Faithwalkers: Stations of the Cross is a musical ritualization of Fr. Joseph Nassal's ***Faith Walkers: Passages of Suffering and Hope*** by Fr. Keith Branson. Fr. Nassal says in the introduction: When we dig down into the soul we discover the plan of salvation: "God chose to walk with us in the person of Jesus. The way of the cross is a sojourn of the soul that makes us faith walkers, not sightseers: we walk by faith, not by sight." The music was written to help those present enter into that journey of soul more deeply. The presentation is in the form of a prayer service, includes visual media and invites all present into a journey of the soul.

Someone is Watching and Wondering

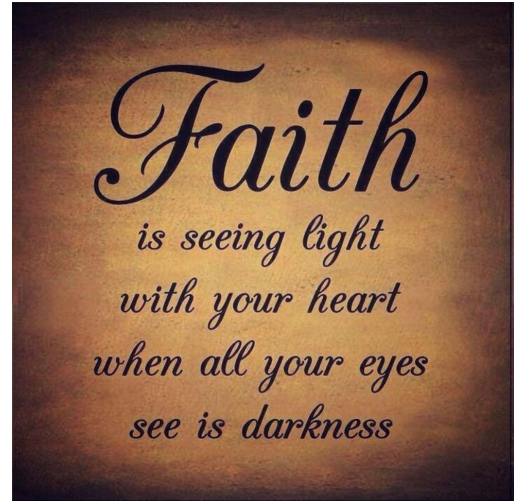
This Penitential Season of Lent is a time, once again, for us to look inward, to search for all that keeps us away from a full, rich life in Christ. It is not a time for long, sad faces, but rather a time to acknowledge our sinfulness, and to give it to

His Light. It is our faith, our trust, and our love of God which sustains the belief that Jesus can and will heal us of our brokenness. However, there have been many times in my life where I needed help; help from another human being. The darkness seemed to overpower, the sadness too much to bear; the grieving too deep and painful. I didn't even know where or how to begin. Prayer seemed impossible, and scripture too difficult to understand. God seemed remote, blind to my pain; I felt alone.

That is the purpose behind our new **Ministry of Caring**; Fellow Catholics sharing their painful losses. It is a **Journey**, with others, toward Healing. Listening and sharing, perhaps hearing God's words with another persons understanding, reflecting and meditating on how God's presence is felt., praying together, and allowing your pain to be taken on by Him. It is my hope that these five sessions will be a time for your healing to begin, and for re-discovering His unconditional love. Perhaps the companionship and fellowship with others is what you need to renew your faith and trust in what is central to the beliefs of all Catholics: Jesus Saves! To this I will add Jesus forgives, Jesus guides, Jesus heals; Jesus continues to nourish us through the sacraments; Jesus comforts and gives hope; Jesus brings peace; Jesus opens the way to new joy; and Jesus shares abundant love.

If you are in need of healing, if you cannot seem to find His Light in your darkness, think about joining us either this Tuesday evening from 6:30 to 8:00 or Wednesday afternoon from 1:00-2:30 in the St. Gaspar Room. (In case your not sure where that is, just enter the Church office and someone will be happy to guide you upstairs. I like to think of this room our parishes own "upper room." - a quiet place to find Christ.) Come and permit your faith to lead you; receive His light. Bring your brokenness, seek His healing, allow yourself to begin letting go. Healing is a Journey. There is no magic or single step to take. Rather it takes a serious of baby steps, allowing yourself to become stronger each day and bound more completely by His love.











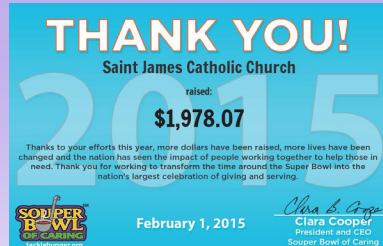

Perhaps you were frightened, disoriented, felt lost, angry numb, guilty, sad, or alone. If you have experienced a recent loss in your life due to a divorce, separation, the death of a loved one, loss of a job, loss of a pregnancy, prolonged illness, you may have known and experienced some of those emotions.

During Lent, our St James community will begin a series of five sessions entitled "Sharing Our Losses." The sessions will be offered both in the early afternoon (Wed 1-2:30pm) and evening (Tues 6-8:30pm). There will be time for prayer, sharing and reflection. The facilitators will be with you as guides, fellow travelers who, like you, are searching for answers, new direction, and a continual rebirth of Christ's love in our hearts. We are all broken in some way; we all need Christ and the hope, peace, joy, and love that only a relationship with Him can provide.

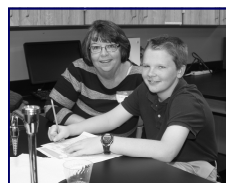

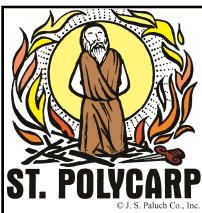

As a result, Polycarp was persecuted by the Emperor and sentenced to death by being thrown into a fire. Witnesses to this execution say that the flames had no effect on Polycarp, so the soldiers resorted to carrying out the execution by stabbing him with a dagger.

"Stand fast, therefore, in this conduct and follow the example of the Lord, 'firm and unchangeable in faith, lovers of the brotherhood, loving each other, united in truth,' helping each other with the mildness of the Lord, despising no man" (Polycarp, Letter to the Philipppians).

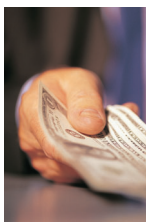
