

# From the Pastor's Pen

We are at Presidents' Day weekend, and the weather continues to fluctuate between very mild temperatures, and icy cold mornings. It's all part of life, and recognizing God's goodness and love in the midst of the fluctuation is what faith is all about, trusting in God in all circumstances of life. This week begins the season of Lent. On Ash Wednesday, we will be marked with the ashes and reminded to 'turn away from sin and be faithful to the gospel'. May each of us take advantage of the opportunities of this holy season to come in touch with where God is present in our lives, and what gets in the way (sin) of recognizing God among us. The opportunities for prayer, soup suppers, Stations of the Cross, as well as times of celebration, the K of C Fish Fry's and St. Joseph Table, are great opportunities for us to focus on a deeper relationship of hope & trust.

We have two prayer & meditation experiences on 2/16 and 2/23, which Patti Stark (a very talented, and generous parishioner) and I will guide you through, from 5-6 pm on Monday evenings. These are great opportunities to 'slow' ourselves down and reflect on God's presence among us.

The First Sunday of Lent, we are offering the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick at each of the weekend Masses. This is a sacrament of healing, and February is our month of celebrating the Corporal Mercy of 'Visiting the Sick'. If you are in need of healing whether that be physical, mental or emotional, come and join us. Fr. Timothy & I will be available following the homily at each Mass to anoint those who come forward asking for healing. Our parish community will be praying for those individuals receiving the Sacrament, and for all people who need the gift of God's Healing Love.

We are beginning a *Caring Ministry*, reaching out to all who have experienced loss in their lives, to come together and support one another. Sandy Gagnon, a member of our staff, will be leading these sessions of healing, 'A Journey of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love' on Tuesday evenings beginning 2/24 or Wednesday afternoons 2/25, more info in the bulletin.

Next weekend is Rite of Election for our RCIA folks on their journey of faith. This is a diocesan celebration for all who are journeying to a deeper relationship with the Catholic Church by becoming catechumens those preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation and Candidates those who have already been baptized, but will be welcomed into the Catholic faith through Confirmation and Eucharist. Let us pray for these men and women on their journey of faith.

Thanks to all who are such good and faithful stewards in giving each weekend. We appreciate your generosity in helping sustain all the life-giving programs and ministries here at St. James. May this Lenten season help all of us to grow in gratitude, so as to model God's tremendous generosity among us!





# Someone is Watching and Wondering



This Wednesday we once again receive ashes, and begin our annual Lenten Journey. Perhaps you have already thought "What will I give up for Lent this year?" If you don't yet have an answer, may I make this rather bold suggestion: Let this year's Lenten Journey become a Journey towards Healing. Although it seems intangible, I am asking you to give up any brokenness which keeps you cold

inside, afraid to trust, and unwilling to embrace God's abounding love. I ask you to consider journeying with out St. James Care Ministry entitled "Ministry for Healing-Sharing Our Losses: A Journey of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love," which will meet in the peaceful, quietness of the St. Gaspar room. The first session will begin Tuesday evening, February 24th from 6:30 until 8:00, and we will continue to meet the following four Tuesdays. If evenings do not fit your schedule, we are also offering five afternoon sessions, beginning Wednesday, February 25th from 1:00 until 2:30 pm.

If you are hurting, have feelings of loss or abandonment, please consider this journey. There will be prayer, scripture, confidential sharing, and time for quiet meditation and reflection. The facilitators are not professional counselors, but rather fellow Catholics who believe that Christ alone heals our brokenness. We also believe that it is in a community of mutual respect, care-giving, and agape that we re-commit our lives to Him.

I believe Lent should be a time of renewal, waiting in anticipation for the healing power of the Cross, and the glorious resurrection of Jesus. What Lent should not become is a season of deprivation and dread. When we pray, fast, or give to the poor, it should be a reminder to us, and a reflection of His Love. What better way to experience the Love of Jesus, than to allow Him to enter into the darkness of our lives, bring new light, replacing fear with Hope, sadness with Joy, unsettledness with Peace, and loss with abundant Love. As we each experience Him once again, as we trust Him and release our pent up emotions to Him, we will feel His healing taking place within our hearts. Take a chance; be a part of this Journey; Come and See how He will change you!



# Lent Begins Soon

Ash Wednesday Feb 18th

I know it seems like we just finished with Christmas, but Ash Wednesday is just around the corner, and begins the season of Lent. Our parish has quite a few Lenten offerings this year, but let's begin with Ash Wednesday services. They will be, as in years past:

Masses: 6:30 am, 9:00 am, and 7:00 pm Services with Ashes: 12:15 pm and 5:30 pm The 9:00 am Mass will be the one with the school children attending, the 7 pm Mass will be the one that our Wednesday night students attend. We will start at our usual time at 6:30, but instead of meeting in the Social Hall, our students will go directly to their classrooms and then process over to Mass at 7 pm. They will sit as a class, but parents are welcome to either come and sit with us, or to have their child sit with your family instead. We do encourage you to talk with your child ahead of time about how we act at Mass, perhaps practice how to genuflect, and talk about the importance of responding in prayer and song. We will dismiss from Mass, rather than from the classroom, so please be sure that you let your child's catechist know that you are picking up your child. This Mass tends to be very crowded, so plan to come early if you'd like a good seat. Ash Wednesday is not a holy day of obligation, but it is a great way to start the Lenten season.

# Soup Suppers Beginning Soon!

February 25, March 4, and 11

A very beloved tradition here at St James, our Lenten Soup Suppers are hosted by our Religious Ed families for everyone in our parish to enjoy. We begin in the church at 5:45 for a short prayer service, and then move to the Social Hall for soups and hearty breads, brought by our students & their families.

Each supper is sponsored by several grades; on that evening, the children in those grades provide the soups & breads, set up, serve & clean up. On the other evenings, they get to attend the supper as guests. These suppers are a lot of fun and raise a considerable amount of money for very good causes. Each year, we sponsor a charity and then ask anyone attending the supper that night to donate at least what you would have spent on supper that evening.
