
Expansion or New Construction?

Design Team Explains its Recommendation to Build a new Church

SFS Architecture and Huber General Contractor concluded that building a new worship space would be the best option to accommodate future growth at St. James.

Based on town hall meetings with parishioners and meetings with key stakeholders to identify issues, determine needs and prioritize goals, the design team made its recommendation. Among the issues identified, discussed and studied was seating capacity in the sanctuary.

Constructed in 1981, the current 8,200 SF worship space



seats 500. Based on current Parish enrollment and Diocesan projections for future parish growth, a larger worship space seating 1,200 and expandable to 1,500 seats was identified as a need and a high priority. With information gathered during these meetings and from an assessment of existing building conditions, options for providing a 23,000 SF, 1,200-seat worship space (expandable to 1,500) were developed, studied and reviewed with Parish stakeholders.

These options ranged from renovating and expanding the existing facilities to building entirely new facilities and repurposing existing facilities. It was determined that the existing building was 1/3 the size it needed to be and that expanding the existing facility to create a functional, well-proportioned worship and gathering space of 23,000 SF would require demolition of at least 50 percent of the existing building. The expanded worship space would then be compromised while trying to work around the remaining 4,000 SF.

Based on the evaluation of options developed, it was determined that the most feasible option was to build a new sanctuary and repurpose the existing worship space for other parish needs.

If an acceptable design for a new sanctuary of sufficient size could be imagined, on top of the existing church footprint and within the confines of the surrounding spaces, the cost would be significantly higher than building a new church elsewhere on the parish property.

The added costs would be associated with the demolition and/or modifications required on the existing structures, extensive work in re-purposing a lot of the surrounding spaces to accommodate the new design, disruption of high production labor components, and thus reduced efficiency and economy of scale, There would also be an extended period of time that church activities would need to be held in the gymnasium or possibly off-site.

Other costly trade-offs would

include the need to build additional ancillary spaces that the existing church space could be adapted/ used for, the inability to construct a basement under the new and renovated spaces, and severe constraints in physical design alternatives that would severely limit or inhibit liturgical and spiritual design elements

Proceeding with the plan that includes a new church will:

- Give us flexibility in designing an expandable space for the future.
- Allow us to repurpose the existing facilities.
- Cost us less in both the long and short-term.
