moving forward. We cannot stop a single moment from passing.

I think the point I'm trying to make can best be expressed by a somewhat familiar saying *Carpe diem*, however, I would change it just slightly. Instead of "seize the day" I might suggest we "seize the moment." I don't mean for our own selfish, self-centered interest; doing whatever feels good without considering the consequences. What I am suggesting is that we seize each and every moment, and recognize them as precious gifts from God. Yes, there is a time for everything in our universe, many seasons in our lives, therefore, there is no gain in being anxious about the passing of time. We should not waste God's gift by fretting and stewing over each little bump in our life. Instead we should focus on what we can accomplish with what God has given us. We should ask ourselves How do we give God glory, and how can we help to build His kingdom. Don't waste precious time. Spend it loving and serving God and one another.

Corporal Works of Mercy: Feed the Hungry

Our **Works of Mercy** project continues this month with our month-long food drive to benefit the **In As Much** food pantry. Your donations of canned and non-perishable food items are greatly appreciated! The box will be in the narthex for the entire month. What a great way for your family to help make a difference in the lives of our neighbors.

Fast Facts about St Mary's Food Kitchen:

- On the fourth Sunday of each month, St. James parishioners provide the food and workers to serve an average of 400 people. During the past 21 years that St. James has participated, the parish has cooked, served and paid for more than 168,000 meals.
- On our day to serve, we are responsible for providing all the food and workers. In addition, St. James is assessed over \$400 each month by St. Mary's to cover our share of the overhead of the building, plus the milk, plates, utensils, etc. needed to serve the meals.
- On each service date we typically serve almost 400 people of which about 10% are children, 15% are homeless and most of the remaining clients are unemployed or underemployed. For some it is the only hot meal of the day and for others it may be the only meal of the day.

In As Much Wish List:

You can bring any non-perishable canned or boxed food item, but here's what they are out of:

Ramen noodles	Stuffing mix	Canned pasta
Pasta salad	Tomato sauce	Tomato paste
Canned tomatoes	Rice sides	Canned fruit
Pancake syrup	Jelly	

Our suggestion would be to not only clean out your cupboards and pantries, but also to take your child with you to the grocery store to buy something for this drive. As you select the items that you want to give and put them in your cart, have a conversation about who we are helping and how we are called to feed the hungry just as if it were Jesus who was hungry. Perhaps also talk about why canned fruit would be something that a food pantry could give out but a bag of bananas might spoil. Stuffing mix at this time of year is in high demand as well--maybe talk about what a Thanksgiving dinner might look like if you were on a very tight budget.
