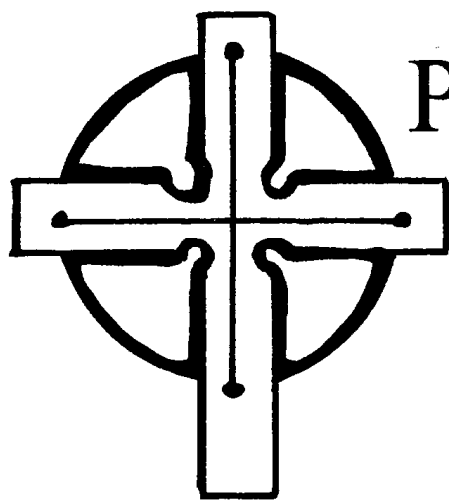

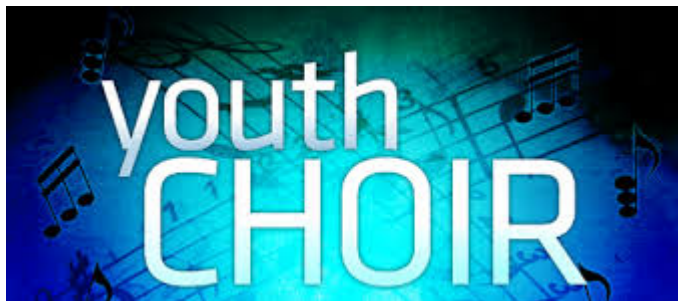

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I am sure most of you have noticed the appearance of Halloween candy, decorations and costumes in stores and homes, perhaps in your neighborhood. Many of you are involved in decorating, planning a party, or preparing costumes for October 31st. Once again the question was asked of me: "What does the Catholic Church say about celebrating Halloween?"

What comes to your mind when you think about Halloween: Witches, ghosts, Jack-o-lanterns? Perhaps you think of costumes, "Trick or Treat," and goodies to eat. But do you know the Christian connection to the holiday?

The origins of Halloween come from the ancient Celtic tribes of Ireland, Scotland, Wales and Brittany. For these people, November 1st marked the beginning of a new year, and the approaching winter. The night before the new year they celebrated the festival of Samhain, Lord of the Dead. The Celts believed that during this festival the souls of the dead, including ghosts, goblins, and witches, returned to mingle with the living. To scare away the evil spirits the people wore masks and lit bonfires. When the Romans conquered the Celts, they added their tradition of centerpieces made from apples and nuts for Pomona, the Roman goddess of the orchards. They also bobbed for apples and drank cider.

In 835, Pope Gregory IV moved the celebration for all martyrs (later All Saints) from May 13th to November 1st. The night before became All Hallow's Even or "Holy Evening." Eventually the name was shortened to Halloween. On November 2nd, our Church celebrates All Souls Day. The feasts of All Saints and All Souls are, therefore, times for remembering the dead. They are a celebration of the "communion of saints," and a reminder to us that the Church is not bound by space or time. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says that through the communion of saints "a perennial link of charity exists between the faithful who have already reached their heavenly home, those who are expiating their sins in purgatory and those who are still pilgrims on earth." (#1475). According to the website *American Catholic.org*, while Halloween's roots lie in an ancient pagan festival for the dead, which can be used for evil purposes, it is generally celebrated as an innocent night of fun.

What about some of the traditions? The custom of going door-to-door to collect treats started in Ireland. Farmers visited neighbors collecting food and materials for a village feast and bonfire. Those who gave were promised prosperity, but those who did not received threats of bad luck. Irish Catholic immigrants brought this custom to the United States in the 1800's. Carving a pumpkin actually began as a hollowed out turnip with a candle inside to scare off evil spirits. When the Irish came to this country, they used pumpkins as a larger substitute. Why do we call our carved pumpkins Jack-o-lanterns? This name comes from an Irish legend about a man named Jack. He was forced to roam the earth with only a burning coal inside a pumpkin to light his way because he never performed a selfless act during his lifetime.

Even though Halloween is a secular holiday, it has distinctly Christian aspects which you and your family can celebrate. We who believe in the light of the world can use it to celebrate the Light which drives darkness from our lives. So look to the Light of Christ to drive the darkness from your life, and let your inner child come forth as you celebrate all the goodness of life. Have a Happy Halloween!

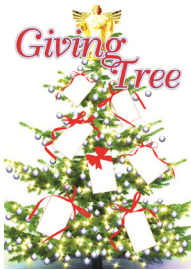

Corporal Works of Mercy: Feed the Hungry

Our **Works of Mercy** project continues this month with our month-long food drive to benefit the **In As Much** food pantry. Your donations of canned and non-perishable food items are greatly appreciated! The box will be in the narthex for the entire month. What a great way for your family to help make a difference in the lives of our neighbors.

Fast Facts about St Mary's Food Kitchen:

- On the fourth Sunday of each month, St. James parishioners provide the food and workers to serve an average of 400 people. During the past 21 years that St. James has participated, the parish has cooked, served and paid for more than 168,000 meals.
- On our day to serve, we are responsible for providing all the food and workers. In addition, St. James is assessed over \$400 each month by St. Mary's to cover our share of the overhead of the building, plus the milk, plates, utensils, etc. needed to serve the meals.
- On each service date we typically serve almost 400 people of which about 10% are children, 15% are homeless and most of the remaining clients are unemployed or underemployed. For some it is the only hot meal of the day and for others it may be the only meal of the day.

In As Much Wish List:

You can bring any non-perishable canned or boxed food item, but here's what they are out of:

Ramen noodles	Stuffing mix	Canned pasta
Pasta salad	Tomato sauce	Tomato paste
Canned tomatoes	Rice sides	Canned fruit
Pancake syrup	Jelly	

Our suggestion would be to not only clean out your cupboards and pantries, but also to take your child with you to the grocery store to buy something for this drive. As you select the items that you want to give and put them in your cart, have a conversation about who we are helping and how we are called to feed the hungry just as if it were Jesus who was hungry. Perhaps also talk about why canned fruit would be something that a food pantry could give out but a bag of bananas might spoil.
