From the Pastor's Pen

As we draw closer to Christmas, as we celebrate this Fourth Sunday of Advent, we hear the story again of God's promise to us. We hear the story of Mary and the angel Gabriel, and her saying "Yes" to God to become the Mother of Jesus. I sometimes wonder what would have happened if Mary had not said "Yes"? In one sense, we would never know, because that would not have been part of the story. That would not have been recorded in our history because it would never have been made known.

I sometimes wonder in my own life. What would I be doing today if I had not said "Yes" to God and answered the call to join the Missionaries of the Precious Blood and become a priest? Where would I be living? What would I be doing? Would I still be single or would I be married with a family like my two sisters? Would I be living in the city or still on the farm? How much different would my life be today? How much different would be the lives of those who I have encountered, if I had not answered the call and chosen this life? There is no way to answer any of these questions. I sometimes think about how different my life might have been not because I regret the decision I've made, but just because I see how wonderful and life giving this journey has been for me. Never in all my wildest dreams did I ever think I would be where I am today. Religious life is challenging but it is also very rewarding. The people who I have encountered through my ministry have each been a blessing in my life. I hope and pray that in some way I have been a person of encouragement and hope and blessing in return.

As we each seek our way in life, may our hearts always be open to hearing God's call in our life. As we seek our vocation and meaning and direction, may we know where God is calling and leading us, may we find joy and fulfillment in wherever our commitment leads us, and if God is calling us to a life of service in the church, may we be willing to say "Yes."

As we prepare for Christmas and birth of Jesus, may our hearts and homes be ready. We will be offering one more opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation this Monday evening, December 22 from 6-7pm.

In our waiting and hoping, may we know the presence of Christ in our lives.

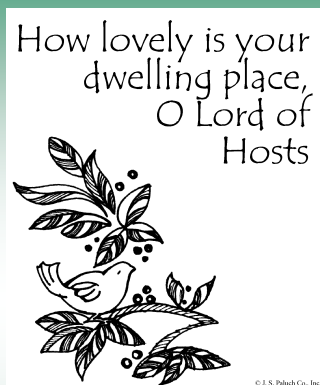

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I'm sure you're wondering, where is Sandy going with this picture, but then maybe a few of you already know. Yes, it is the fourth Sunday of Advent, but it is also the Sunday before Christmas, so I'm widening my focus, and putting these two liturgical days together.

I discovered this German tradition when Gene and I were

married. To ensure **Happiness** a newly married couple, on their first Christmas, is given this unique set of twelve ornaments. Henceforth the ornaments are used to decorate their Christmas tree or home. Let me explain the meaning behind such a gift.

The **Rose** symbolizes affection, the **Fish** Christ's blessing, the **Angel** God's guidance, a **Fruit Basket** is for generosity, the **Flower Basket** for good wishes. **Santa** represents goodwill, the **Heart** true love, a **Bird** joy, the **House** stands for protection, the **Rabbit** for hope, a **Pinecone** for fruitfulness, and the **Teapot** for hospitality. Traditionally these are hand blown, glass ornaments, cherished and passed on for generations. However, these are merely symbols, because as Christians we know true Happiness only comes from an intimate relationship and surrender to God. This is what we are



all waiting for. In God's presence we find hope, joy, love and peace. My prayer for each of you this Christmas is that as you gaze upon the abundance of decorations, you re-discover the gift of Jesus. He provides so many blessings, so much love, and never ending grace to fill our lives. His gifts are not symbolic, brightly wrapped with best wishes. His gifts are eternal, and freely given. All we need to do is thankfully receive them.

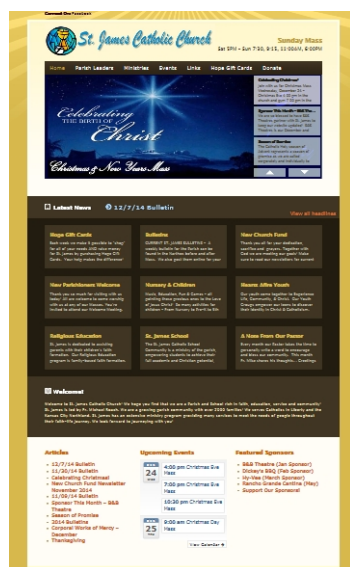

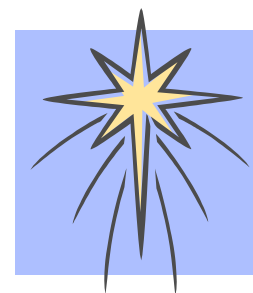
