## From the Pastor's Pen

Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see."

John 1:38-39

We open our doors and invite others into our homes. We gather for birthday parties, anniversaries, family gettogethers, and for several other reasons. We also come together for funerals and goodbyes. We gather to support one another, to share stories, to celebrate, to catch up on what is going on in our lives, and sometimes just to be together. I enjoy being invited to join a family to celebrate some great milestone in their lives. I cherish the times I have been present to just be and offer support and encouragement. I was recently surfing the internet for knit patterns, and found a wide variety of woven pieces. As I looked at the rich variety of colors, patterns and textures I was

reminded of my life. Many times it seems to be totally disordered. I'm



never quite sure what tomorrow will bring. Even when I try to carefully plan, my life seems to take a different, unexpected path. There are days that appear totally disordered and confusing. Yet, upon reflection, there seems to be a pattern, a thread which seems to bring everything together. A friend of mine, Lee, refers to **"The Golden Thread"** that weaves the pieces of our life together, a thread of love which gives life meaning and purpose, a thread that can never be broken, in spite of our brokenness, a thread that is God's work.

Curiosity got the better of me so I Googled, God the Master Weaver, and discovered many images and poems. I would like to share this one with you. I could not find the author, so I know not where to give credit. I did, however, find it quite beautiful and in keeping with my friend, Lee's idea.

Not till the loom is silent, and the shuttles cease to fly Shall God unroll the canvas and explain the reason why. The dark threads are as needful In the weaver's skillful hand. As the threads of gold and silver in the pattern He has planned." May we faithfully trust, and yes perhaps be surprised, but in heartfelt gratitude, rejoice at His weaving in our lives.

### St. James Funeral Dinner Ministry Volunteers Needed

As a parish community we are called to serve one another.

As family members grieve at the loss of their loved ones, the St. James Funeral Dinner Ministry helps to provide comfort and support by providing a dinner for the family and friends of the deceased. This outreach ministry is a precious work of mercy to help one another emotionally to "bury the dead".

This ministry is in need of people to assist with the dinners. Volunteers are assigned to one of three funeral dinner teams. Depending on the number of people on the team, they are not necessarily called each time it is their team's turn.

### How You Can Help

**Providing Food** - The parish provides the meat and drinks; therefore volunteers are called upon to provide side dishes, breads, and desserts. For those who don't have time or are unable to prepare food, volunteering to provide food can be as simple as buying bread, chips, cookies, and even packaged side dishes such as potato salad.

**Serving** - Generally each team has 2 groups of volunteers (1) those who assist getting ready for the dinner by making drinks, setting up the buffet table, etc. and (2) those who serve the food, making sure that side dishes, desserts and drinks are refilled and cleaning up after the dinner.




